I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John Dowless called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. He called for a moment of silence and Mayor Angie Gardner led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. CHAIR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chairman John Dowless stressed the importance of in-person quorums. He reviewed the meeting and public comment procedures in addition to accessibility guidelines.

III. AGENDA REVIEW

Ms. Sarah Larsen, MetroPlan Orlando staff member, reported on the June 4th Vision Zero Speaker Series with Ms. Melissa Wandell, and the BFF Wheel of Achievement on June 13th with Mr. Dan Burden as the speaker. She called attention to the Vision Zero playlist on the MetroPlan Orlando YouTube channel. Ms. Larsen reported that the annual virtual TIP public hearing was held on June 18th and the recording is available on the MetroPlan Orlando YouTube channel. She noted that there were no changes to the printed agenda. MetroPlan Orlando staff member Mr. Alex Trauger provided the Safety Moment that highlighted current efforts on the Regional Vision Zero Action Plan.

IV. ROLL CALL & CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Lisa Smith conducted the roll call and confirmed a quorum was present.

Mayor David Henson moved to excuse the absence of committee members Councilman Tony Davit, Mayor Shelia De Ciccio and Commissioner Brian Sackett. Mayor Kevin McCann seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

VI. AGENCY REPORTS / PARTNER UPDATES

Florida Department of Transportation

Ms. Amy Beckmann, FDOT District 5, presented information on the 2055 Florida Transportation Plan (FTP). Ms. Beckmann explained that over the next 18 months, the FTP will be developed with guidance from the steering committee focus group input and comprehensive community engagement and is anticipated for adoption in November 2025. She noted that the 2055 FTP will include statewide goals and regional objectives that will empower communities to adopt unique local strategies that align with the FTP. She highlighted the 3 phases of the plan: visioning May-August 2024, Statewide Goals and regional objectives August 2024-February 2025 and implementation framework/plan development February 2025-November 2025. Ms. Beckmann outlined the opportunities for engagement, provided dates/times for upcoming focus group meetings, and reviewed the project timeline. She provided the website address for continued updates and engagement: 2055 Florida Transportation Plan (floridaftp.com).

LYNX

Ms. Patricia Whitton, LYNX, reported that ridership remains at 60,000 average daily trips and on May 3rd LYNX saw its highest ridership day since covid a total of 64,083 trips. She provided dates/times of upcoming information sessions for proposed service efficiencies that if approved go into effect on August 25th. She announced that information sessions will be held at the Kissimmee City Hall on July 1st from 1-2 p.m., Sanford City Hall on July 1st from 1-2 p.m., LYNX Central station on July 2nd from 1-2 p.m., a virtual session on July 2nd from 6-7 p.m. A public workshop at LYNX Central Station on July 9th from 4-5 p.m. and a public hearing to immediately follow from 5-6 p.m.

Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE)

Mr. Siaosi Fine, Florida's Turnpike Enterprises, reported that widening of the Seminole Expressway/S.R. 417 from Aloma Avenue to S.R. 434 is currently in the design/build phase anticipated completion date is to be determined.

She noted that Mr. Jason Sartorio presented a preview of the TIP at the June 6th MAC Meeting. Ms. Laurent gave an overview of minor changes in the draft TIP versus the Final TIP and of the virtual public meeting held on June 18th. Slade Downs, MetroPlan Orlando, requested that the MAC make a recommendation to the Board to adopt the Draft PPL for FY 2030-2040. Mr. Downs noted that a preview of the PPL was presented at the June 6th MAC Meeting. Mr. Downs provided background on the PPL, and reviewed updates/feedback received. She provided a status update reviewing project background and existing conditions, goals and objectives, drivers of change, technical analysis, ongoing efforts, the 2050 MTP approach and indicators, financial resources, and an update on recent meetings. B. Congestion Management Process (CMP) Status Update

Lara Bouck, MetroPlan Orlando, will provide information on the Congestion Management Process (CMP), which is now underway. She explained that the congestion management process is updated every five years. She highlighted strategies, goals and objectives, performance measures the next steps. She noted that there will be an internal workshop to confirm performance measures, targets and strategies on July 15th. The CMP metrics and strategies overview will be presented at the August MTP Technical Workshop. Ms. Bouck noted that the next CMP update will be presented to the Board and Committees at the fall round of meetings.

RE: Request to Revise Fiscal Year (FY) 2024/25-2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Dear Mr. Huttmann:

Florida Department of Transportation requests MetroPlan Orlando revise the FY 2024/25-2028/29 TIP to reflect project changes as described below.

Projects #448756-2 and #446493-2 are local area program (LAP) projects managed by the City of Orlando and City of Casselberry respectively. Each have opted to use a District continuing services contract to assist with project delivery. As such a separate project segment (-2) has been added and will require a TIP **modification** so that federal funds can be authorized.

Projects #454947-1, #454971-1 and #454972-1 are projects supporting CFRTA/LYNX with transit enhancements and are added to the TIP in FY 25. All three projects received congressional earmark funding and will be managed by CFRTA/LYNX. To ensure federal funding for these projects can be authorized a formal amendment is required.

Project #446163-1 is a local agency program (LAP) project managed by the City of Casselberry. The construction phase costs for this project have increased more than 20% of the total project cost and will require a formal amendment to ensure federal funds can be authorized.

Amendment to the FY 2024/25 – 2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program

WHEREAS, the Orlando Urbanized Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), d.b.a MetroPlan Orlando, is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the Orlando Urbanized Area, including the Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is requesting to amend the FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) in accordance with the MetroPlan Orlando Internal Operating Procedures; and

WHEREAS, the requesting amendments are described as follows:

- FM #454947-1: Orange-CFRTA/LYNX Bus Shelter Refacing & Bus Shelter Solar Technology Funding is in FY 2024/25 for CAP and consists of \$500,000 in CD24 funds;
- FM #454971-1: Orange-CFRTA/LYNX Central Station Bus Terminal Retrofit Funding is in FY 2024/25 for CAP and consists of \$850,000 in CD24 funds;
- FM #454971-2: Orange-CFRTA/LYNX Pull outs and Safety Enhancements Funding is in FY 2024/25 for CAP and consists of \$1,000,000 in CD24 funds;
- FM #446163-1: Central Casselberry Connectivity Improvements from Hibiscus Rd. to Marigold Rd. Funding is in FY 2024/25 and consists of \$1,553,966 in LF funds being added; and

WHEREAS, the requested amendments described above are consistent with MetroPlan Orlando's project priorities and currently adopted Long Range Transportation Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the MetroPlan Orlando Board that the Florida Department of Transportation's amendment to the FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29 TIP be approved as requested.

The purpose of this letter is to request MetroPlan Orlando amend the FY 2025-2029 TIP with the Annual Roll-Forward Report. The Roll Forward report reconciles differences between the TIP and Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Adopted Five-Year Work Program. This annual process is routine and assists the MPO with identifying projects using federal funds that were not authorized during the previous state fiscal year (FY 2024). These projects have automatically "rolled forward" in the FDOT Adopted Five-Year Work Program as of July 1, 2024. This amendment ensures that year one of the TIP matches year one of FDOT's Adopted Five-year Work Program.

The reason for this amendment is to ensure projects with federal funding can be authorized prior to the new Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) beginning on October 1 each year. Until then, Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) continue to recognize the FY 2024 – 2028 TIP as the effective document. Adopting the Roll Forward Report and amending it into the FY 2025-2029 TIP ensures projects will continue to be authorized without interruption.

The affected projects are listed in the attached Roll-Forward Report dated July 1, 2024. The MPO is requested to add this report to the FY 2025-2029 TIP in its entirety. A separate report for commuter rail projects is also attached.

Reason: MetroPlan Orlando received a federal Safe Streets and Roads for All

(SS4A) discretionary planning grant to develop a regional Safety Action Plan. The Safety Action Plan was submitted for public and agency comment with feedback incorporated into the final document. Adoption of the Safety Action Plan satisfies federal requirements and opens eligibility for future SS4A implementation grant funds which can be used for preliminary engineering and construction of safety projects.

Summary/Key Information: The regional Vision Zero Safety Action Plan was prepared cooperatively

with partner agencies and engages members of the public throughout the planning process. The Safety Action Plan was adequately noticed and was made readily available for public review and comment, including electronically accessible formats. The regional Safety Action Plan includes seven chapters containing a summary of crash analysis key findings; feedback from the public participation process; an overview of engineering and non-engineering strategies plus a summary of the benchmarking process; identification of a High Injury Network; a list of engineering and non-engineering projects identified for implementation; specific actions, time frame, and responsibilities for implementing Vision Zero; a process for tracking progress toward Vision Zero on an annual basis; and a series of technical and guidance

documents.

Support for Regional Vision Zero Action Plan

WHEREAS, the Orlando Urbanized Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), d.b.a. MetroPlan Orlando, is the agency designated to conduct a continuing, coordinated, and comprehensive transportation planning process in Orange, Osceola, and Seminole Counties, Florida; and

WHEREAS, 5 people die and another 35 people suffer life-altering injuries on roads in Orange, Osceola, and Seminole Counties each week (average 2018-2022); and

WHEREAS, fatal and severe crashes are not inevitable, and death and severe injury are not an acceptable cost for using our transportation system; and

WHEREAS, human life and health are paramount and should take priority over mobility and other objectives of the transportation system; and

WHEREAS, roadways have historically been designed to prioritize vehicle throughput at high speeds to the detriment of public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, vehicle speeds and lack of safe facilities for people walking and biking have been identified as major causes of traffic fatalities; and

WHEREAS, it is critical for our local jurisdictions to prioritize individual Vision Zero Action Plans to build complete streets and begin to ensure the safety of our pedestrians, bicyclists and road users of all ages and abilities; and

WHEREAS, people who live in transportation underserved communities are disproportionately impacted by traffic fatalities; and

WHEREAS, the U. S. Department of Transportation has adopted the Safe System approach; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation has adopted a Target Zero Initiative; and

WHEREAS, measures to make streets and roads in the MetroPlan Orlando region safer for all road users, particularly those who are most physically vulnerable, such as seniors, youth, and people with disabilities, will further encourage people of all ages and abilities to walk, bike and take transit; and

WHEREAS, Vision Zero is a data-driven strategy to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all; and

WHEREAS, Vision Zero is founded on a Safe System approach that recognizes that people will make mistakes and transportation systems and policies should be designed to protect them through redundancies and shared responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, there are over 50 Vision Zero cities, counties and MPOs in the United States, a figure that is expected to increase significantly in the coming years; and

WHEREAS, Vision Zero should encourage creating opportunities to invite meaningful input from the community, including residents who are disproportionately burdened by traffic crashes, and historically have been underserved; and

WHEREAS, the foundation of the Vision Zero commitment – that no loss of life on our roads is acceptable – is supported by the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and will be incorporated into the 2050 MTP; and

WHEREAS, MetroPlan Orlando commits to working with our local, regional and state partners to identify and implement projects and programs that reduce the potential for serious traffic injuries and fatalities by taking a safe systems approach;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOVED that the MetroPlan Orlando Board, in its capacity as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for Orange, Osceola, and Seminole Counties, adopts the Vision Zero goal of eliminating traffic deaths and severe injuries on the National Highway System by 2050, and supporting their local jurisdictions in achieving Vision Zero on their local roads in the time frame specified in their adopted Vision Zero Action Plans and accompanying resolutions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a multi-disciplinary Vision Zero Task Force will continue to advise MetroPlan Orlando on implementation of strategies identified in the adopted regional Vision Zero Action Plan and shall be comprised of community-based organizations and agencies with expertise in public health, engineering, education, emergency response, transit, biking, and walking.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that MetroPlan Orlando is committed to reporting progress on Action Plan implementation and crash statistics on an annual basis, and to refine strategies as needed to ultimately eliminate fatal and severe injury crashes in the region.







A DDI eliminates several traffic conflict points by moving drivers to the side of the road where they can turn left without having to cross in front of oncoming traffic. 

The plan is updated every five years to reflect the changing dynamics of the region.
