YEAR IN REVIEW

Program Highlights

January 20, 2022: Apopka Site Visit (Apopka)

The BFF team participated in a check-in meeting and site visit with the City of Apopka. During this meeting, we provided updates on the BFF program including crosswalk baseline observations and yield rates.

The team also reviewed a stretch of US 441 and adjacent BFF crosswalks, discussing pedestrian safety countermeasures and plans for Apopka.





January 25, 2022: Longwood PD Operation BFF Training (Longwood)

BWCF Executive Director, Emily Hanna, hosted an enforcement training with the Longwood PD. The training covered an overview of the BFF program and Operation Best Foot Forward procedures.









March 3, 2022: Winter Park Dr. Study Review Meeting (Winter Park)

The BFF team participated in a meeting with the City of Casselberry to review and share feedback on their alternatives for Winter Park Drive.





March 30, 2022: 10th Street Study Concept Meeting (St. Cloud)

The BFF team participated in the 10th Street Study Concept Development Agency Meeting, reviewing the current plans for the 10th Street Study and providing feedback on the recommended changes to 10th St.







February – April 2022: Crosswalk Evaluation Site Visits (Regional)

BFF coordinated crosswalk evaluations across the region, observing monitored crosswalks to identify/verify existing crosswalk countermeasures (paint/striping, signage, speed and speed management, etc.). The BFF team used the information gathered to draft evaluation documents.





April 6, 2022: Best Foot Forward Summit (Regional)

In April, BFF hosted its first-ever "Best Foot Forward Summit," a regional Steering Committee Meeting bringing together partners from all three counties to receive updates, celebrate progress, and collaborate on the work needed to continue moving the needle.









April 15, 2022: Blind Challenges Site Visit in College Park

BFF Program Manager, Shelby Villatoro, joined City of Orlando staff members near Edgewater Dr. for a walking tour of the area. Marsha, a College Park resident. discussed her challenges walking in the area as a person with limited sight.





June 28 & 30, 2022: Kissimmee Safety Audit (Kissimmee)

BFF Program Manager, Shelby Villatoro, and Data Collection Team Supervisor, Rafael Burgos, joined various Kissimmee stakeholders for a walking audit throughout the city. The duo shared insight with the project team during the visit and discussed possible low-cost engineering improvements to boost safety and encourage more walking and biking in the area.

The team also followed up with additional BFF crosswalk data to further support the project team.









August 9, 2022: Orange County BOCC Meeting to Adopt Vision Zero

BFF Program Manager Shelby Villatoro joined other Central Florida transportation stakeholders from the City of Orlando, MetroPlan Orlando and FDOT in support of Orange County's Vision Zero Strategy.





Ongoing: Stakeholder and Partner Engagement

Bike/Walk Central Florida's Executive Director, Emily Hanna, has been a regular and active participant in MetroPlan Orlando's Vulnerable Road Users Safety Working Group, providing feedback on studies MetroPlan Orlando is conducting to advance vulnerable road users' safety.

Emily has also participated as a stakeholder in the West Orange Trail Phase 4 and Rock Springs Road alignment project, providing input from a trail user's perspective, discussing alignments of crossings and suggesting alternatives.





Summer 2022 & Ongoing: Carillon Park HOA Ped Safety Concerns (Seminole County)

Bike/Walk Central Florida Executive Director Emily Hanna provided input about concerns raised in the Carillon Park neighborhood. Support included site visits, meetings with HOA members and Seminole officials and staff, and community members.



Summer 2022 & Ongoing: Eagle Circle Ped Safety Improvements (Seminole County)

In response to a recent pedestrian fatality in the area, Seminole County Commissioner Dallari and county staff have teamed up with concerned community members and other local stakeholders to discuss safety improvements in the Eagle Cir. area. Emily also participated in these efforts, joining meetings, reviewing plans, and sharing feedback about proposed updates.



Program Updates

- FY 21-22 Q2 Progress Reports distributed on April 30!
 - o Progress Reports are available in the public Sharepoint (linked here).
- NHTSA & GHSA recently released reports about the preliminary traffic crash data for 2021.
 - Pedestrian fatalities nationwide are up 13%.
 - Florida had the greatest increase in total number of fatalities between 2020 and 2021 (183).
 - Emily noted that toward the end of the GHSA report (Part 3), there is a lot of great information shared about the Safe System approach and how its objectives can help reduce fatalities.
 - The Dangerous by Design report is expected to come out in the next month or two methodology has shifted and should allow us to replicate the data at a local level and break it out to address our communities.

- Michigan & Cayman
 - Median nose has been extended out past the crosswalk to add refuge island
 - Couldn't move the curb but the turning radius was decreased with pavement markings and paint
 - Cost: ~\$25k
 - Goal: See how the refuge island impacts driver yield rates before adding RRFB's as they would have doubled the cost.
 - Crosswalk yield rate average was 3% during its first year (2012) before any improvements when first joining the program list.
 - Measured 27% in January up to 39% in April (after updates).
 - The same data collector measured both months and noted that the changes were helpful, but that she was still uncomfortable with the speeds at this location.
- Oakland & Colonial
 - Video highlighted the dangerous drivers making left turns onto Colonial from Oakland Ave.
 - Left turn arrow changes to green at the same time as the crosswalk signal lights up for pedestrians to cross.
 - Orlando's Vishal Patel noted that he drives in the area and that the left turn lane gets very backed up, more than a quarter of a mile down Oakland Ave. The drivers are likely quite impatient and agitated once they reach the light, especially after going through multiple signals.
 - BFF will follow up with FDOT (looping in Oakland) to explore what we can do at this location.
- Laura finding similar issues, specifically at Flashing Yellow Arrow intersections mentioned Division Ave. & South St. – and asked if any partners had any insights to share on the safety features of these signals.
 - Alissa noted that Orange County <u>supported studies on Flashing Yellow</u>
 <u>Arrows</u> and shared the contact information for Hatem A. Abou-Senna,
 hatem.abou-senna@ocfl.net.
- New data collection contractors providing a more diverse team, allowing for more well-rounded data collection (observations and yield rates).
- April May data collection highlights/follow ups will be shared in the coming weeks (as needed). Stay tuned.

- FY 21-22 Q2 Progress Reports distributed on April 30!
 - o Progress Reports are available in the public Sharepoint (linked here).
- NHTSA & GHSA recently released reports about the preliminary traffic crash data for 2021.
 - o Pedestrian fatalities nationwide are up 13%.
 - Florida had the greatest increase in total number of fatalities between 2020 and 2021 (183).
 - Emily noted that toward the end of the GHSA report (Part 3), there is a lot of great information shared about the Safe System approach and how its objectives can help reduce fatalities.
 - The Dangerous by Design report is expected to come out in the next month or two methodology has shifted and should allow us to replicate the data at a local level and break it out to address our communities.

Engineering

- New data collection contractors providing a more diverse team, allowing for more well-rounded data collection (observations and yield rates).
 - Dean asked about looking at data through the different results based on the demographics of our data collectors. Emily talked about the goal of working with UCF researchers to organize this type of research project, studying yield rates, racial bias, and more in different communities.

- Crosswalk project highlights were shared:

Crystal Bowl Cir. at Casselberry ES – Gateway Treatments Installed in April

- Casselberry recently installed gateway treatments at the Crystal Bowl at Casselberry Elementary School crossing. This location averaged a 36% driver yield rate prior to installation (measured in March 2022).
- Dean shared that, unfortunately, one of the signs has already been knocked down but the city is working to get it restored.
- The latest data was collected at this location on May 23, and we are seeing a jump to 80%!
- One thing to note data collector noted more hard brakes than in previous two collections (13% or a total of 8 noted – up from only ONE noted in the previous collections).
- Dean also noted that people are stopping general would like more education to be pushed about what the stop bars/signage is, that people only need to stop if there is a PED in the crosswalk.

Queens Mirror Circle & Lost Lake Dr. – RRFB Installation

- The City of Casselberry recently installed new RRFBs at Queens Mirror Cir. & S. Lost Lake Ln. along with signage reminding driver of the state law to stop for pedestrians.
- Initial data collection indicates that these countermeasures are hugely successful. In December 2021, 43% of drivers were stopping for data collectors (the FY 20-21 average was 37%).
- Averaging our March and May 2022 data collection, this crosswalk is currently at 87%!

Warren Ave. at Reiter Park – New "Stop Here for PEDS" signage

- "Stop Here for Peds" signage was installed to accompany the existing stop bars at the Warren Ave. crosswalk at Reiter Park.
- Data collectors saw an initial driver yield rate increase from the baseline of 46% (Dec. 2021) to 80% (Feb. 2022) after the signage was installed.



She also mentioned the bus issues this school year and that she purchased LYNX bus passes for her students so they could attend afterschool activities and have a way to get home.

The event included live music, mobile vaccinations and great community partners coming together to offer resources and education to make our streets & neighborhoods safer.

Other vendors included Orange County Safe Neighborhoods, Orange County Sheriff's Office and Fire/Rescue, Catholic Charities, The Big Red Bus, Aspire Health, Community Legal and more. BFF's Roni was able to speak to attendees about safe ways to cross the street, especially the Lee Road area where most of them live. She also spoke to drivers about being alert near crosswalks and handed out our iY4Peds tear sheets highlighting more important tips on safety.

Several attendees brought up concerns for this stretch of Lee Road:

- The intersection of Lee Road & Adanson is very dark for pedestrians and there is no night time lights here. A man named Bruce has called this into 3-1-1 but asked if we could also report this safety problem to our partners.
- A lady who works at the library witnesses pedestrians run across Lee Road from apartments to the shopping center daily and hopes we can do more to keep them safe.
- There is a high homeless count of families living in hotels along Lee Road and this includes children attending Killarney Elementary School from hotels on the South side of the Lee Road and Lake Weston Elementary School from the hotels on the North side of Lee Road. A lady suggested education to the families at these hotels on safe places to cross as she has noted parents taking children and running across all areas of busy Lee Road

Event summary: Best Foot Forward's Roni Wood presented to Quest Village in the Waterford Lakes area of East Orlando on behalf of BFF partner Orange County. Quest Village is a 40-unit apartment complex where disabled or mentally challenged adults can live independently but still have necessary resources or assistance on property. It is a beautiful campus, and residents gathered for the presentation in their common area -- a space with games and seating to watch tv or visit with one another.

Most of these residents do not drive but rather walk or take public transit as their major source of transportation to jobs. They know firsthand of the critical need for pedestrian safety education and for drivers to pay attention to them when they are walking. Several people brought up scary and dangerous situations they had experienced where drivers weren't paying attention and didn't see them until the last minute. The group discussed the importance of using crosswalks, appearance of different crosswalks and where to cross if there's no obvious crosswalk. Roni showed them the walk and don't walk symbols. She also stressed how important it is to make eye contact with drivers or wave their hands for attention if necessary before they step out into the roadway.

These residents were grateful for the Best Foot Forward information and what the partners are doing to educate everyone of their responsibility as driver, pedestrian or cyclist.

Event summary: Founder's Day in Celebration is an evening of families coming together to enjoy concerts, food, vendors, fireworks & fun. Best Foot Forward hosted a table to speak with attendees about the program and pedestrian safety in Osceola County. Pedestrian safety is a major concern for residents here as the majority walk, cycle or even golf cart through the community to get around.

Additionally, lots of people took trail maps and love to ride bicycles. There are several cycling clubs in Celebration and e-bikes are popular here too. However, BFF's Roni Wood observed many families riding bicycles to the event and not one single child was wearing a helmet as Florida law requires other than one toddler.

Concerns to share with BFF partners were:

- Roni spoke to Janet, a wheelchair-bound lady with MS since 2006. Janet cannot lift her arms much above her waist while sitting. Janet said she must use her forehead to push the crosswalk buttons and that several crosswalk buttons are located in the dirt area with no ramp to get to it. She mentioned most vehicles' hoods are higher than her too so that makes it scary for her to cross a crosswalk at all. She mentioned crossing to Publix. She lives in Marisol Condos.
- Speed down Celebration Avenue even at midnight is a concern for a man who walks his dog.
- Concern at Celebration Avenue & Mulberry by two elder ladies who walk often. They said it's
 hard to see pedestrians when they step out into the crosswalk there because they are blocked
 by parked cars. Maybe we could look at this intersection to possibly remove a parking space?
- A man suggested 192 desperately needs a pedestrian bridge to cross from Old Town or Gaylord Palms areas. Way too many people crossing there at night and not using crosswalks he said.
- A lady stressed how they need to cut shrubs at Memory Gardens by the woods.

Another big concern for pedestrian safety in Poinciana is that there are not sidewalks along very busy Marigold Avenue. This problem is being addressed by Osceola County. In the meantime, BFF shared that it is safer to walk facing traffic when there are no sidewalks.

Event summary: Folks from all over Central Florida attended the 45th Annual Longwood Arts & Crafts Festival, and Best Foot Forward (BFF) took the opportunity to educate about pedestrian safety and listen to concerns. A few partners and elected officials - including Longwood Police Officers, Mayor Brian Sackett, Commissioner Matthew Morgan and several Citizen on Patrol officers – stopped by to express appreciation for the program and learn more details.

BFF distributed trail maps as the event was located only minutes from the Seminole County Trail. People came to the BFF tent specifically looking for the maps. Several asked questions about cycling and rules including the three-foot passing law. We educated lots of children too, reminding them to use crosswalks and to always wear bicycle helmets when on anything with wheels.

Other comments and concerns brought up were:

Sanford:

- 1) 17-92 needs a crosswalk in front of Holiday Inn. Pedestrians run across the 4-lanes there and it's extremely dangerous
- 2) Myrtle & Hester is area where cyclist come in packs on a Saturday but don't follow cycling rules. She has asked Sanford PD to educate cyclists here between 7:00 8:00 AM on a Saturday to be respectful to residents when they are frequenting their neighborhood.

Seminole County Trail:

- 1) At Markham Woods is a big concern as cyclists don't stop and come out without warning. A lady asked if we could educate here on a Saturday?
- 2) At Montgomery, cyclists don't stop at entrance to River Run South, and there's a hill for drivers so hard to know someone is crossing.
- 3) Lucas Nursery area (near Oviedo) very dangerous crossing at Seminole Trail due to intersection layout and turn lanes. This is on Aloma Avenue.

Oviedo Mall:

Blinking light around the mall is very confusing because it blinks all the time. Same also mentioned about blinking light at University Blvd. almost to Alafaya Trail.

Lake Mary:

Pedestrians dart across from Publix to Target without using crosswalks a lady said. She
avoids area completely and will travel two miles out of the way to avoid this intersection
due to pedestrians.



2) Greeenwood Lakes Subdivision by Lk Mary H.S. pedestrians need education there a lady said.

Event summary: The Best Foot Forward Team tabled the first ever Inaugural Apopka Arts in the Park Festival. This event was a huge success! There were an estimated 2,000 attendees to the festival which included children singing and bands playing from local schools and the Best Foot Forward team was able to have conversations with approximately 350 people in total. We spoke to people from Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Lake and Volusia Counties so this event drew people from all over the Central Florida area.

Several attendees showed up by bicycle after riding the trail as the park is relatively close to the Apopka & West Orange Trails.

Community Feedback:

Apopka:

- 1) <u>Jason Dwelley Parkway & Brush Drive</u>: Pedestrians are concerned for drivers not yielding at the entrance to the park. A signalized pedestrian crossing was requested by several folks. The BFF team informed everyone that this was a crosswalk being observed in 2022.
- 2) Park Ave & 1st Street next to Kit Land Nelson Park man runs there daily and says they desperately need RRFB there especially when a festival is in the park. He's witnessed a man crossing in wheelchair almost hit and stated "drivers just do not yield for peds there." This same location brought up before from the Apopka Car Show. Area is still a concern.
- 3) Ponkan Road near Jason Dwelley Park there's no connector for the trail system said one man. He rides 30 miles a day and stated that he is "afraid leaving his home on that stretch of Ponkan Road just to get to the trail." Additionally, there is a lot of construction in the area and dump trucks "whizz" by him there. He's so afraid of being struck just trying to just get over to the Trail as the sidewalk is too small for cyclists. (The MPO Study Public Meeting had not been announced at the time of this event)
- 4) 436 & Line Road One person mentioned they had problem with pedestrians crossing here.

Zellwood:

- 1) We were requested to reach out to Zellwood Elementary School.
- 2) Zellwood Station met Bobbie Fox. She has a concern about speed in their community.



Altamonte Springs:

1) <u>434/Sand Lake Road by Lake Brantley</u> – the students are in danger when walking to school. Drivers just do not yield at this intersection. We were requested to present to Lk Brantley H.S. in the past following the Ford Motor Event. Roni will follow up with the school as well.

Event summary: The Gateway Orlando Mainstreet includes businesses leaders along Semoran Avenue (S.R. 436) from Toll Road 408 south to Toll Road 528 in Orlando. Their Coffee and Conversations group meets monthly to discuss matters affecting business along the corridor. BFF's Roni Wood presented the Best Foot Forward presentation highlighting best practices for crossing as a pedestrian, the driver yield laws, and other safety education items.

The group had significant concerns for pedestrian safety along Semoran Blvd. as it is a very busy corridor with vehicles traveling at high speeds. Most felt that drivers were often above the posted speed limit. Signal4 Analytics reports more than 80 pedestrian or bicycle-related crashes on the corridor, twelve of which resulted in an incapacitating injury and six fatalities across the previous five years. Additionally, the group highlighted crossing at unmarked locations is common as transit ridership is high, transit stops don't align with marked crossings, and there is a considerable distance between signalized crosswalks along the corridor.

The Gateway Orlando group asked Best Foot Forward to assist education efforts geared toward getting pedestrians to cross more safely. One suggestion included planting flowers in the medians to discourage pedestrians from crossing anywhere. BFF's Eric Trull highlighted work being constructed on the parallel U.S. 441 by FDOT, including several pedestrian hybrid beacons and additional safety improvements. Mr. Cordova, Executive Director, mentioned a Lynx S.R. 436 Transit Corridor Study that was previously completed and highlighted the improvements they are in desperate need of but have not heard of any updates since the study closed.

Gateway Orlando thanked the Best Foot Forward team for what we are doing in the area for their residents, business patrons, and our overall safety efforts.

Community Feedback: There was a lot of discussion on how it feels to be a pedestrian and/or bicyclist in the Downtown Orlando neighborhoods.

- A couple who recently relocated to College Park from Maryland were pleased with the walkability of the Main Street districts, but still chose to drive to the event because they felt there was no safe connection between the two, especially at night.
- Ferris/Virginia "no one ever stops for us here like they do up further, we need flashing lights"
- Two women walked over from Colonialtown North mentioned that "brighter streetlighting would be nice"
- A gentleman shared his ongoing concern about the area near the railroad tracks by the Yard apartment complex and the Virginia/Orange crosswalk/intersection, he also shared his interactions with City employees surrounding this area and his dissatisfaction with the recently "finished" sidewalk leading to/from that rosswalk/intersection
- More than half of the attendees did not cross at the crosswalk, someone said "this whole section should be a crosswalk with all these businesses"

Event summary: BFF Roni Wood presented the Best Foot Forward Children's Presentation six times today to ensure all 665 children at Hickory Tree Elementary School in St Cloud participated. This school is in a rural area of Osceola County where subdivisions back up to cattle fields. The location was chosen after safety concerns were brought to our attention in a BFF Meeting with Osceola partners.

Students came to the presentation through their Block Teachers which included P.E., Music and Art period and those four teachers were a tremendous help. Everyone learned to look Left-Right-Left before crossing the road and to always use a crosswalk. Roni explained how crosswalks can look different and the importance of making eye contact with drivers before stepping out into a crosswalk.

We spoke about their responsibility as a pedestrian and a cyclist just like a driver and that a bicycle is a vehicle so they must follow all traffic devices. They were asked to remind parents of the crosswalk law and the \$166 violation they could receive in Osceola County for not yielding to pedestrians.

There is no Crossing Guard here and no sidewalks leading to the school on Old Hickory Tree Road. So, students were told when there's no sidewalk provided, that they need to walk facing traffic. Speed was also noted as a concern. Roni will be returning to fit 390 students that were measured for a helmet and need one once inventory arrives.

Middle schoolers are sometimes hard to persuade however these students did listen very carefully to the message today. A student also shared how another student was struck in the area recently. Parkway Middle is near the BFF crosswalk at Florida Parkway & Royal Palm Drive where only 48% of drivers yield. Roni will follow up with an adult presentation in the area soon to continue to re-enforce pedestrian safety education in the Buena Ventura Lakes area.

- A request for Best Foot Forward to expand efforts into lobbying in Tallahassee.
- A suggestion to educate more at driver license bureaus as a "middle age driver" he
 thinks more drivers need refreshers and renewing a license would be a good
 opportunity for education.
- A concern for Hunter's Creek Middle School crosswalk which is on a curve and has no lighting after dark. The woman who addressed the challenge feels unsafe here and worries about children crossing. She suggested an RRFB to enhance awareness of the crosswalk to drivers.

Event summary: This event was huge! Attendees came from all over within an hour drive of Kit Land Nelson Park to attend the event for its 60th Anniversary. Best Foot Forward was joined by partners from Apopka Police Department and Orange County Sheriff's Office including Deputy Boggs. BFF Roni Wood spoke to Apopka Mayor Nelson, Commissioner Velasquez and even Commissioner Sheehan from City of Orlando who passed by to say hello.

A good number of people came to the BFF tent looking for bike trail maps when seeing the Bike/Walk Central Florida Logo from afar. The park is located right next to the West Orange Trail and several people came up on bicycles for the event. While there, Roni shared crosswalk & pedestrian safety too. She fit 22 people with a new bicycle helmet which helped facilitate conversations around the Florida Driver Yield Law.

Roni had discussions with a number of attendees regarding challenges and experiences across Central Florida roads. At least eight different people knew someone who had been struck by a driver, including a few who explained the crash was caused by a distracted driver making a right turn at a traffic light. This was too familiar as Roni herself was also a victim of a distracted driver doing the same in 2018. Another story was a child struck who normally wears a whistle around his neck to bring awareness to himself when riding his bicycle to school. Dad also was wearing a whistle and rides often. On the day he was struck his dad said he had forgotten the whistle but has never forgotten it since. These stories are what drives the BFF team to educate motorists at events like this.

Event summary: Best Foot Forward's (BFF) Roni Wood joined Celebration K-8 School to share the Children's Safety Presentation live with a 5th grade class during their Physical Education time. The presentation was recorded and will be shared in segments over the rest of the week during the morning announcements. Each day the students will receive a piece of the presentation with a big reminder to practice safety and put their Best Foot Forward.

This community is a wonderful walkable and bikeable community, but nowhere is exempt from risk of injury while walking, biking, or rolling. We discussed crosswalks like the one outside of their school and the previously monitored and enforced crosswalk in front of Town Hall just south on Celebration Avenue. Crosswalks are the safest place to cross the street, especially in this community where many vehicles are parallel parked. Kids were also reminded to look Left-Right-Left. It was a successful morning down in Osceola County educating 1,650 students.

In addition, at the last two Best Foot Forward outreach events in Celebration, we noticed a large majority of the kids were wearing helmets as they rode bikes. By Florida state law, helmets are required to be worn by anyone under 16 years old while riding a bicycle. With that, on May 4th for Bike to School Day, or "Wheels Week," the BFF team will return to fit students with free bicycle helmets should students come to campus without one and provide additional bicycle safety education in the process!

Event summary: Every year the first Wednesday in May, 'Bike to School Day' is held around the country. This year's Star Wars theme and bike train idea generated when Audubon Park's Safe Routes coordinator registered for the event slated for May 4th, also known as 'Star Wars Day' And so it became, May the Fourth B(ike) with You - Bike & Roll to School Day. Walking, biking, and rolling to school offers many benefits to people including regular physical activity, a cleaner environment, an opportunity to learn about safety around streets, and less car congestion. Commissioner Sheehan mentioned the importance of sidewalks on both sides of the street in our neighborhoods, especially around schools. After a brief safety message, APS's SRO Officer Beary, led the bike train alongside BWCF staff and APS parent, Erin Hearn, followed by the Commissioners, and APS Principal, Trevor Honohan. He rode the APS' surrey bike with other staff



dressed in Star Wars costumes. Families, community members, BWCF board members, and others walked, biked, rolled, and ran down Corrine Dr. Kittleson & Associates and city staff were in each driveway along the route to encourage and protect the path full of people. As the train neared the school it continued right onto the track. Many kids, parents and teachers were already walking, biking, and rolling around the track. BWCF set up a table with materials in front of the school that morning to educate parents and children about bike/ped safety and Florida driver yield laws as they arrived at school. Hundreds of kids walked, biked, and rolled to school that day.

Roni was also able to fit 64 people with new bicycle helmets, including a St Cloud Firefighter who sees pedestrian injuries a lot. She shared the story of the Eagle Circle pedestrian killed last week in Casselberry right in front of her home. Another lady shared a story about her brother, who has been in ICU for a month after being struck by a driver in Orlando. She was grateful he's still alive but said he has a long road of recovery ahead.

It was a busy event and great opportunity to educate the Osceola County area residents, but we will continue our efforts in the area to make sure more drivers know about the crosswalk law and the Best Foot Forward initiative, especially along Lakeshore Blvd in St Cloud.

One couple who was riding not wearing helmets left the event with two brand new properly fitted helmets and were so appreciative. Another lady was wearing her daughter's helmet and Roni took the opportunity to tighten the straps, so the riders was safe while riding.

Event summary: Best Foot Forward (BFF) joined Winter Park Farmer's Market visitors during a busy Saturday morning market. BFF ensured attendees left with more than their market goods, providing educational resources about Florida's driver yield laws, sharing information about Winter Park's work to make the roads safer for people walking, and discussing concerns and challenges faced by Winter Park residents. A common theme among the residents' comments was concern about speeding and distracted drivers who seem to not care about other road users.

One resident, Nancy Flaherty, frequently walks and bikes in the Winter Park area and shared several safety concerns:

- 1. S. Interlachen Ave. at the Alfond Inn Drivers do not stop for pedestrians, feels very unsafe.
- 2. E. Fairbanks Ave., where it turns into Osceola Ave. then Aloma Ave. (through curves) There is no safe place to cross in this area except Sylvan Dr crosswalk just before Lakemont. The roadway is narrow and, if the sidewalk is blocked (construction, etc.) then she's walks in the road with speeding drivers to pass the closure and get back on the sidewalk.
- 3. 17-92 & Lee Rd. Noted that she used to cross here often to go to the Ravaudage Center but has stopped because it is not a safe crossing. Drivers making right turns do not yield for pedestrians and she does not have enough time to get across before the pedestrian signal ends. There's a nearby Senior Center close and she worries about those residents trying to cross here. She did note that this problem may have been solved by now since she no longer goes to this area but wanted to bring attention to the timing of the traffic lights and the drivers turning.

BFF also connected with <u>Lt. David Millier</u> with the St. Cloud Fire Department, who runs a non-profit (<u>Fire Pals, Inc.</u>) distributing educational resources to children in book boxes throughout St. Cloud. Roni directed Lt. Millier to the Bike/Ped Resource Center where he can order various free bike and pedestrian safety resources.

The Farmer's Market recently moved to a new location and Roni observed attendees were seen crossing S. New York Ave. between Carolina Ave. and W. Morse Blvd. The only natural crosswalk location is at Morse Blvd., with no marked crosswalk at the intersection of Carolina Ave. & New York Ave. It may be



worth striping the crosswalk at Carolina Ave. & New York Ave. location and adding signage reminding drivers of pedestrians, especially with this new foot traffic.

Event Summary: Days before the start of the 2022-2023 school year, BFF shared educational materials and resources with Orange County Public Schools bus drivers at their Annual Transportation Services Fall Training Conference at the Orange County Convention Center.
