VIII. CONSENT AGENDA (ACTION ITEMS)

A. Approval of Minutes - June 8, 2016 Board Meeting

(Tab 1)

The minutes of the June 8, 2016 Board meeting are provided at Tab 1.

B. Approval of May 2016 Monthly Financial Report; acknowledgement of June 2016 Travel Report (Tab 2)

The preliminary monthly financial reports for the period ending May 31, 2016 is provided at Tab 2 for approval. Acknowledgment is also requested of travel outside our region during the month of June 2016, which is also provided at Tab 2.

C. Approval of Budget Amendment No. 8

(Tab 3)

Approval is requested of Budget Amendment #8 to reallocate funds in grants and local funds for overspent elements. This amendment does not change the total budget, any grant-wide budgets, or total salary, total fringe, or total indirect expenses). A copy of Budget Amendment No. 8 is provided at Tab 3.

D. Approval of Proposed Change to MetroPlan Orlando's Internal Operating Procedures

Our Board-approved Internal Operating Procedures require that a voice vote be conducted of Board members when there is not a unanimous vote. At last month's Board meeting, Mayor Dyer recommended that this policy be revised. It is proposed to revise the Internal Operating Procedures, Section VII, paragraph 7 as follows with new text <u>underlined</u> and text to be omitted shown as strike-through:

(7) Voting shall be by voice. A roll call vote shall be held to adopt and/or amend the Long Range Transportation Plan and Transportation Improvement Program, as required by federal and state law. A roll call vote shall be held and in all instances where a voice vote is other than unanimous on all other items, provided that the MetroPlan Orlando

Board may waive a roll call vote in such instances by a less than unanimous voice vote.

All other questions or procedures shall be governed by the most recent edition of Robert's Rules of Order.

The operational aspect of this provision will be at the discretion of the Board Chairman based on the nature of the item and requests for a roll call vote that may be made by individual Board members.

E. Approval to Exercise Option to Extend General Planning Consultant Contract

The Board approved a two-year contract, with one option to renew for an additional one year, with Kittelson & Associates, Inc. for General Planning Consultant Services effective September 1, 2014. Approval is requested to exercise the option to renew the agreement. Funds are available in the approved FY 2017 budget for planned GPC planning activities. Activities are assigned by task work order for each project.

F. Approval to Award for Traffic Signal Timing Contracts

(Tab 4)

Approval is requested to award three contracts, pending contract negotiations, with the following consultants to perform work related to the Traffic Signal Retiming Project. Funds are budgeted in FY 2017 for this project.

- 1. Albeck Gerken
- 2. Faller, Davis & Associates
- 3. HDR

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised in May 2016 and a selection committee consisting of one MetroPlan Orlando staff member and four outside members met and ranked the five proposals received. A second meeting was held where all five proposers provided oral responses via teleconference to prepared questions and a second scoring was conducted. The combined scores were used to rank the five proposers. Should negotiations fail with any of the three highest ranked proposers, approval is requested to negotiate with the fourth and fifth ranked proposers. The ranking of the short-listed proposers is listed in Tab 4.

G. Approval of Contribution to Bike/Walk Central Florida

Board approval is requested to make a contribution to Bike/Walk Central Florida in the amount of \$100,000 to continue the work of the "Best Foot Forward" bicycle and pedestrian safety program with an expanded reach into Seminole and Osceola Counties. Bicycle and pedestrian safety continues to be a high priority focus area for MetroPlan Orlando, local governments and our partner agencies. Funds for this purpose have been included in our approved FY2016/2017 budget.

H. Approval of Contribution to ITNOrlando

Board approval is requested to make a contribution to the Independent Transportation Network of Orlando (ITNOrlando), an affiliate of ITNAmerica, in the amount of \$10,000. ITNOrlando is an innovative program providing dignified transportation services to senior citizens and people with visual impairments using both volunteer and paid drivers. Given

the growth in our region's senior population and the lack of alternatives for people who cannot drive, ITNOrlando serves an important need. The current ITNOrlando service area includes Altamonte Springs, Longwood, Casselberry, Maitland, Eatonville, Winter Park, portions of unincorporated Orange County and downtown Orlando. Efforts are underway to expand service to other areas with high concentrations of senior citizens. Commissioner Pete Clarke is a member of the ITNOrlando Board who serves with no compensation and Mr. Barley is a former Board member and he continues to serve as a volunteer driver. Funds are available in our approved FY2016/2017 budget for this purpose.

At the June 8th Board meeting, the Board took action to approve FDOT's suggestion to take the total amount of old federal earmark funds available for repurposing for other projects and apply these funds to the six-lane project on Maitland Blvd. from I-4 to Maitland Avenue. An equal amount of funds will then be taken from the Maitland Blvd. project to be applied to another project in the MetroPlan Orlando region. Mr. Gary Huttmann, MetroPlan Orlando staff, will be requesting Board approval for a project on which to apply these funds.

I. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Scott Boyd welcomed members and Mayor Gary Bruhn led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Commissioner Boyd spoke briefly about Second Harvest Food Bank and introduced Mr. Dave Krepcho, President and CEO, who provided an overview of the organization and its operations, including the culinary training program. Commissioner Bob Dallari asked Mr. Krepcho how Second Harvest leverages the monetary donations they receive. Mr. Krepcho responded that Second Harvest, through efficiency and the help of volunteers, is able to provide \$9 worth of groceries for every \$1 donated. Commissioner Boyd called on Commissioner Pete Clarke to provide a report on the May 12 meeting of the Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board.

Commissioner Clarke reported that the TDLCB approved the 2015 Community Transportation Coordinator report, the Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan update, the 2016-2017 rate calculation worksheet and ACCESS LYNX's request to revise their no-show policy. He told board members that he recommended a TDLCB workshop, to be scheduled later in the year, for members and the public to help provide a better understanding of paratransit services. Commissioner Clarke added that the Board also received several presentations on paratransit technology advancements that are being developed or tested.

Commissioner Boyd recognized Mayor Buddy Dyer who provided a report on the May 25th Commuter Rail Commission meeting. Mayor Dyer reported that at the Commuter Rail Commission meeting, the Board discussed how and when the Central Florida Commuter Rail Commission should take over operations of SunRail from FDOT, which was scheduled to operate the rail system for the first seven years. He felt that operations should be taken over before the seven years was up, in order to allow time for the stakeholders to evaluate operations issues that might be encountered while FDOT was still providing the financial support. Subsequently, he added, the SunRail Technical Advisory Committee was tasked with identifying potential issues with the transition from FDOT. Mayor Dyer reviewed the ridership numbers, on-time performance stats, service changes that included ending a later nighttime train and adding a 1:00 p.m. afternoon train, costs for expanded service, and special events service additions. He also provided an update on Phase II south, Phase II north and Phase III connecting to Orlando International Airport.

III. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Harry Barley acknowledged board alternates: Commissioner Diane Velazquez for Mayor Kilsheimer; Mayor Gary Bruhn for Mayor Lacey; Mr. Frank O'Dea for Secretary Noranne Downs and Ms. Mary Moskowitz for Ms. Andrea Ostrodka. He also acknowledged Special Guest, Kissimmee City Commissioner Jose Alvarez. Mr. Barley called attention to the good work at Second Harvest and told Board members that contributions could be made at the meeting or on the Second Harvest website. He introduced Roneice Weaver, Hebni Nutrition who spoke about the mobile food market program they offer to underserved populations. Mr. Barley congratulated Mr. Stephen Smith and Commissioner Victoria Siplin on their recent completion of the MPOAC Institute program.

Mr. Smith commented that the Institute program was very thorough and he would recommend it to other board members who have not had the opportunity to attend. Mayor Jacobs requested the floor to introduce Mr. Edward Johnson, new LYNX CEO. She asked if an update on LYNX operations could be provided at a future MetroPlan Orlando board meeting.

IV. CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Cathy Goldfarb confirmed a quorum of 16 voting members present. Also present were 4 advisors; and the meeting having been duly convened was ready to proceed with business.

V. AGENDA REVIEW

There were no changes to the agenda.

VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Transportation Systems Management & Operations Advisory Committee (TSMO) Chairman, Mr. Corey Quinn reported that TSMO met on May 27, 2016 and approved the April 22 meeting minutes and staff's recommendation to repurpose earmark funds to advance premium transit projects on the MetroPlan Orlando Prioritized Project List (PPL). He told board members that the meeting included a work session to review the current ranking of TSMO projects in the PPL in preparation for developing the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List.

Municipal Advisory Committee (MAC) Vice-Chairman, Mayor Gary Bruhn reported that the MAC met on June 2, 2016 and held their annual election of officers. Mayor Bruhn told board members that he was elected Chairman, although he was sitting in at today's meeting for Mayor Charles Lacey, who is the current MAC Chair. In addition, MAC elected Council President John Dowless Vice Chairman and Mayor Dominic Persampiere was elected 2nd Vice Chair. Mayor Bruhn added that MAC appointed a Bylaws Review Subcommittee, which will meet immediately following the July 7 MAC meeting. MAC members, he reported, had a lengthy discussion regarding the repurposing of the earmark funding and based on recent developments with increased quiet zone costs, recommended that the leftover federal earmark funds be applied to quiet zones. Mayor Bruhn added that MAC approved the Central Florida MPO Alliance priority lists and had presentations on the FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP preview and the ITS Master Plan and Federal Grant Application. The next MAC meeting, he noted, was scheduled for Thursday, July 7, 2016.

Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) Vice-Chairman, Ms. Mary Moskowitz reported that the TAC met on May 27, 2016 and reviewed MetroPlan Orlando's staff recommendation on repurposing of federal earmark funds. She informed board members that TAC members recommended delaying action on the repurposing of funds until the June/July

meetings to give them more time to review the information and make a more informed recommendation to the Board. Ms. Moskowitz reported that TAC members approved the Central Florida MPO Alliance priority lists and held a workshop to begin developing the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List.

Community Advisory Committee (CAC) Chairman, Mr. Tom O'Hanlon reported that the CAC met on May 25, 2016 and recommended approval of the Central Florida MPO Alliance priority lists. CAC members, he noted, supported repurposing of the federal earmark funds to advance transit projects. In addition, he reported that CAC members received a preview of the new Transportation Improvement Program and viewed a video of Jeff Speck's lecture on walkable communities.

VII. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ACTION ITEMS

Mr. Tom Narut, Save Orange County, commented on traffic bottleneck issues on east SR 50. Mr. Narut provided a handout detailing the location of the traffic issue. He noted that based on volume to capacity ratios in that area, the corridor scores poorly. Despite widening to six lanes, he added, the volume to capacity ratios in the future will still give the corridor an F rating. Discussion ensued regarding the possibility of delaying construction on SR 50 to accommodate extending SR 408.

Ms. Joanne Counelis commented on the need for 24 hour a day, seven day a week bus and rail transit all year round, with increased frequency throughout the day.

Ms. Christina Foglesong, representing ETC International Drive Stakeholders, commented that the stakeholders group regularly looks at issues that are important to the area. They identified a bottleneck issue on Sand Lake Road that impacts traffic flow in the area. Ms. Foglesong provided information on a possible I-4 slip ramp solution to the bottleneck issue. She told board members that FDOT had reviewed the project and deemed it feasible with the I-4 project and cost was relatively low at about \$2.5 million, with local business owners possibly helping to offset some of that cost. Ms. Foglesong provided a handout depicting possible ramp options.

VIII. CONSENT AGENDA

A. Approval of Minutes - May 11, 2016 Board Meeting

The minutes of the May 11, 2016 Board meeting were provided.

B. Approval of April 2016 Monthly Financial Report; and acknowledgement of May 2016 Travel Report

The financial report for April 2016 was provided for approval. Acknowledgment was also requested of travel outside our region during the month of May 2016 as provided.

C. Renew Agreement with University of Florida for Crash Database

Approval was requested to award a sole source contract to the University of Florida to update MetroPlan Orlando's Web-based Crash Database. This was a continuing project with the University of Florida to update the database through 2017. This provides web-based access to crash data and analytical tools to MetroPlan Orlando staff and partners. It was currently hosted at the University of Florida's Geoplan Center. Improvement in access to crash data and analysis contribute to the fulfillment of the requirement to include safety as a planning factor that a metropolitan planning organization must address in its transportation planning process and will support MetroPlan Orlando's mission to make the roadways safer. This request was being handled in compliance with the Board-approved procedures for awarding sole source contracts. The sole source contract, which is permitted under our procurement rules since the contractor was another public entity, would be for a total amount of \$35,000. Funds were included in our approved FY 2016/2017 budget for this purpose. A copy of the Scope of Services was provided.

D. Approval of Central Florida MPO Alliance Prioritized Project Lists

Action was requested by Ms. Virginia Whittington, MetroPlan Orlando staff, to recommend approval of the Central Florida MPO Alliance (CFMPOA) Prioritized Project List, which included a list of highway, trail and transit projects that are of regional significance. The draft list was provided. This topic was being taken up with the individual members of the Central Florida MPO Alliance and will be an action item at the next Alliance meeting on July 15, 2016. Commissioner Edwards questioned whether approval of the CFMPOA priority list would contradict the MetroPlan Orlando priority list. Mr. Barley explained that the list was previewed at the May meeting and does not change the MetroPlan Orlando priority list, it simply provides a cohesive list of regional projects.

E. Board Approval of Off-site Board Meeting - September 14, 2016

As a follow-up to the offer made at last month's Board meeting by Mayor Swan, preliminary arrangements have been made with the Osceola Council on Aging to hold our September 14, 2016 Board meeting at their location on 700 Generation Point, Kissimmee, Florida 34744 (across from Osceola Heritage Park). Board approval was requested to confirm plans and make associated arrangements. Commissioner Boyd told board members that this was the second and only other offsite board meeting for 2016. Mr. Barley explained that the Osceola Council on Aging was graciously providing their facility free of charge for the meeting.

MOTION: Mayor Jim Swan moved approval of Consent Agenda (A-E). Commissioner Bob Dallari seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

IX. OTHER ACTION ITEMS

A. Repurposing of Federal Earmark Funds - Staff Recommendation

Mr. Gary Huttmann, MetroPlan Orlando, explained a provision that was contained in the new federal transportation bill (the FAST Act) regarding repurposed earmarks, old qualifying earmarks in our 3-county area and the staff recommendation that uncommitted funds be used to advance project development of premium transit projects included on the MetroPlan Transit Prioritized Project List. A bulletin describing the repurposing process was provided along with a spreadsheet showing the projects in the MetroPlan Orlando region that have earmark funds available for repurposing. Mr. Huttmann reported that there had been some changes since the original material was sent and he would also report on those changes. He told Board members that legislators no longer use earmarks to set aside funding for projects and the state was given the authority to repurpose funding that remained available. The FDOT Central Office in turn gave the authority to the FDOT District Office to designate projects locally to advance with the funds. MetroPlan Orlando he noted, reached out to those jurisdictions where earmark funds had been allocated to. The City of Orlando remained committed to using the earmark funds they had received on the Alden Road project; the City of Sanford on the roundabout; and the Town of Windermere on pedestrian safety improvements. MetroPlan Orlando has coordinated with District 5, he reported, on allocating the available \$3 million, which needs to be allocated by August and requires MetroPlan Orlando board approval. Due to the abbreviated timeline for allocating these funds, FDOT suggested allocating the federal earmark funding to the Maitland Boulevard project with the funds in the same amount from the Maitland Boulevard project being reallocated to a project(s) to be determined. Discussion ensued regarding additional costs for quiet zones and the tight schedule to secure the additional funds needed, and the impact of not using the funds on the US 192 BRT, SR 50 BRT and the LYMMO expansion as originally suggested by staff. Mr. Frank O'Dea, FDOT, commented that the deadline for the additional quiet zone funding had been Monday June 6th but that FDOT was looking to give the local jurisdictions additional time to come up with the funds. He noted that by applying the earmark funding to the Maitland Boulevard project, it took the pressure off due to the time constraints and other options could be looked into. Mr. Barley added that the Maitland Boulevard project did not require any additional funding and this would allow staff to come back to the board to see where to spend the funds that would become available.

MOTION: Commissioner Bob Dallari moved approval of earmark funds being allocated to the Maitland Boulevard project with replacement funds from the project allocated to future projects to be determined with Board approval. Mayor Jim Swan seconded the motion, which passed 15:1 (Roll vote taken, Bruhn opposed).

Mayor Dyer questioned the need to conduct a roll vote in cases where there was more than a two-thirds majority. Staff responded that it was written into MetroPlan Orlando's Internal Operating Procedures to conduct a roll vote when a vote is less than unanimous. Mayor Dyer asked if that policy could be reviewed and possibly revised. Staff and MetroPlan Orlando legal counsel, Mr. Steve Bechtel, will look into reviewing and possibly rewriting the voting policy. Mayor Jacobs requested a copy of MetroPlan Orlando's Internal Operating Procedures.

B. Board Consent to Explore Hosting Possibilities with East Central Florida Regional Planning Council

Commissioner Lee Constantine, in his roles as the Board Chairman of the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council and a MetroPlan Orlando Board member, discussed some options for MetroPlan Orlando to perhaps host the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council (ECFRPC). This topic was discussed by the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council Board at their May 18, 2016 meeting. Board consent was requested for Mr. Barley to work with Commissioner Constantine on exploring these possibilities. Commissioner Constantine told board members that the ECFRPC's lease was up shortly and they were looking at options to save money for the agency. He reported that some of the options included use of MetroPlan Orlando's meeting rooms or possible housing ECFRPC staff at MetroPlan Orlando's location. Commissioner Dallari commented that MetroPlan Orlando already allows other local agencies/governments and non-profits use of their meeting space free of charge. Commissioner Constantine added that the request was only to explore possible options that could provide a cost savings to taxpayers and that the MetroPlan Orlando and ECFRPC boards would need to approve any options. Commissioner Grieb commented that the ECFRPC Director also needed to be included in the discussions. Discussion ensued regarding ECFRPC lease options, timeline for a move, and the possibility of using space at LYNX. Commissioner Boyd told board members that he can work with Mr. Barley on the ECRPC hosting issue and report back to the board.

MOTION: Commissioner Viviana Janer moved approval of discussing options for hosting the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council at MetroPlan Orlando. Mayor Teresa Jacobs seconded the motion.

AMENDED MOTION: Commissioner Viviana Janer moved approval of discussing options for hosting the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council with MetroPlan Orlando, Central Florida Expressway Authority and LYNX. Mayor Teresa Jacobs seconded the motion, which passed unanimously

XI. OTHER BUSINESS

A. Preview of MetroPlan Orlando's Draft FY2016/17-2020/2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, presented a preview of the new FY 2016/17-2020/21 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Copies of the FDOT highway and bicycle and pedestrian projects and the LYNX transit projects were provided. A copy of the FY 2020/21-2039/40 Prioritized Project List that was adopted last year was also provided and had been updated to show the latest project phases that have been funded based on the new TIP. The TIP will be presented for action at the July 13, 2016 Board meeting. Mr. Caskey provided some background information on the TIP and reviewed the changes that had been made for the new TIP. He called attention to the addition of toll road projects to the lists. Those projects had not been included in the past, he noted, due to them being funded through tolls. A TIP public hearing, he added, will be held on Monday, June 20th at MetroPlan Orlando with maps available at 5:30 p.m. and the hearing at 6:00 p.m.

B. Shingle Creek Trail Overview and Status Report

An information presentation was made on the Shingle Creek Trail. This is a major regional trail project in Orange and Osceola Counties that will connect to the Coast-to-Coast Trail. The presentation included a description of the overall project, a status report on each of the trail segments and a discussion of challenges that need to be resolved. Mr. Thomas reviewed the length of the trail, connections and current alignments, segments of the trail and the neighborhoods and destinations the trail accesses. Mr. Randy Schrader, City of Kissimmee staff, informed board members of possible ecotourism benefits of the Shingle Creek Trail. Commissioner Grieb commented that the Shingle Creek Trail was part of the Metro Orlando loop. Mayor Swan added that the trail idea originated in 1984. A video of the trail was provided for board members to view.

C. Central Florida Expressway Authority Year 2040 Master Plan Update

Ms. Laura Kelley, Central Florida Expressway Authority, briefed the Board on their Year 2040 Master Plan Update that was approved on May 12, 2016. Ms. Kelley focused on the major projects identified in the Master Plan which included a Maitland Boulevard express connect to I-4, the SR 408 extension to the east, and a US 27 to SR 429 connection. She told board members that CFX had adopted the Osceola Expressway Authority Master Plan and the East Central Florida Task Force Master Plan as part of their Master Plan. Ms. Kelley reported that CFX has contracted with the Center for Urban Transportation Research at USF/Tampa to look at working with intermodal partners now that CFX has the ability to look at intermodal types of transportation. The 2040 Master Plan, she added, identified \$10 - \$12 billion in projects, however CFX only has the

financial capacity for \$7 billion, making project prioritization crucial. Ms. Kelley told members that the entire Master Plan was available to view on the CFX website. Commissioner Dallari asked how many miles of roads CFX manages and if there were any plans to implement express toll lanes on any of their roads. Ms. Kelley responded that CFX manages 109 miles of roadways and there were no plans to add express toll lanes to any of their roads. She added that in 25 years, SR 408 will be constrained so alternative modes of transportation will need to be looked at. Mr. Tom O'Hanlon asked about any progress on a possible roadway swap with Florida's Turnpike Enterprise in order to have one agency overseeing an entire road. Ms. Kelley responded that FDOT has made it clear they would not sell any portions of the roadways they manage, but that CFX has a package offer ready in case that changes.

XII. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Commissioner Boyd called attention to a proposed redevelopment of Dillard Street in Winter Garden. He had an information packet that he was turning over to Mr. Barley to review and he would like to bring that project information to the MetroPlan Orlando board at the July meeting.

XIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS (GENERAL)

Mr. John Casselberry, City of Casselberry resident, commented on pedestrian safety issues at the intersection of Park Avenue and US 17-92 and the need for crossing signalization in that area.

XIV. NEXT MEETING - July 13, 2016

XV. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:07 a.m. The meeting was transcribed by Cathy Goldfarb.

Mr. Harry Barley, MetroPlan Orlando Staff opened the public hearing at 6:00 p.m. and thanked everyone for attending on behalf of MetroPlan Orlando Board Chairman, Commissioner Scott Boyd. He introduced MetroPlan Orlando staff members in attendance, including Mr. Keith Caskey, who provided an overview of the draft FY 2016/17-2020/21 Transportation Improvement Plan. The plan includes highway, transit, aviation and bicycle/pedestrian projects that are programmed for funding over the next five years. Mr. Caskey also reviewed local toll road projects, which normally are not included due to the projects being self-funded through toll revenue. Handouts of the draft Transportation Improvement Program and Prioritized Project List were available for attendees. Following the presentation Mr. Caskey opened the floor for public comments on the proposed draft FY 2016/17-2020/21 Transportation Improvement Plan.

The following verbal comments were received at the public hearing:

Mr. Thomas G. Caffery, P.E. (ASCE)

Mr. Caffery commented on the failure to act on investing in infrastructure and the negative monetary impact the failure to act has on the population. He stated that the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) is advocating for an increase in the investment in infrastructure and for Orange County to increase their local option gas tax to help fund the improvements. He provided a copy of a report ASCE had done entitled Failure to Act, Closing the Infrastructure Investment Gap for America's Economic Future. The report, he noted, was also available online.

Mr. John Puhek (Sierra Club)

Mr. Puhek commented that LYNX's operating budget has been flat for the last five years and there was a need to improve funding for LYNX to help improve service. He stated that the Sierra Club applauds funding allocated to the Shingle Creek Trail, which he felt would benefit not only local bicyclists and pedestrians, but tourists as well. Mr. Puhek added that Sierra Club supports the proposed light rail/Bus Rapid Transit connection from Orlando International Airport to the Orange County Convention Center, and he encouraged Orange County and the MPO groups to adopt and fund that project.

Mr. Puhek inquired about what context sensitive projects entailed. Mr. Caskey responded that context sensitive projects included a number of different options outside of adding capacity to improve traffic flow. These improvements, he noted, included adding bicycle and pedestrian facilities, traffic signal management, adding turn lanes or bus pull offs, etc.

Mr. Mark Line (Orlando resident)

Mr. Line asked about future projects on Robinson Street and Corrine Drive, which both have a great deal of pedestrian traffic. Mr. Caskey responded that he understood that FDOT was in the process of conducting a study on Robinson Street. The study was looking at a possible road diet for that arterial, which would reduce the number of traffic lanes and add bicycle and pedestrian improvements. He added that the same type of improvements were being looked at for Corrine Drive. Corrine Drive, he noted, may be an Orange County/City of Orlando collaborative study. Mr. Benton Bonney, City of Orlando staff, confirmed.

Subject: TIP

Accommodating/encouraging bicycle usage:

An awareness of the advantages of bicycles as serious means of commuting and other travel is still very low as compared with other national and world cities.

Bicyclists will not be seen using roads and trails if there is no serious intention to give them parity with other vehicles, i.e., their potential usage cannot be ascertained until there are safe means of travel.

Connectivity through safe corridors permitting multi-directional movement which we have provided to motor vehicles is essential if a tipping point toward usage is to occur (as is the case in many other countries).

Every motorist in some world cities, e.g., Amsterdam, Copenhagen etc., is aware of the need to accommodate bicyclists. That is not the case in Orlando, muchless Florida and driver education needs to retroactively educate and enforce such learning. This may be the most difficult part of the equation.

Transit:

Orlando has an adequate bus system, but it is no substitute for the rapid transit achieved by surface rail such as light rail which has been rebuilt in Los Angeles, Salt Lake City, Denver, Portland OR, Seattle, St. Louis, San Diego, Phoenix, et.al.

More bus lines need to be routed more directly, or reinforced by including express buses. Traveling 8 miles, e.g., should not take an hour or more.

Providing parking for cars and thereby encouraging congestion is not a long range solution. Downtown Orlando has become an attractive entertainment area, but the absence of safe evening transit will continue to be a problem.

These are just some general guidelines which should be the foundation for TIP in the greater Orlando area. Unfortunately I will be out of town for the meeting.

Greetings Board Members:

After reviewing the 5 – year Metro Plan List, I see nothing for Pine Hills.

The Gap trail projects from Hiawassee/Clarcona to Maitland Blv. and West Orange Trail Is a Cross-Country Florida Trial Project...not really a Pine Hills project.

In fact, it bumped our Phase II project off the list.

The following projects should be on the 5 year horizon:

- 1. Intersection improvements at Powers Drive (North Side especially) at Silver Star Rd. Traffic is backed up in both directions at least ¼ to ½ mile several times daily
- 2. Nothing about phase II of the Pine Hills Trail from Pine Hills Road to Clarcona Ocoee Rd. regarding land acquisition, design work, and importance of coordinating its presence next to new Lynx Transfer Station.
- 3. Nothing about Conceptual design of total acreage connecting Phase I and Phase II Pine Hills Trail.

Pine HIlls future Town Center and New Lynx Transfer Station, and location of Ped. Trail Bridge over our 6 lane Silver Star Rd.

- 4. Nothing about new intersection and land acquisition on N. Pine Hills Rd. to access the back of
 - The Silver Pines Shopping Center. That Center is land-locked creating severe vehicle and Ped. Safety issues.
- 5. Who is responsible lobbing for amenities on a State Rd? In Pine Hills along Silver Star Rd., even after a complete road redesign we were given no street lights (we had to go for Federal monies to obtain)
 - and no new mast arm lighting from Hiawassee to Dardinelle. (Still do not have)
- 6. Who decides when to replace 75 years of old curbing? Pine Hills needs new curbing and streets from W. Colonial
 - North to Silver Star Rd. from Hastings east to the City limits. [Every year a number of blocks should be renovated
 - With new sidewalks, curbing and streets....sidewalks seem to be the focus, but in Pine Hills you can't even see the
 - old curbing along Hastings east to Pine Hills Rd.
- This also does not mention anything about sewer for N. Pine Hills Rd. Maybe instead of widening, they should
 - narrow the road and put in large real sewers piping...not just media-septic systems, bike trails and safety features all at the same time?

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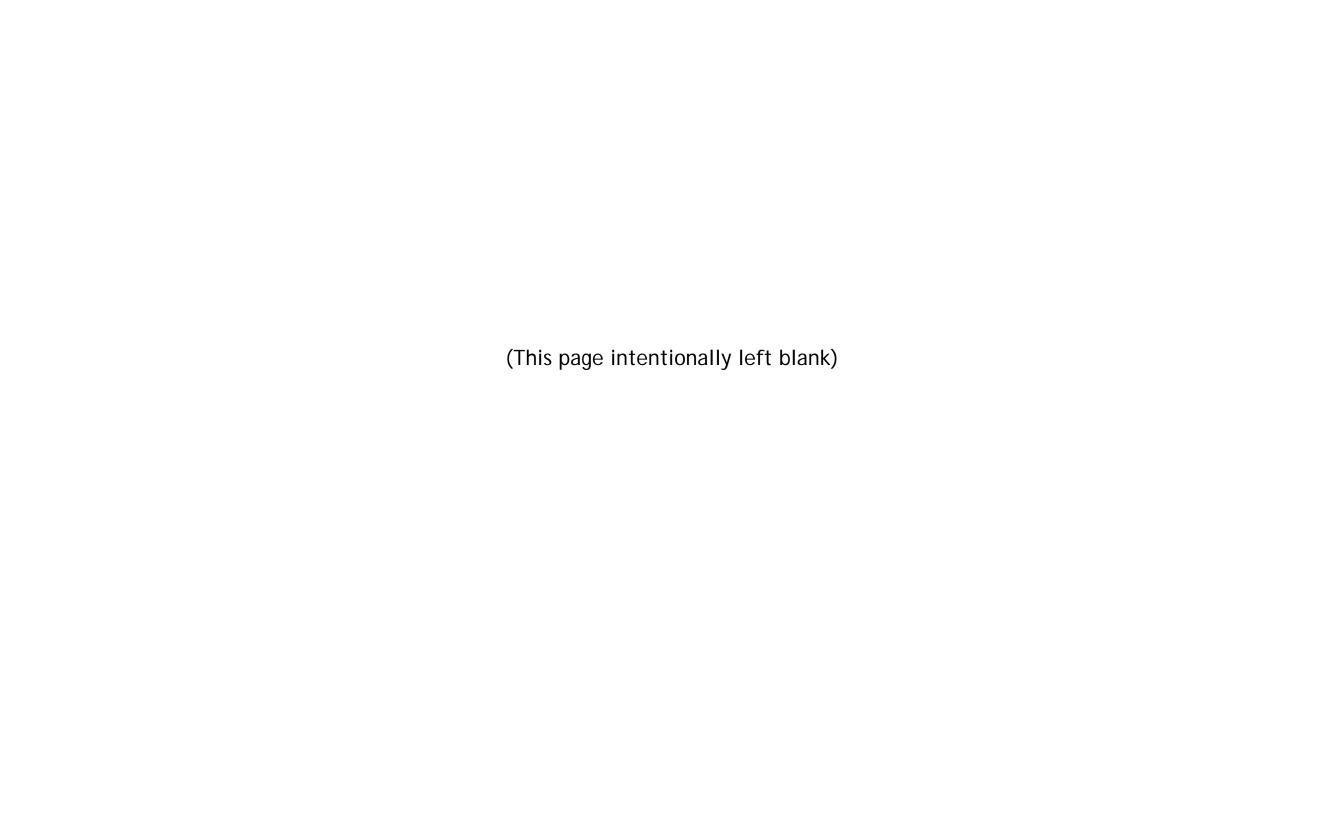
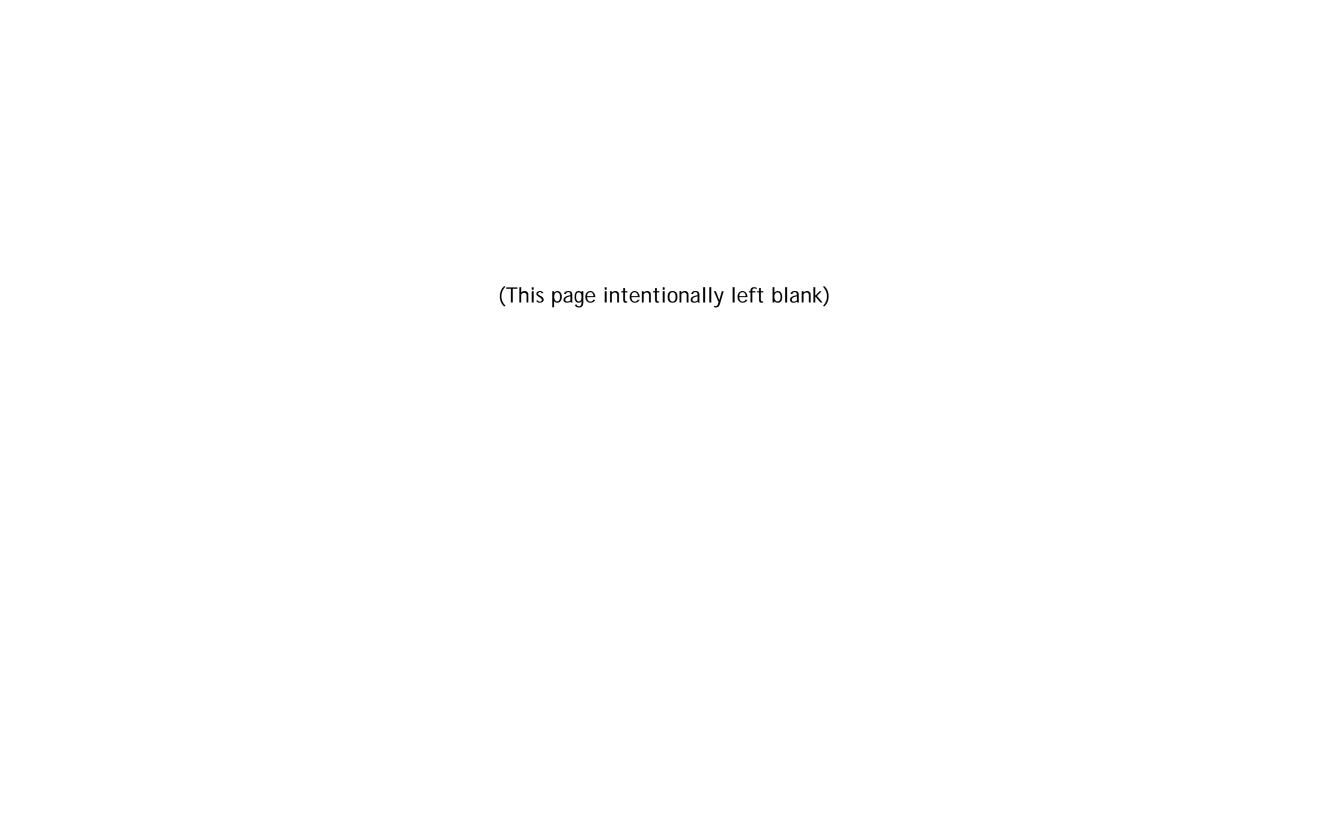


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Section I

MetroPlan Orlando Transportation Improvement Program Executive Summary

Executive Summary

I. Purpose of the TIP

The purpose of MetroPlan Orlando's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is to identify all federal and state funded transportation projects that have been scheduled for implementation in the Orlando Urban Area (Orange, Seminole and Osceola Counties) during the FY 2016/17-2020/21 time period. The projects listed in the TIP include improvements to the area's highway, transit, and aviation systems. Rail projects are also included. All regionally significant projects requiring FHWA or FTA approval are included in the TIP. Some locally funded projects are included as well, for information purposes, and the local governments and agencies in the area are contacted each year to obtain this information. The TIP also identifies the transportation disadvantaged projects, as well as the bicycle and pedestrian facilities, sidewalks, and other enhancement projects scheduled during this time period. The TIP has been prepared in accordance with Title 23 CFR Part 450 and Title 49 CFR Part 613.

II. Financial Plan

The TIP is financially constrained for each year in accordance with Title 23 CFR Part 450.324 (e and h). The federal and State-funded projects contained in the TIP are taken from the FDOT Five Year Work Program, which is financially constrained. The projects within the TIP are financially feasible, and the federally funded projects identified in the TIP can be implemented using current and proposed revenue sources based on FDOT's Tentative Five Year Work Program and locally dedicated transportation revenues.

III. Project Selection

The projects included in the TIP are priorities of MetroPlan Orlando, and have been drawn from MetroPlan Orlando's adopted Long Range Transportation Plan. The process used in prioritizing the projects is described below in Section V, and is consistent with federal requirements in 23 C.F.R. 450.330(c). These prioritized projects were approved by the MetroPlan Orlando Board in May 2015, and were forwarded to FDOT to be used in developing their FY 2016/17-2020/21 Tentative Five Year Work Program.

IV. Consistency with Other Plans

All projects included in the TIP have been drawn from MetroPlan Orlando's adopted Long Range Transportation Plan, as stated above. The TIP projects are consistent with the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Adopted Work Program. They are also consistent with the local transit authority's transit development plan, the local airport master plans, the local expressway authority's master plan, and the approved comprehensive plans of the local governments located within the Orlando Urban Area.

V. Project Priority Statement

The process of compiling each TIP begins with the development of the Prioritized Project List (PPL) the previous year. This document, which is updated each year, contains a list of unfunded highway, transit, and bicycle and pedestrian projects that have been prioritized for funding based on the criteria that are described in detail below. The FY 2020/21-2039/40 PPL, which was adopted by MetroPlan Orlando in May 2015, was used by FDOT in developing the FY 2016/17-2020/21 Tentative Five Year Work Program based on the priority of the projects. That Five Year Work Program was then used to develop this TIP.

Highway Projects

In preparing the highway section of the FY 2020/21-2039/40 PPL, the MetroPlan Orlando Board and its subsidiary committees developed a list of unfunded major highway projects that have been prioritized for funding based on their potential to help relieve traffic congestion in the area. The first list includes improvements to I-4 that are to be funded with Federal National Highway System (NHS) funds. The main project list includes improvements to major arterials, primarily state roads, within the urban area. These projects include traditional road widening projects, as well as multimodal projects that utilize bicycle & pedestrian and transit facilities to improve traffic flow on constrained roadways without adding lanes. MetroPlan Orlando has determined that these projects can be implemented in a timelier manner if FDOT combines Federal Surface Transportation Program (SU) and State District Dedicated Revenue (DDR) funds in programming these projects.

The highway projects in the PPL were ranked based on the consideration of the following criteria:

- The ratio of the projected traffic volume versus the existing carrying capacity for each roadway that is proposed for improvement, with those roadways that are the most over-capacity generally having the highest rankings
- The status of the right-of-way acquisition for a highway project, with those projects for which the right-of-way acquisition is already funded generally having a higher ranking
- The functional classification of a roadway that is proposed for improvement; i.e. freeway/expressway, major arterial, minor arterial, etc., with the roadways having the higher functional classification generally being given a higher ranking

Transportation Systems Management and Operations Projects

A list of Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSMO) projects is also included in the PPL. These projects utilize such methods as intersection and traffic signal improvements to alleviate traffic congestion on a roadway without adding lanes. The TSMO category includes projects related to incident management, Transportation Demand Management, and other management and operations activities. The following criteria were considered in ranking these projects:

- Project cost (cannot exceed \$4 million for all phases combined)
- Amount of right-of-way needed
- Significance of environmental impacts
- Acceptance of the project by the affected local government
- Ability to begin construction within 24 to 36 months
- Availability of funding

Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects

The list of bicycle and pedestrian projects included in the PPL was prepared by MetroPlan Orlando's Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee. The majority of the projects on the list were prioritized based on the following criteria:

- Expected facility usage
- Direct connection to transit
- Inclusion in local government bicycle plans
- Linkage with other bikeway facilities
- Connectivity to road network
- Bicycle & pedestrian Level of Service
- Readiness of project for construction

The BPAC used a separate set of criteria to prioritize regionally significant trails in order to improve connectivity within the trail system. These criteria are listed as follows:

- Regional importance
- Economic development potential
- Intermodal connectivity
- Readiness of project for construction
- Trail surface
- MPO funding share

Transit Projects

The list of transit projects included in the PPL was prepared based on the transit projects that are included in the 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan. MetroPlan Orlando staff and LYNX staff ranked these projects by priority based on consideration of the following criteria:

- Basic service and program funding
- Service development projects
- Capital bus replacement/repair/maintenance
- Customer amenities
- Additional capital non-basic service related
- Systems development (ITS technology, etc.)
- Studies all levels (DEIS, etc)

TRIP Projects

A list of candidate projects for Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) funds is also included in the PPL. TRIP funds are state funds provided for the purpose of improving growth management planning and increasing available funding for regionally significant transportation facilities in regional transportation areas. Under this program, FDOT will provide up to 50% of the total cost of selected regional transportation projects, with the balance coming from local match funds. (Some projects on the TRIP list are also on the STP list, and these projects are highlighted on both lists.) The TRIP projects in the PPL, which include highway and transit projects, were identified and ranked by the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) based on the following criteria:

- Level of traffic volume over capacity (highway projects)
- Connectivity to the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS)
- Improvement of traffic flow without adding capacity
- Provision of alternate mode of transportation
- Project phase/fiscal year being requested
- Functional classification (highway projects)
- Percentage of matching funds provided over 50% minimum

Funding Allocation

For the purpose of the FY 2020/21-2039/40 PPL, MetroPlan Orlando's policy was to divide the SU funding allocation for the transportation improvements for FY 2020/21 based on a percentage split of 32% for highway projects, 30% for transit projects, 21% for TSMO projects, and 17% for bicycle and pedestrian projects. In addition, up to 30% of MetroPlan Orlando's DDR funds can be allocated for the operation of the premium transit projects that are identified in the 2040 LRTP. The remaining DDR funds are combined with the SU funds for the highway projects.

As stated earlier, the projects included in the TIP are consistent with FDOT's Five Year Work Program, and are financially feasible based on the availability of the funds in each funding category. These projects represent the project priorities established by MetroPlan Orlando. The list of transportation projects in the PPL is reevaluated annually by the MetroPlan Orlando Board and its advisory committees.

VI. Regionally Significant Projects

The list of federal and state-funded highway projects considered by MetroPlan Orlando to be of regionally significant size and scope, along with their implementation status, is shown beginning on page I-12. In addition, the implementation of the projects contained in the TIP is monitored in reports published by FDOT on a quarterly basis.

VII. Previous Conforming Projects

This does not apply. The Orlando Urban Area is currently in attainment for all air pollutants, and has been since before the 1990 Clean Air Act Amendments were enacted.

VIII. Public Involvement

MetroPlan Orlando has a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) that meets on a regular basis. The members of the CAC are private citizens with an interest in the transportation issues affecting the area. These individuals receive information on transportation issues from the MetroPlan Orlando staff and other agencies, and provide input to the local governing bodies regarding these issues. The CAC assists the MetroPlan Orlando Board in developing transportation-related goals and objectives for shaping the urban environment, and also conducts public information programs. The meetings of the MetroPlan Orlando Board and its advisory committees are all open to the public, and provide opportunities for public comments. In addition, public hearings are held during the development of the Long Range Transportation Plan to give private citizens an opportunity to provide input on the Plan before it is approved by the MetroPlan Orlando Board. MetroPlan Orlando's public information process also includes such activities as publishing a transportation annual report, holding periodic news conferences and public hearings on transportation issues, and publishing transportation-related newsletters.

In regard to public involvement as related to the TIP, the TIP is reviewed and approved by the CAC, the TAC, the Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSMO) Advisory Committee, the Municipal Advisory Committee (MAC), and the MetroPlan Orlando Board at meetings that are open to the public. On June 20, 2016, the FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP will be presented at a public hearing before being adopted by the MetroPlan Orlando Board.

The TIP was also made available on MetroPlan Orlando's web site. This meets the public hearing requirements of 49 U.S.C. Section 5307(c), and the public notice of public involvement activities and the time established for public review and comment on the TIP satisfies the program of projects requirements of the Federal Transit Administration's Urbanized Area Formula Program. In addition, FDOT presents the Five Year Work Program at a public hearing before the Work Program is adopted.

IX. Certification

The latest federal certification review of the transportation planning process in the Orlando Urban Area by FHWA and FTA was conducted in February 2015. It is anticipated that MetroPlan Orlando's next federal certification review will occur in 2019. The latest annual FDOT certification review for MetroPlan Orlando was also conducted in February 2015.

X. Congestion Management Process

MetroPlan Orlando has included a Congestion Management Process (CMP) component in the Year 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan, which was adopted in June 2014 and updated in December 2015. CMP projects are designed to get the greatest efficiency out of the existing transportation network. CMP strategies include such techniques as freeway ramp metering, frontage roads, parking management, freeway lane restrictions, and lane pricing. Other strategies include Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) techniques such as computerized traffic signals and advanced traveler information systems, as well as intersection improvements. The CMP strategies are being incorporated into the TIP as they become scheduled for implementation and are shown in the TIP as TSMO projects on pages III-27 through III-29. As mentioned previously, a list of TSMO projects is included each year in the PPL.

XI. Transportation Disadvantaged Services

As required under Chapter 427.015 of the Florida Statutes, MetroPlan Orlando serves as the designated official planning agency in coordinating transportation services for the transportation disadvantaged in Orange, Osceola and Seminole Counties.

XII. Amending the TIP

This TIP can be amended at any time during the year in which it is adopted. MetroPlan Orlando uses the criteria for amending the TIP included in the FDOT Metropolitan Planning Organization Program Management Manual. Under these criteria, the TIP must be amended if:

- The change adds new individual projects to the current TIP
- The change affects air quality conformity
- The change adversely impacts financial constraints
- The change results in major scope changes
- The change removes or deletes an individually listed project from the TIP

All amendments to the TIP are presented to MetroPlan Orlando's advisory committees for their recommendations, and to the Board for final approval. Once TIP amendments are approved by the MetroPlan Orlando Board, the amendments are incorporated into the adopted TIP shown on MetroPlan Orlando's web site, and the Board resolutions documenting the approval of the amendments are sent to FDOT staff.

In the case where a TIP amendment must be approved prior to the next MetroPlan Orlando Board meeting in order for the amended project to receive funding, the MetroPlan Orlando Board Chairman is authorized to approve the amendment and sign the corresponding resolution on behalf of the Board without having to call an emergency meeting of the Board. The Chairman's approval of the amendment will then be ratified at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting.

During the TIP amendment process, members of the general public are provided opportunities to address their concerns about the requested amendments. At each advisory committee meeting or Board meeting where a TIP amendment is being requested, the meeting agenda includes a time for comments from the public on any action items on the agenda. Concerns about TIP amendments may be addressed at that time. If an individual has a concern about a TIP amendment but is unable to attend MetroPlan Orlando's regularly scheduled committee or Board meeting where the amendment will be acted on, that individual may send his or her comments to MetroPlan Orlando prior to the meeting through email or by phone. These comments will be entered into the meeting record for consideration by the committee or Board at the time they take action on the amendment.

XIII. TIP Format

In order to meet the federal requirements in 23 CFR 450.324(e)(2) for MPOs to show the total costs of the projects in their TIPs, MetroPlan Orlando's TIP is now formatted to include costs prior to, within, and beyond the five-year timeframe of the TIP. As a result, the spreadsheets in the TIP include the historic costs for each project prior to FY 2016/17 (if applicable), the funding programmed during the FY 2016/17-2020/21 timeframe of the TIP, and estimates of any future costs after FY 2020/21 (if applicable). These figures are added to show the total cost of the project.

The historic, current and future cost figures are provided by the Florida Department of Transportation for the federal and state funded projects and by local governments and agencies for locally funded projects. For those projects for which the historic or future costs are not known, the spaces for the historic or future and total cost figures are shown as "TBD" (to be determined).

Each project in the TIP that is specifically listed in the MetroPlan Orlando's 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) has a reference showing the LRTP page that provides the information necessary to locate the full project cost estimate and/or additional details regarding the project in the LRTP. The link to the LRTP is http://www.metroplanorlando.com/plans/long-range-transportation-plan/.

The projects in the TIP include projects on the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS). The SIS is a network of high priority transportation facilities which include interstate highways, major toll roads and other designated highways, as well as the state's largest and most significant commercial service airports, deep-water seaports, freight rail terminals, passenger rail and intercity bus terminals, rail corridors, waterways and the spaceport. Each project on the SIS will have a SIS identifier (*SIS Project*) in the far-left column on the TIP spreadsheet on which the project is located.

XIV. Federal Obligated Funds

In order to meet federal requirements for MPOs, MetroPlan Orlando annually publishes a list of transportation projects for which federal funds were obligated during the preceding federal fiscal year (October 1st through September 30th). 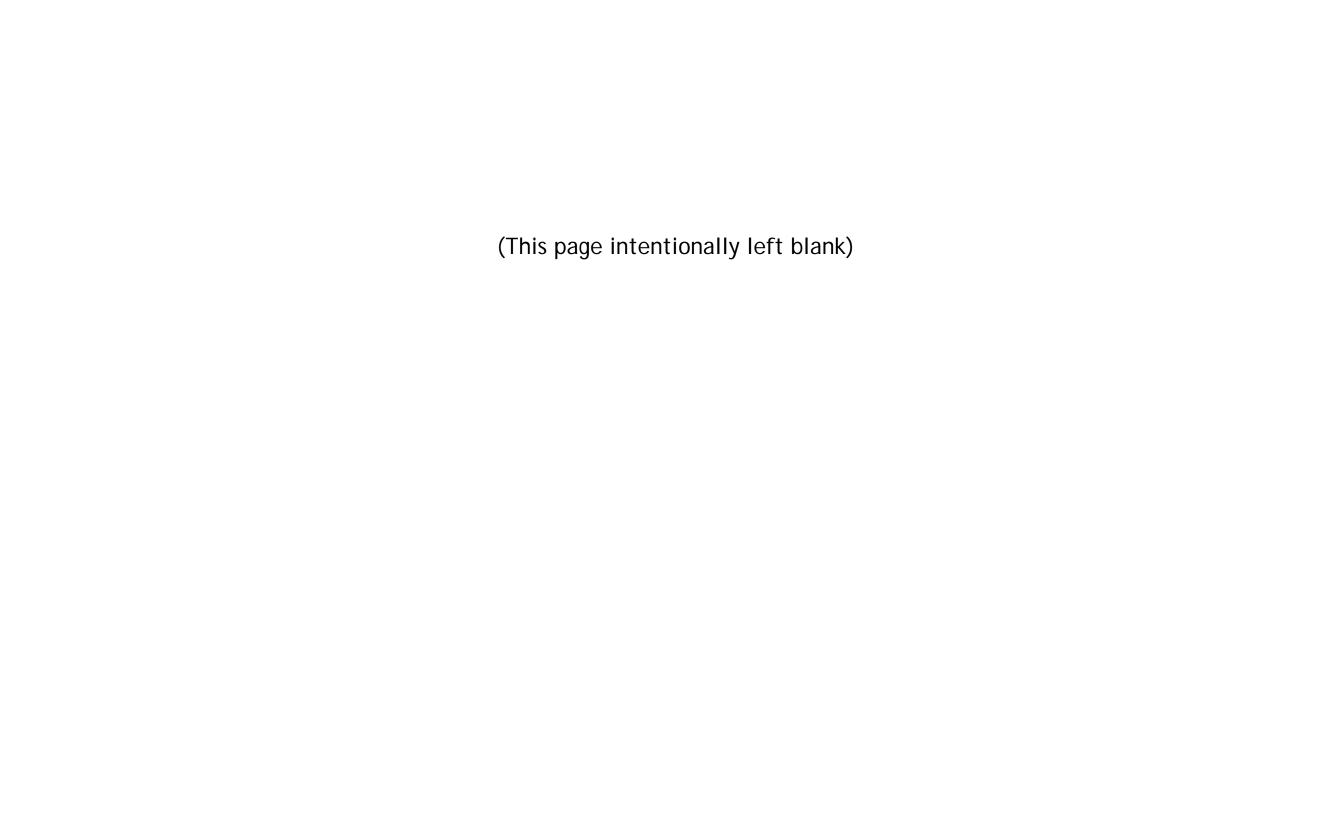

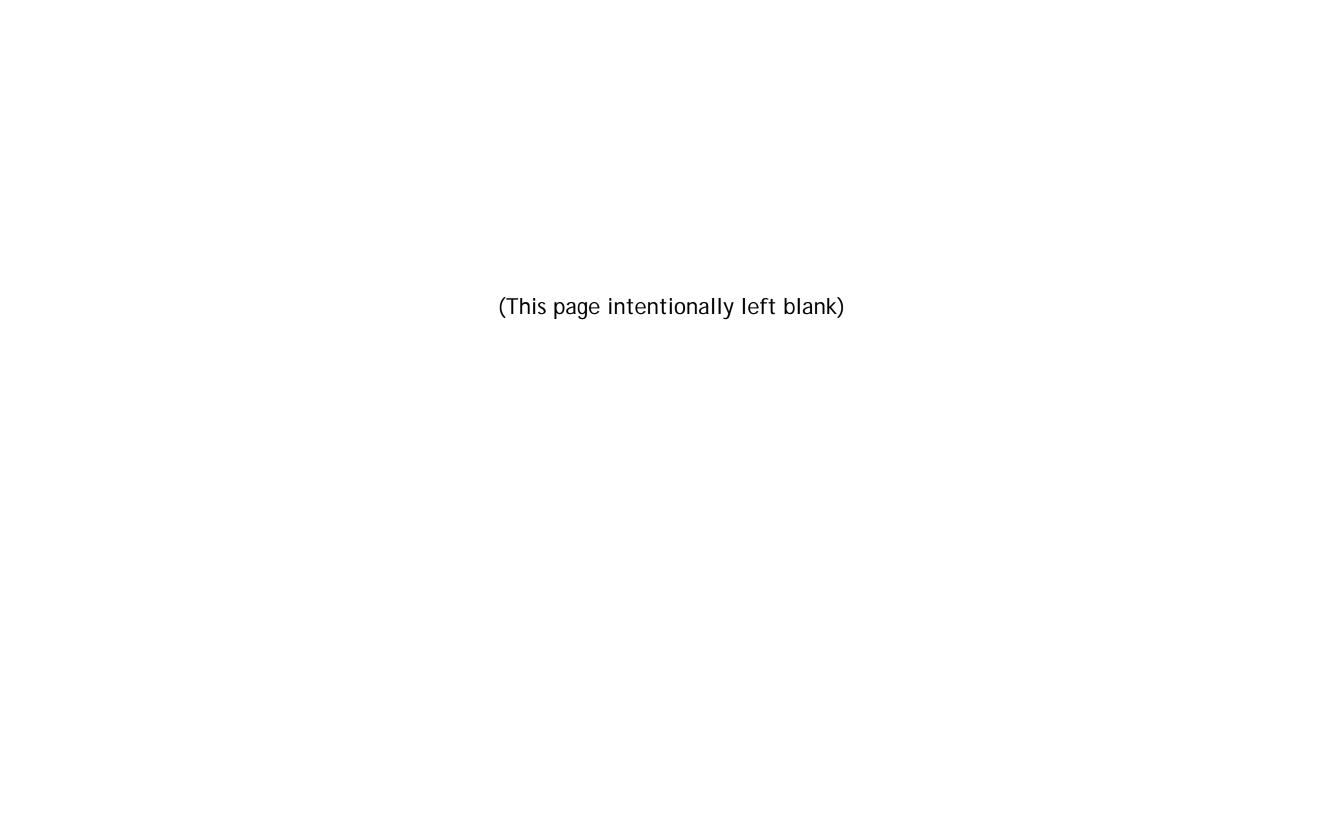

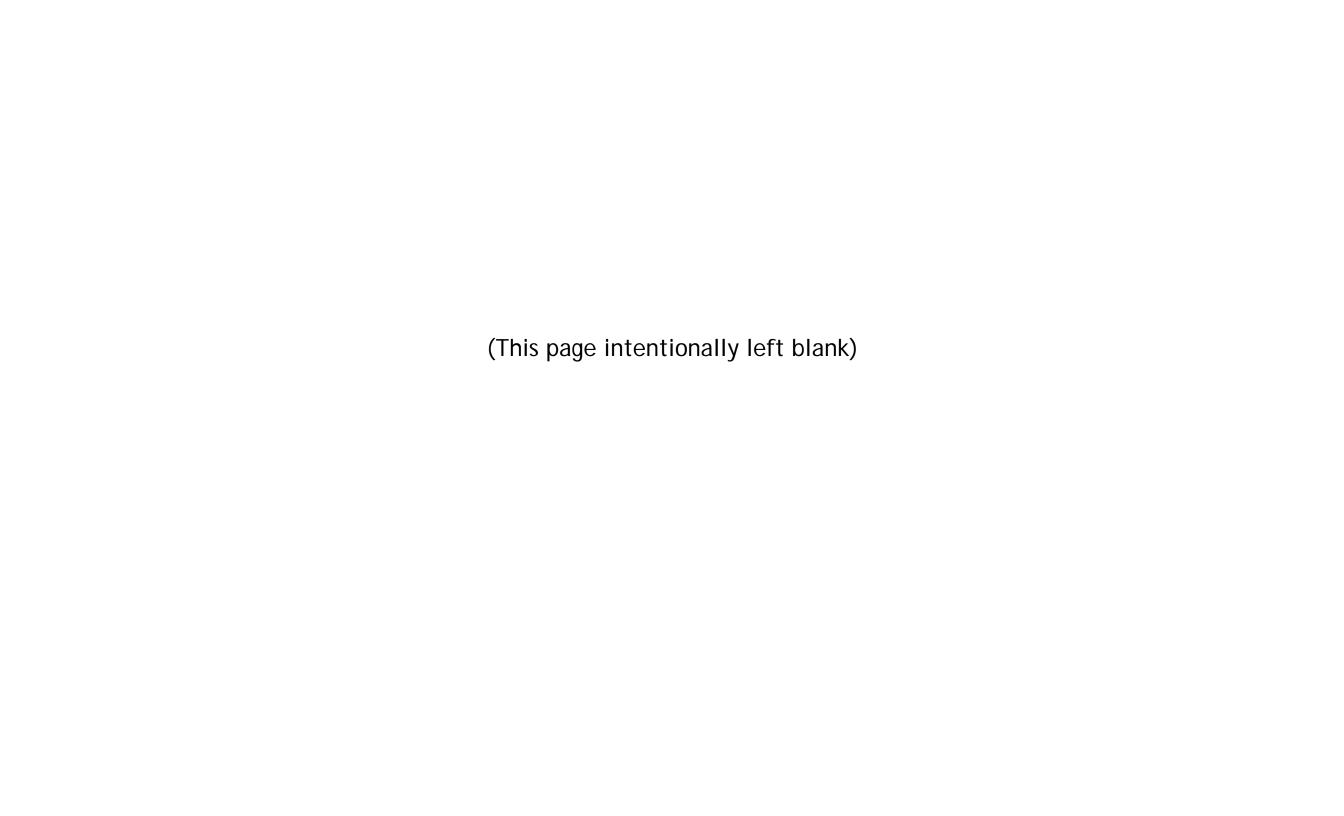

- PedSafe, an innovative pedestrian and bicycle collision avoidance system that utilizes Connected Vehicle (CV) technologies to reduce the occurrence of pedestrian and bicycle crashes at high crash rate locations. Connections to existing traffic signal systems will provide information on phasing changes along with pedestrian detection at each intersection to manage potential conflicts and congestion within the PedSafe area;
- GreenWay Program is designed to increase throughput capacity and reduce congestion
 by optimizing traffic signal operations with the implementation of new technologies.
 Data managed in the proposed program SunStore will be leveraged by GreenWay to
 support real time operation through a regional Decision Support System (DSS) with
 strategic planning for special events that will provide unified approach to system

The Pine Hills Trail Phase 3 and Clarcona-Ocoee Trail projects will help close the gaps in the Coast-to-Coast Trail system within the MetroPlan Orlando area. As a result, MetroPlan Orlando considers these to be high-priority projects, and has placed these projects at the top of the bicycle & pedestrian section of the PPL without priority numbers, since they are candidates for special funding that could become available and will <u>not</u> be competing for SU funds with the other projects on the list.

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② MetroPlan Orlando's policy for Safe Routes to School projects is that 20% of the share of Surface Transportation Program (SU) funds for bicycle & pedestrian projects and Transportation Alternative (TALU) funds be set aside each year for these projects. The TAC has recommended that the Safe Routes to School projects be ranked separately since there is a specific federal funding category for these projects. The statewide and district-wide TALU funds are directed toward regionally significant trail projects.

This is the list of highway, Transportation Systems Management & Operations (TSMO), bicycle and pedestrian, transit and TRIP projects from the FY 2020/21-2039/40 Prioritized Project List (PPL) that was adopted in May 2015. These project lists were updated in May 2016 to highlight those projects that have had new phases funded by FDOT in the FY 2016/17-2020/21 Tentative Five Year Work Program or by local jurisdictions. New phases funded for those projects since last year's PPL are shown in *bold italic*. This updated list was developed for the purpose of providing a starting point for developing the list of projects to be included in the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List.

The figures shown in the Estimated Remaining Cost column for the highway projects are present-day cost estimates provided by FDOT.

The PPL is normally adopted by the MetroPlan Orlando Board each year in September and submitted to FDOT no later than October 1st. However, due to the early start for the 2016 Florida legislative session, the PPL was on an accelerated schedule in 2015 and was adopted by the board on May 13, 2015 and was submitted to FDOT.

Note: The BPAC recommends that 20% of MetroPlan Orlando's set-aside of Surface Transportation Program (SU) funds for bicycle & pedestrian projects and Transportation Alternative (TALU) funds be set aside each year for Safe Routes to School projects (#1-6). The BPAC also recommends that statewide and district-wide TALU funds be directed toward regionally significant trail projects.

The Pine Hills Trail Phase 3 and Clarcona-Ocoee Trail projects will help close the gaps in the Coast-to-Coast Trail system within the MetroPlan Orlando area. As a result, the BPAC considers these to be high-priority projects, and is recommending that these projects be placed at the top of the bicycle & pedestrian section of the PPL without priority numbers, since they are candidates for special funding that could become available, and will <u>not</u> be competing for SU funds with the other projects on the list.

Note: For funding equity purposes regarding TRIP funds, MetroPlan Orlando's policy is that, for any TRIP funding allocation for the MetroPlan Orlando area in FY 2015/16, each of the three counties will receive a percentage of the allocation based on population percentages, with Orange County receiving 64%, Seminole County receiving 21.3% and Osceola County receiving 14.7%. Each of the counties will then set aside 22% of their TRIP funding allocations for LYNX projects. If MetroPlan Orlando receives a TRIP funding allocation in FY 2015/16, Orange County's share of those funds will be used for the SR 528/Innovation Way interchange project (ranked #1 on the list) and the other projects on the TRIP list will remain in their current priorities as shown on the list. However, if MetroPlan Orlando does not receive any TRIP funds in FY 2015/16, and the SR 528/Innovation Way interchange project is funded through construction with funding categories other than TRIP funds and moves off the list, Orange County's next priority, the 4-laning of Boggy Creek Road from Simmons Road to SR 417 (ranked #5 on the list), will move up to the #1 priority on the TRIP list, since Orange County has not had any projects funded with TRIP funds since FY 2008/09. For FY 2016/17 and beyond, MetroPlan Orlando's TRIP funding allocation will not be divided into percentages for the counties, and the projects on the TRIP list will be funded based on priority and the availability of TRIP funds and local matching funds.
