B. Approval of FDOT Amendment to FY2016/17-2020/21 Transportation Improvement (Tab 6) Program (TIP) and Board Resolution No. 16-17 Pertaining to SunRail

(ROLL CALL VOTE REQUIRED)

Ms. Nicola Liquori, SunRail Executive Director, is requesting Board approval for the FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP to be amended to include funding for the SunRail system from FY2017/18 through FY 2020/21. More detailed information is provided at Tab 6. (Please note that the FY 2016/17 funds were approved by the MetroPlan Orlando Board in an emergency TIP amendment at the September 14, 2016 Board meeting.) Mr. Jamil Gutierrez, FDOT, is requesting Board approval for the FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP to be amended to include additional funding for several trail projects in the area as described in the letter at Tab 7. This additional funding is through the SUN Trail program that was approved by the Florida Legislature. Additional information on the first round of disbursements is also provided at Tab 7. Board approval is requested of Resolution No. 16-18 at Tab 7.

D. Inclusion of SR 417 Express Toll Lanes in MetroPlan Orlando's FY 2016/17-2020/21 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

(ROLL CALL VOTE REQUIRED)

The Board approved MetroPlan Orlando's FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP at the July 13, 2016 meeting but tabled action on one project – FM #4379521. This project provides two variable toll express lanes in each direction on SR 417 in Seminole County from SR 434 to north of CR 427 (which is owned and operated by Florida's Turnpike Enterprise); \$1.5 million in design funding was programmed for this project in FY 2018/19.

Staff modified the format of the TIP for clarity purposes to provide a separate section for toll road projects. These pages (VI-1 through VI-7) are provided at Tab 8. Page VI-1 notes that toll road projects funded by toll revenue by Florida's Turnpike Enterprise and the Central Florida Expressway Authority are not subject to approval by the MetroPlan Orlando Board; however, they must be shown in the TIP for information purposes based on federal law and state statutes. This is consistent with the opinion of MetroPlan Orlando's General Counsel that was discussed at the July 13, 2016 Board meeting. Page VI-4 was annotated per the Board-approved motion to state that Board action on FM #4379521 (the aforementioned SR 417 project) was tabled.

After reviewing the Board minutes from the July 13, 2016 meeting, there are several follow-up items the Board may wish to discuss:

- Several members felt more Board discussion was warranted on the express lane concept (which has been referred to as a toll within a toll) as being implemented by Florida's Turnpike Enterprise. The Seminole County Board of County Commissioners has taken a position that they are opposed to the toll within a toll concept. The Board may wish to take a position on this which could be conveyed to the FDOT Secretary.
- 2. One Board member felt that action taken by Florida's Turnpike Enterprise was inconsistent with procedures included in the Florida Administrative Code. Florida's Turnpike Enterprise officials indicate that their projects comply with all applicable state regulations.
- 3. Several Board members wanted to know how the incremental revenue from the express lane concept would be used. A suggestion was made that these funds should be used for improving transit service, as is being done in South Florida. In response, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise officials have stated that all revenue and bond proceeds from the Turnpike System received by FDOT shall be used only for the cost of Turnpike projects and Turnpike improvements and for the administration, operation, maintenance, and financing of the Turnpike System. No revenues or bond proceeds from the Turnpike System shall be spent for the operation, maintenance, construction or financing of any project which is not part of the Turnpike system. 95 Express in South Florida is not part of the Turnpike System, but is a FDOT/District 6 facility.

The <u>action requested</u> is for the Board to approve the recommendation that staff be authorized to remove the annotation "Action Tabled" from project FM #4379521 on page VI-4 of the FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP.

In addition, it should be noted that the express lane project on SR 417 from north of CR 427 to north of Rinehart Road (FM #4379531) has \$1,000 in PKYI funds for design that rolled forward from FY 2015/16 to FY 2016/17. This project is included in the list of roll-over projects in the TIP amendment letter at agenda item IX-A.

E. Approval and Acceptance of the Annual Financial Report and Audit

Mr. William Blend, CPA from Moore Stephens Lovelace, P.A. will present their Audit Report and the Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016. I. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Scott Boyd welcomed members and Mayor Pat Bates led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Commissioner Scott Boyd called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and welcomed everyone. Ms. Beverly Hoagland, Chief Executive Officer of the Osceola Council on Aging welcomed everyone and provided a historic overview on the mission and work of the organization. Commissioner Cheryl Grieb reported on the CFMPOA and the West Central Florida Chairs Coordinating Committee meeting held on July 15, 2016. Commissioner Lee Constantine reported on the TDLCB meeting held on August 11, 2016.

III. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Harry Barley, recognized the following special guests: Kissimmee City Commissioner Jose Alvarez and incoming City of Kissimmee Commissioner Jim Fisher; Mr. Don Fisher, Osceola County Manager; Mr. Mike Steigerwald, Kissimmee City Manager and Mr. Joe Helfenberger, St. Cloud City Manager. He also welcomed Ms. Mary Moskowitz (TAC Vice-Chairman) and noted that Ms. Andrea Ostrodka, TAC Chairman, resigned from LYNX last month. He recognized Mayor Pat Bates who received the Florida League of Cities Lifetime Achievement Award, and recognized staff members: Ms. Cynthia Lambert, Ms. Mary Ann Horne and Ms. Susan Ennis on receiving two Florida Public Relations Association Awards. Mr. Barley provided an update on the Corrine Drive project noting that staff has accepted a request from Orange County, City of Orlando and the City of Winter Park to take the lead on the Corrine Drive project; this will allow staff an opportunity to test the proposed Complete Streets policy. Mr. Barley provided a follow-up on the Federal Notice of Proposed Rulemaking discussion that had taken place at the NARC conference held in June. The proposed rules would require that multiple MPO's in contiguous urbanized areas be merged or would have their required documents such as LRTP's and TIP's merged. Under this proposal MetroPlan Orlando and the Lake-Sumter MPO may need to merge and/or merge their required documents. Several letters referencing the Federal Notice of Proposed Rulemaking proposal were provided in members' agenda workbooks. He also announced the September 29th Central Florida Commuter Rail Commission meeting to be hosted by MetroPlan Orlando at 10:00 a.m.

IV. CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Lena Tolliver confirmed a quorum of 15 voting members present. Also present were 5 advisors; and the meeting having been duly convened was ready to proceed with business.

V. AGENDA REVIEW

Mr. Barley reported that FDOT request approval of an emergency TIP Amendment for Board approval on today. The request involves funding for SunRail and more information to be provided under agenda item: IX. A. 2. FDOT Emergency TIP Amendment and Resolution No. 16-15.

Commissioner Bob Dallari moved approval to take action on FDOT's request for approval of the Emergency TIP Amendment and Resolution No. 16-15 at IX. A. 2. Mayor Gary Bruhn seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mr. Tom O'Hanlon reported on the August 24, 2016 Community Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting where the CAC recommended approval of FDOT's administrative amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program for the intersection improvement at SR 434 and Winding Hollow Boulevard; the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List (PPL) and the final ranking of the CFMPOA PPL.

Mayor Gary Bruhn reported on the September 8, 2016 Municipal Advisory Committee (MAC) meeting where the committee approved changes to its bylaws presented for Board approval. MAC recommended approval to ratify the FDOT administrative amendment to the FY 2015/16-2019/20

and 2016/17-2020/21 TIP regarding funding changes for the intersection improvement project at SR 434 and Winding Hollow Boulevard as requested by FDOT. The MAC also recommended approval of the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List (PPL) and the final ranking of the CFMPOA PPL.

Ms. Mary Moskowitz reported on the August 26, 2016 Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting where the committee recommended approval to ratify the FDOT administrative amendment to the FY 2015/16-2019/20 and 2016/17-2020/21 TIP regarding funding changes for the intersection improvement project at SR 434 and Winding Hollow Boulevard as requested by FDOT. The TAC also recommended approval of the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List (PPL) and the final ranking of the CFMPOA PPL. Ms. Moskowitz also reported that since Ms. Andrea Ostrodka has resigned from LYNX and is no longer the TAC Chairman, TAC appointed an officer selection subcommittee to select candidates for Chairman and Vice-Chairman for the remainder of 2016 and all of 2017. In addition, TAC also appointed a Task Force to reevaluate the prioritization criteria to be used to rank the bicycle and pedestrian projects in the PPL next year.

Mr. Corey Quinn reported on the August 26, 2016 Transportation Systems Management & Operations (TSMO) Advisory Committee meeting where the committee recommended approval to ratify the FDOT administrative amendment to the FY 2015/16-2019/20 and 2016/17-2020/21 TIP regarding funding changes for the intersection improvement project at SR 434 and Winding Hollow Boulevard as requested by FDOT. The TSMO Advisory Committee also recommended approval of the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List (PPL) and the final ranking of the CFMPOA PPL.

The Board's Personnel Committee currently consists of the Board Chairman, the Vice Chairman, the Immediate-Past Chairman and one additional Board member appointed by the Board. Approval was requested to revise our Internal Operating Procedures (Section VI, paragraph (1)(b)) to include the Board's Secretary-Treasurer as a member of the Personnel Committee. The Board's Personnel Committee met on August 30, 2016 and recommended Board approval of this change.

D. Approval of Proposed Revisions to MetroPlan Orlando's Personnel Manual

The Board's Personnel Committee met on August 30, 2016 and reviewed proposed changes to the organization's Personnel Manual. A number of provisions were discussed and Committee members also recommended some additional revisions that were provided in members' agenda workbooks. The Board's Personnel Committee recommended approval. In addition, the Personnel Committee recommended that (1) staff investigate establishing a sick leave bank policy and (2) the Personnel Manual be reviewed every two years with updates recommended to the Board for approval.

E. Renewal/Extension of Executive Director's Employment Agreement

The Board's Personnel Committee met on August 30, 2016. One of the agenda items was the renewal of the Executive Director's Employment Agreement. The current agreement with Mr. Barley goes through March 10, 2018. The Agreement automatically renews each year and adds an additional year to the term unless notice of non-renewal is provided by October 1. Rather than this being an "automatic" action, Mr. Barley has always requested an affirmative action be taken by the Board (and himself) to extend the Agreement. The Personnel Committee generally discusses this subject in August and makes a recommendation to the Board in September. Mr. Barley informed the Personnel Committee of his plans to separate/retire on August 31, 2018. He will be 70 years old at that time. In addition, he has a family medical situation that will require him to spend more time as a caregiver by then. As a result, the Personnel Committee recommended that our current Agreement with Mr. Barley be extended through August 31, 2018 rather than being renewed for another term. In addition, the Personnel Committee recommended Board approval of a number of related actions pertaining to the Agreement with Mr. Barley and transition planning that were provided as a separate document.

F. Approval of Budget Amendment #1 (FDOT Amendment 1)

Approval was requested of Budget Amendment #1 (FDOT Amendment 1) to roll forward FTA X009-00 and X010-00 grants and to add expenditures and cash carryforward to reconcile; to adjust the TD grant and the WISE grant from estimated budgets to actual; to carry forward funds from FY'16 for completion of the MetroPlan Orlando website; and to add additional local funds for transit corridor work being completed for FDOT. Additional information was provided.

G. Approval of Graphic Design Contract

Approval was requested to award a three year contract with two, one-year renewals to Popcorn Initiative for graphic design services. A request for quotes was advertised in July and a selection committee of two MetroPlan Orlando staff members and one outside advisor scored and ranked the eleven proposals received, based on pre-determined criteria. Projects will be individually scoped as work is needed within the budget approved by the board. A scoring summary was provided.

H. Approval of Video Production Services Contract

Approval was requested to award a three year contract with two, one-year renewals to Digital Brew for video production services. A request for quotes was advertised in July and a selection committee of two MetroPlan Orlando staff members and one outside advisor scored and ranked the three proposals received, based on pre-determined criteria. Projects will be individually scoped as work is needed within the budget approved by the board. A scoring summary was provided.

I. Approval of Revisions to Municipal Advisory Committee Bylaws

At their June meeting, the Municipal Advisory Committee appointed a Task Force to review and recommend necessary changes to the committee's bylaws. The task force met on July 7, 2016 and submitted recommendations to the full MAC. These changes include:

- 1. Changing the term of the MAC officers from one year to two years,
- 2. Eliminating the 2nd Vice Chair seat effective July 2017,
- 3. Allowing for the immediate-past Chairperson to serve as alternate on the MetroPlan Orlando board in the event both officers are unavailable, and
- 4. Changing the election of officers' cycle to every other year.

Board approval of the revised bylaws was requested, a copy of the revised bylaws was provided.

J. Approval of CFMPOA Interlocal Agreement

A review of the Central Florida MPO Alliance Interlocal Agreement has necessitated updates that require approval by each respective Board. The update incorporates changes that have occurred since the Interlocal Agreement was first adopted in 2005, as well as revisions made by resolution in 2012. These changes include organizational names and address changes, changes to legal advertisements and posting notice requirements, Executive Director voting, annual member contributions, and the inclusion of the expanded metropolitan planning area of the River to Sea TPO. Each respective MPO is asked to adopt the recommended changes and designate a member to sign the agreement at the October CFMPOA meeting. Staff requested approval of the Amended and Restated Interlocal Agreement and designation of Commissioner Scott Boyd, CFMPOA Chair, to sign the agreement on behalf of the MetroPlan Orlando Board, a copy of which was provided.

K. Approval of "Put the Brakes on Fatalities Day" Resolution No. 16-13

The sixteenth annual "Put the Brakes on Fatalities Day" will be held on, October 10, 2016 in communities across the country. This is a national initiative that focuses on reducing the number of highway fatalities by improving our roadways, our vehicles and driver behavior. The goal is to unite the country to achieve one full day of zero traffic deaths by promoting safer highways and encouraging safer behavior. In support of this national campaign and recognizing that safety is one of the Board's top priorities, approval was requested of Resolution No. 16-13 declaring October 10, 2016 as "Put the Brakes on Fatalities Day" in the Orlando metropolitan area. A copy of Resolution No. 16-13 was provided.

L. Approval of Blind Equality Act Resolution No. 16-14

In 1964, Congress passed a resolution allowing former President Lyndon Johnson to proclaim October 15 to be "White Cane Safety Day." Besides serving as a national observance, it enables us to celebrate the achievements of people who are blind or visually impaired and the important symbol of blindness and a tool of independence, the white cane. In 2011, "White Cane Safety Day" was named "Blind Americans Equality Day" by President Barack Obama. Approval was requested of Resolution No. 16-14 declaring October 15, 2016 as "Blind Americans Equality Day" in the Orlando metropolitan area. A copy of Resolution No. 16-14 was provided.

M. Approval of Contribution to the University of Central Florida Foundation

Approval was requested to make a contribution of \$5,000 to the University of Central Florida Foundation to support the Distinguished Lecture Series sponsored by the Master's Program in Urban & Regional Planning at the University of Central Florida. This series consists of two or three lectures each academic year featuring prominent scholars, speakers and authors on topics being emphasized in the curriculum. The target audience is students, faculty members and practitioners but events are open to the general public as well. Funds have been provided for this purpose in our approved FY2016/2017 budget.

N. Approval of State Lobbying Contract

The Board approved a three year contract, with two options to renew for an additional year each, with William J. Peebles, P.A. for Florida State Government Relations Services effective November 1, 2012, subject to annual renewals at the sole discretion of the Board. The first year of the contract stipulated an annual fee of \$60,000 plus travel expenses approved in advance by the Executive Director. Authority to extend the contract into its second and third years was approved by the Board on September 11, 2013 and September 10, 2014. The execution of the first one-year renewal option was exercised in September 2015. Authority was requested to exercise the final one-year renewal option effective November 1, 2016 at the same rate, plus travel under F.S. 112.061 and other expenses as approved in advance by the Executive Director. Funds are in our approved FY2016/2017 budget to cover this expense.

O. Approval to Host the 2018 NARC Annual Conference of Regions

The National Association of Regional Councils (NARC) is a national membership organization for metropolitan planning organizations, regional councils, economic development entities and other regional enterprises. Commissioner Dallari is currently serving as NARC's Executive Vice President. NARC holds a number of conferences each year with the largest being its Annual Conference of Regions. Board approval was requested to submit a proposal for hosting this Conference in the June-July time frame in 2018. We are a very popular location with an outstanding national reputation so we should be in a very good position to be chosen. Hosting this event will require a commitment of staff time and securing sponsorships to ensure the event's financial success. We plan to meet the goal through private sponsorships. Any change in this would require separate approval by the MetroPlan Orlando Board.

P. Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board (TDLCB) Travel Authorization

Authorization was requested for Commissioner Clarke, Commissioner Constantine and Commissioner Harford, whom all serve on the TDLCB, to attend the Florida Public Transportation Association and the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged Annual Training and Workshop December 11 through December 14, 2016 in Jacksonville. In the event one or more of the officers are unable to attend, authorization was requested to extend invitations to other currently serving TDLCB volunteers. Funds are available in our approved FY2016/2017 budget.

MOTION: Commissioner Bob Dallari moved approval of the Consent Agenda Items: A-P. Mayor Jim Swan seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

IX. OTHER ACTION ITEMS

A. 1. Approval to Ratify FDOT TIP Administrative Amendment & Resolution No. 16-12

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested approval on behalf of FDOT to ratify an administrative amendment to the FY 2015/16-2019/20 and 2016/17-2020/21 TIP regarding funding changes for the intersection improvement project at SR 434 and Winding Hollow Boulevard. Due to the emergency nature of this administrative amendment, the Chairman of the MetroPlan Orlando Board approved the amendment on July 13, 2016 in order for FDOT to be able to allocate the funds for the project in a timely manner. The letter requesting the amendment that was signed by the Board Chairman and Resolution No. 16-12 was provided.

MOTION:

Mayor Jim Swan moved approval to Ratify FDOT TIP Administrative Amendment & Resolution No. 16-12. Commissioner Bob Dallari seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. Roll Call Conducted.

2. Approval of FDOT Emergency Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment to the FY 2015/16-2019/20 & FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP & Resolution No. 16-15

(Addendum to the Agenda was provided electronically in advance of the meeting, and a copy was provided at the meeting)

FDOT requested that this TIP amendment be approved by the MetroPlan Orlando Board on an emergency basis in order to be consistent with the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), as required by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). A copy of the letter of request from FDOT and Resolution No. 16-15 was provided.

Mr. Barley reported that late last week staff received a request from FDOT for an emergency TIP amendment for SunRail funding. The emergency nature of the request involved federal funds that needs to be programmed before the end of the federal fiscal year which is September 30, 2016. He noted that the TIP amendment is necessary in order to avoid jeopardizing funding for the SunRail projects in FY 2016/2017. Mr. Barley recommended that the resolution be amended to reflect only the two projects that fall within the current FY 2016/2017 and he requested authorization for the Chairman to sign the modified resolution. Mr. Barley noted that this recommendation would allow sufficient time for staff to coordinate efforts with FDOT on getting a clearer funding picture for SunRail projects in FY 2017/18, FY 2018/19, FY 2019/20 and FY 2020/21 to be brought back to the Board for approval on November 9, 2016. Mr. Barley also reported that this amendment request did not go through the advisory committee approval process because of its emergency status; however the next approval request will allow the required time for the advisory committee approval process.

Mr. Barley requested approval to modify Resolution No. 16-15 reflecting only the following two projects and authorization for the Chairman to sign the resolution:

- FM #4129946 Central Florida Commuter Rail System Purchase of Vehicle Parts for Phase II South Funding consists of \$294,998 in Development Federal Transit Administration (DFTA) funds, \$147,499 in New Start Transit Program (NSTP) funds, and \$147,499 in Local Funds (LF) in FY 2016/17;
- FM #4129948 Central Florida Commuter Rail System Operations and Maintenance -Funding consists of: FY 2016/17 - \$16,538,940 in Development Federal Transit

Administration (DFTA) funds, \$6,700,000 in District Interstate (DI) funds, \$1,014 in Strategic Intermodal System (DIS) funds, \$10,096,639 in State 100% Public Transportation (DPTO) funds, \$17,104,799 in District Allocation (DS) funds, \$18,165 in Local Funds (LF), \$6,491,270 in Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) funds, and \$6,491,271 in SunRail Revenues for Operations and Maintenance (SROM) funds.

MOTION:

Commissioner Bob Dallari moved approval of the FDOT Emergency Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment to the FY 2015/16-2019/20 & FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP as recommended to include modifications to Resolution No. 16-15 and authorization of the Chairman's signature. Mayor Teresa Jacobs seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. Roll Call Conducted

Commissioner Dallari informed Mr. Frank O'Dea, FDOT that approval of the emergency TIP Amendment request was given in good faith and that moving forward FDOT should consider the vetting schedule and process for MetroPlan Orlando when requesting TIP Amendments.

B. Approval of FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List (PPL)

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested approval of the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List (PPL). This document included a list of highway, Transportation Systems Management and Operations, bicycle and pedestrian, and transit projects that have been ranked in order of priority. FDOT will use the PPL in developing their FY 2017/18-2021/22 Five Year Work Program. The Prioritized Project List was approved by all Advisory Committees.

Note: Following the preview of the new PPL at the June/July committee and Board meetings, the Florida Legislature directed that \$2 million in TRIP funds be programmed for the design of the New Oxford Road extension and reconstruction project in Seminole County in FY 2016/17. As a result, FDOT requested that this project be added to the list of TRIP projects in the PPL, and the project has been added as #26 in the list of TRIP projects.

In addition, FDOT set aside \$13.6 million in DDR funds in FY 2020/21 in the Five Year Work Program/TIP for the operation of premium transit projects in the PPL in accordance with the policy adopted by the MetroPlan Orlando Board. The original intent was to use these funds for the US 192 Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) and North-South Lymmo projects. However, since neither of these projects will be ready to use the DDR funds in FY 2020/21, FDOT will be submitting a TIP amendment at the October/November committee and Board meetings for these funds to be programmed for another project in the PPL that will be identified at those meetings.

MOTION:

Mayor Bruhn moved approval of the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List. Commissioner Viviana Janer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

C. Approval of CFMPOA Prioritized Project List

Ms. Virginia Whittington, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested approval of the Central Florida MPO Alliance (CFMPOA) Prioritized Project List, which included a list of highway, trail and transit projects that are of regional significance. The list was approved as a draft in July pending final ranking of the Regional Trails Priority List. A copy of the priorities was provided.

MOTION:

Commissioner Samuel Ings moved approval of the CFMPOA Prioritized Project List. Commissioner Jennifer Thompson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

B. Presentation on SR 408 Extension PD&E Study

Mr. Will Sloup, Metric Engineering, gave a presentation on the CFX PD&E study for the eastern extension of SR 408 from the existing eastern terminus of SR 408 to SR 520.

Mayor Jacobs expressed that there are challenges with the preferred alignment and noted the need for the project. She reported that an option is for the project to become a state project, rather than a CFX project, which might reduce some of the hurdles and meeting the need is more important than which agency takes on the project. Mayor Jacobs, Commissioner Dallari and Commissioner Hawkins expressed the need for the project to be a regional project and for all agencies involved to work in a collaborative effort.

Mr. Dean Asher requested that a copy of the presentation shown be provided to members. Commissioner Boyd thanked Mayor Jacobs for her leadership and support for this project. Commissioner Thompson expressed that the SR 408 project should be a regional priority and that the current board membership is equipped with institutional knowledge of the project. She encouraged a resolution of the SR 408 Extension issues before the Board membership changes due to term limits.

Mr. Tom O'Hanlon asked about whether conditions at SR 434/ SR 50 East would be improved with the SR 408 Extension. Commissioner Boyd asked that staff follow-up with Mr. O'Hanlon.

XII. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Board members expressed appreciation to the Osceola Council on Aging for hosting the MetroPlan Orlando Board meeting.

Commissioner Constantine reported that the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council will be moving their office to the LYNX building in downtown Orlando. This will be a cost savings move for the taxpayers.

Mr. Barley thanked Ms. Pat Devillers, Kissimmee Gateway Airport for her assistance with preparing for today's meeting. An invitation to take a tour of the Osceola Council on Aging was extended to everyone.

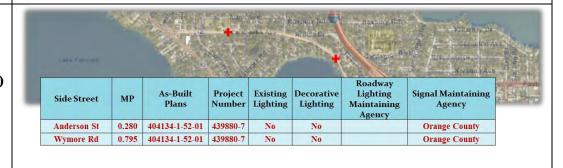

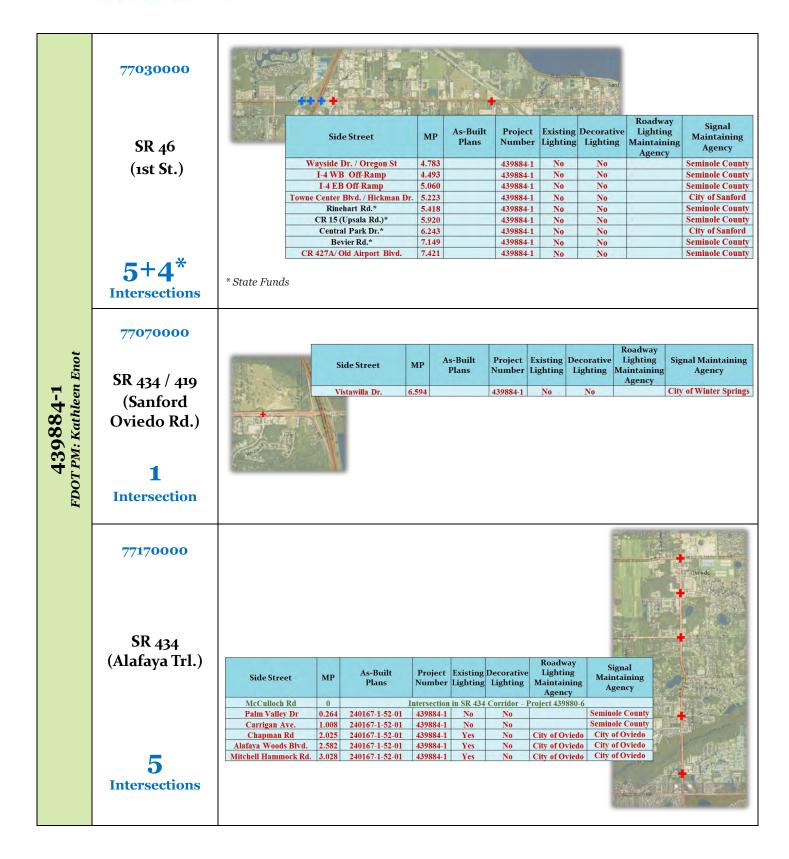

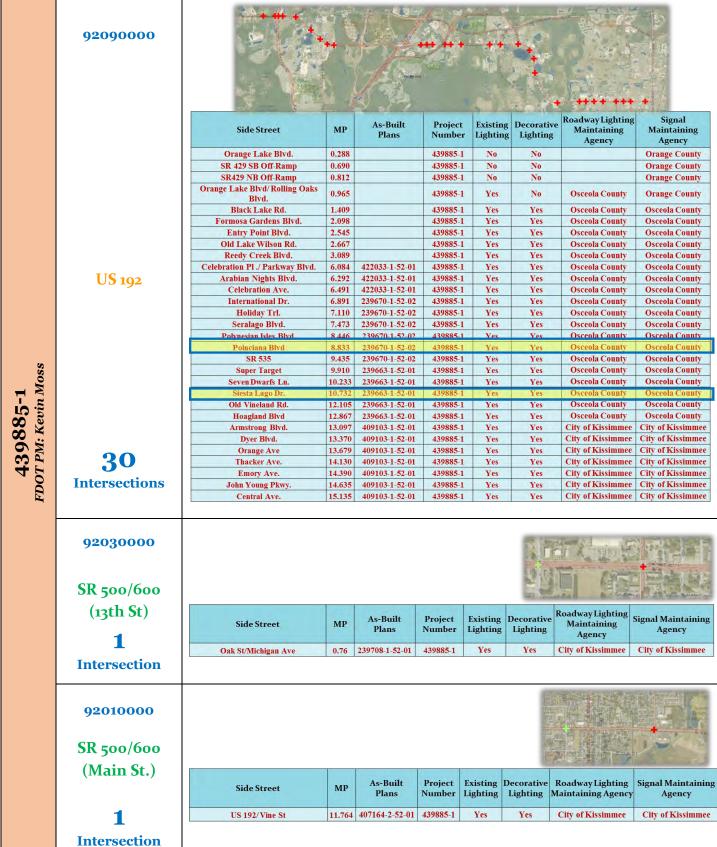

RELATIONSHIP OF FLORIDA TURNPIKE ENTERPRISE PROJECTS

TO MetroPlan ORLANDO TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT

PROGRAM (TIP)

This will enumerate the Florida statutes and provisions of the federal law which pertain to the relationship of Florida Turnpike Enterprise Projects and the requirement for those projects to be included in the MetroPlan TIP.

1. The Florida Statutes which pertain to Florida Turnpike Enterprise projects are as follows:

Section 338.22 et. seq., the "Florida Turnpike Enterprise Law" provides:

Section 338.22 (1) No governmental entity other than the Department may acquire, construct, maintain or operate the turnpike system subsequent to the enactment of this law, except upon specific authorization of the Legislature.

Section 338.223(1)(b) Turnpike projects that add capacity, alter access, affect feeder roads, or affect the operation of the local transportation system shall be included in the transportation improvement plan of the affected metropolitan planning organization.

2. Federal law that is pertinent is as follows:

23 U.S.C. 134 and 49 U.S.C. 5303 (the Federal Transit Acts) of the federal statutes establish metropolitan planning organizations and authorize the promulgation of regulations. 23 C.F.R. Section 450.326 dealing with TIP requirements provides in subsection (f) the TIP shall contain "all regionally significant projects requiring an action by the FHWA or the FTA whether or not the projects are to be funded under title 23 U.S.C. Chapter 1 and 2 or Title 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 (e.g. addition of an interchange to the interstate system with State, local and/or private funds if designated projects not funded under 23 U.S.C. or 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53). For public information and conformity purposes the TIP shall include all regionally significant projects proposed to be funded with federal funds other than those measured by the FHWA or the FTA as well as all regionally significant projects to be funded with non-federal funds.

3. Section 339.175 Florida Statutes pertains to metropolitan planning organizations. Section 339.175(8) provides that an MPO shall in cooperation with the State develop a TIP.

Section 339.175(8)(d) provides that projects included in the transportation improvement program and that have advanced to the design stage of preliminary engineering may be removed from or rescheduled in a subsequent transportation improvement program only by joint action of the MPO and the department.

It may appear that this statute provides an opportunity for the MetroPlan Board to remove a project from the TIP which has not advanced to the design stage of preliminary engineering without the consent of the department. However, to be consistent with section 338.223 and in accordance with the principle of *in pari materia*, a rule of statutory construction which says that the laws of the same matter and on the same subject must be construed with reference to each other so as to promote uniformity and predictability, Section 339.175(8)(d) should be construed so as to not apply to Florida Turnpike Enterprise projects but only to other projects in the TIP.

Conclusion: The MetroPlan Orlando TIP must include all Florida Turnpike Enterprise Projects. These may be shown as for informational purposes only.

Dear Mr. Bechtel:

This letter has been revised and supersedes my prior letter of September 13, 2016. I have reviewed your July 25, 2016 memorandum to the Executive Director of MetroPlan Orlando concerning whether the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and MetroPlan Orlando have the authority acting jointly to remove Florida Turnpike Enterprise projects from the MetroPlan Orlando TIP. The issue has arisen in connection with the proposal to add express lanes to SR 417. Currently, there are four segments of widening (express lane) projects by the Turnpike on SR 417 listed in the FDOT Five Year Work Program. They are:

Segment 1 Item Number: 429335-1

From: County line
To: Aloma Avenue

Segment 2 Item Number: 417545-1

From: Aloma Avenue

To: SR 434

Segment 3 Item Number: 437952-1

From: SR 434

To: North of CR 427

Segment 4 Item Number: 437953-1

From: North of CR 427
To: North of Rinehart Road

Segment 2 is the project that Governor Scott recently cancelled as reflected in the enclosed email. Based on the following analysis, I must respectfully disagree with the conclusions in your memorandum as they particularly pertain to Segment 4.

Section 338.223(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2016), is only applicable to projects that are current. It would make no sense to apply this statute to a proposed project that has been

indefinitely postponed, is not funded, and has not even reached the design stage. Nothing in either the State or Federal statutes would require the Segment 4 express lanes to be listed in the TIP.

Additionally, based on the following, I do not believe Sections 338.233(1)(b) and 339.175(8)(b) should be read in *pari materia* in order for Section 338.223(1)(b) to impact the decision making process of the MPO pertaining to a now indefinitely unplanned and unfunded project. This issue turns on the interpretation of these two sections of the Florida Statutes. The second sentence of Section 338.223(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2016), provides:

(b) Turnpike projects that add capacity, alter access, affect feeder roads, or affect the operation of the local transportation system shall be included in the transportation improvement plan of the affected metropolitan planning organization.

The first sentence of Section 339.175(8)(d), Florida Statutes (2016), provides:

(d) Projects included in the transportation improvement program and that have advanced to the design stage of preliminary engineering may be removed from or rescheduled in a subsequent transportation improvement program only by the joint action of the M.P.O. and the department.

In your memorandum, you concluded that reading these statutes in pari materia means that Section 338.223(1)(b) constitutes an exception to and controls over Section 339.175(8)(d). You further conclude that Section 338.223(1)(b) precludes FDOT and MetroPlan from removing the expressway lane project from the TIP even if it was currently listed on the TIP.

In State v. Goode, 830 So. 2d 817, 823 (Fla. 2002), the Florida Supreme Court held:

Mandatory v. Directory

The Legislature's interest in imposing rigid time constraints is expressly reflected in the language of section 394.916(1), which specifically states that the court "shall" conduct a trial within thirty days after the determination of probable cause. See § 394.916(1), Fla. Stat (1999). We have previously stated that "[a]lthough there is no fixed construction of the word 'shall,' it is normally meant to be mandatory in nature." See S.R. v. State, 346 So. 2d 1018, 1019 (Fla. 1977).

However, we have also noted that its interpretation "depends upon the context in which it is found and upon the intent of the legislature as expressed in the statute." *Id.* For example, courts have held that the term "shall" should be construed as mandatory where it refers to some action preceding the possible deprivation of a substantive right. *See id.; Neal v. Bryant*, 149 So. 2d 529, 532 (Fla. 1962); *Allied Fid. Ins. Co. v. State*, 415 So. 2d 109, 111 (Fla. 3d DCA 1982); *see also Kinder v. State*, 779 So. 2d 512, 514 (Fla. 2d DCA 2000) (stating that "[g]enerally, 'shall' is interpreted to be mandatory where it refers to some action preceding the possible deprivation of a substantive right and directory where it relates to some immaterial

matter in which compliance is a matter of convenience"), approved, 830 So. 2d 832, 2002 Fla. LEXIS 2174, No. SC01-37 (Fla. Oct. 17, 2002).

The use of the word "shall" in Section 338.223(1)(b) is directory, not mandatory. No one is going to be deprived of a substantive right by either removing or keeping off the express lanes project from the TIP. The only entities named in Section 338.223(1)(b) that could possibly benefit from a mandatory construction of this subsection are FDOT, the respective M.P.O., and the "affected County." FDOT and the respective M.P.O. are the very entities that are granted the unconditional joint authority to remove the project under Section 339.175(8)(d). The "affected County" is Seminole County, which as you know wants this project removed, permanently. Reading the "shall" in Section 338.223(1)(b) as mandatory would deprive FDOT and MetroPlan Orlando of a substantive right granted to them by Section 339.175(8)(d).

Therefore, in my opinion, reading these two statutes in pari materia, to promote uniformity and predictability and to carry out the legislative intent, mandates that the discretionary authority jointly granted to FDOT and MetroPlan Orlando to remove the project by Section 339.175(8)(d) must control over the merely directory provision in Section 338.223(1)(b). This is particularly the case when various segments of the project are on hold for an indefinite period of time and, as to Segment 4, has not even reached the design stage and is not funded. It is my opinion that Section 339.175(8)(d) as worded actually suggests the Segment 4 express lanes should not be listed in the MetroPlan TIP. If it takes both agencies to remove a project that has reached design stage, logic would dictate no agreement is necessary to keep an unfunded project from being listed.

In the current 2017 MetroPlan TIP adopted by Resolution No.16-11 of the MetroPlan Orlando Board on July 13, 2016, the status of the four segments listed above are treated as follows:

Segment 1: Has been incorporated into Segment 2

Segment 2: The listing in the TIP includes Segment 1 and state the project is on

hold

Segment 3: Action tabled

Segment 4: Not listed in the TIP

As to the Federal regulations, the conditions in 23 C.F. R §450.326(f) for inclusion in the TIP are that the project requires action by the Federal Highway Administration or the Federal Transit Administration and that the project will be funded with federal funds. Here, the four segments are being funded with Turnpike District funding, not federal funds. Segments 1 and 2 of the express lane project have been put on an indefinite hold. Segment 3 is listed as tabled. Segment 4 is not included in the TIP. Therefore, at the present time the four segments do not require approval by these federal agencies, they will not be funded by federal funds, and they do not need to be included in the TIP under this regulation, even just for information purposes only.

Even if Federal funding was utilized, 23 C.F.R. §450.326(k) specifies that a project is to be included in the TIP "only if full funding can be reasonably anticipated to be available for the

project within the time period contemplated for completion of the project." Segments 1 and 2 of the express lane project have been put on hold for an indefinite period. Segment 3 has been tabled pending further discussion with FDOT. Segment 4 is not on the TIP and has no funding source identified in the Work Program. Therefore, it cannot be reasonably anticipated that funding will be available for any of the four segments. Therefore, subsection (k) would preclude the inclusion of the express lane project, particularly Segment 4, in the TIP, even if federal funds were to be used.

In conclusion, MetroPlan Orlando has the authority to keep the SR 417 Segment 4 express lanes project off of the TIP.

This purpose of this letter is to respond to your letter to me dated September 13, 2016 as amended by your letter of September 16, 2016, with regard to the above-referenced subject.

Let me begin by addressing what I believe is the scope of a TIP. A reading of the applicable provisions of 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303, 23 C.F.R. 450.326 and Section 339.175, Florida Statutes, in particular §§ 1, 5 and 8, lead me to the conclusion the TIP is intended to be a comprehensive listing of all modes of transportation, no matter what the source of funding for the projects listed in the TIP, including roads funded not only with Federal and State funds but also with Revenue Bonds and Toll Revenues. The MetroPlan Orlando TIP has always included Florida Turnpike Enterprise ("FTE") projects and Central Florida Expressway Authority ("CFX") projects.

With regard to Section 338.223, Florida Statutes, you will note that the title is "Proposed turnpike projects" and both Sections (1)(a) and (1)(b) begin with the phrase "Any proposed project." The first sentence of (1)(a) reads "Any proposed project to be constructed or acquired as part of the turnpike system and any turnpike improvement shall be included in the tentative work program."

Sub-section (1)(b) states "Any proposed turnpike project or improvement shall be developed in accordance with the Florida Transportation Plan and the work program pursuant to

Section 339.135. Turnpike projects that add capacity, alter access, affect feeder roads or affect the operation of the local transportation system shall be included in the Transportation Improvement Program of the effected metropolitan planning organization."

Section 339,135, Florida Statutes, addresses the process of funding and developing a tentative work program and an adopted work program.

With regard to the question of reading Section 338.223, Florida Statutes, in pari materia, with Section 339.175(8)(d), Florida Statutes, I call your attention to Section 334.035, Florida Statutes, entitled "Purpose of Transportation Code" which reads in part:

"The purpose of the Florida Transportation Code is to establish the responsibilities of the state, the counties, and the municipalities in the planning and development of the transportation systems serving the people of the state and to assure the development of an integrated, balanced statewide transportation system... The chapters in the code shall be considered components of the total code, and the provisions therein, unless expressly limited in scope, shall apply to all chapters."

The Transportation Code includes Chapters 338 and 339, Florida Statutes.

All of the above provisions lead me to the conclusion that the use of the word "shall" in Section 338,223(1)(a) and (1)(b) is meant to be mandatory and not merely directory. To conclude otherwise and not include these projects, would mean that the TIP which is intended to be a comprehensive transportation planning document would be omitting regionally significant projects such as those that are undertaken by the FTE and CFX located in the Orlando urbanized area encompassing MetroPlan Orlando.

Another concern with not including an FTE project in the TIP is that an omission would be contrary to the spirit and intent of the statutes and code provisions with regard to public participation in the process. If the projects are not included, the public is not fully informed of what transportation projects are being planned for the urbanized area.

In addition, MetroPlan Orlando is subject to periodic review as to its performance and compliance with all federal requirements by the Federal Highway Administration and the Federal Transit Administration. That review includes compliance with TIP content requirements. If MetroPlan Orlando were found not to be in compliance, it would receive an adverse comment from these agencies with directions to come into compliance.

With regard to the current status of SR417, Segment 4, 1 am attaching for your information an email from Keith Caskey, Manager of Planning Services at MetroPlan Orlando to

Harry Barley and Gary Huttmann, Deputy Executive Director, and attaching excerpts from May 2016 TIP. The text of the email and second attachment indicates that since Segment 4 is in the FDOT adopted work program it will need to be added to the TIP at the November 2016 meeting of the MetroPlan Board. Please note that Segment 3 is still in the work program and is shown as on hold in the TIP; it has not been cancelled as you suggest in your letter.

I am also enclosing a narrative excerpt from the TIP which describes toll projects which are not subject to approval by the MetroPlan Orlando Board as they are funded with toll revenues rather than traditional federal and state funding categories are shown in the TIP for informational purposes. This is consistent with 23 CFR Section 450.326(f).

I want to address one other point from your letter. I did not mean to imply by my Memorandum of July 25, 2016 that the Florida Department of Transportation ("FDOT")/FTE and MetroPlan Orlando could not jointly remove projects from the TIP. Clearly they can by the provisions of Section 339.175(8)(d) and otherwise by their general powers. But for the reasons stated in my Memorandum and this letter, the MetroPlan Board cannot unilaterally remove an FTE project from the TIP. Such projects would need to be removed from the FDOT work program by the FDOT before they could be removed from the TIP.

Finally, I had a chance to discuss this matter with Paul Gougelman, who as you probably know is the long time general counsel to the Metropolitan Planning Organization Advisory Council ("MPOAC"). He did not recall that inclusion of a toll road project in a TIP had ever been an issue and did not know of any MPO in the State which does not include such projects in its TIP. He agreed with my position that such inclusion is mandatory.

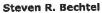

SUBJECT: Swapped Funds (Repurposing Federal Earmarks)

Earlier this year I presented information on the need to repurpose some leftover federal earmarks that had been assigned to the region years ago. To help us meet a tight schedule to repurpose the earmarked funds, FDOT suggested that these funds go toward a fully funded project and an equal amount of funds be swapped out for future use. The MetroPlan Board approved that approach.

MetroPlan Orlando committees have considered how to use these funds. Recommendations from the committees include:

- CAC-supports using the funds to advance premium transit
- TSMO supports using the funds to offset cost increase to implement quiet zones
- TAC supports using the funds to offset cost increase to implement guiet zones
- MAC supports using the funds to offset cost increase to implement quiet zones

Subsequent to those committee recommendations, FDOT offered to fund the cost increase to implement quiet zones. We also have heard from other MetroPlan Orlando Partners of the need for additional funds on several projects. We are asking for each of the committees to consider this one more time. Approximately \$2.6 million is available.

Staff Recommendation

50% (\$1.3M) of the funds allocated to the US 192 Bus Rapid Transit project in Osceola County

The remaining 50% (\$1.3M) be applied to the following projects, each of which are underway and in need of additional funds.

- \$900,000 to Shingle Creek Trail from Destination Parkway to Sand Lake Road
- \$300,000 to the Signal Retiming Contract to cover all of the corridors identified
- \$100,000 to the Lidar project (technology for vehicle homicide investigations) in partnership with CFX

We have a shared recognition of the transportation need in this area, but have struggled with the right solution, especially with regard to the federal regulations governing the use of the SR50 federal-aid right-of-way. You correctly suggest that the Department, as the state transportation agency, could expand SR50 by adding Department owned toll lanes within the SR50 federal-aid right of way, thereby providing a facility similar to that contemplated by the Central Florida Expressway Authority. As noted in my previous correspondence, the Department is using its existing federal authority in a similar manner to construct portions of the Wekiva Parkway.

I respond to your September 13, 2016, letter.

The recitals to the interlocal funding agreement to which the department is a party state that it "is undertaking the development and implementation of the Central Florida Commuter Rail System (the 'Commuter Rail System') running from DeLand ... to Poinciana..."; and that it "is in the process of making application to the Federal Translt Administration (FTA) and Congress for capital funds, commonly referred to as New Starts funding to provide a portion of the funds necessary for the planning, design, right-way acquisition and construction of the proposes commuter rail service on the Commuter Rail System [.]" Your letter states that the department has met its obligation to attempt to secure federal funding; and directs the county to the federal government. Please confirm that it is now the county that is to take the lead in any funding effort.

Particularly given this department position, it is puzzling that your letter did not address the implications of no phase II construction in Volusia. (The agreements include Volusia in phase II and make no reference to a phase II north.) The contingency terms of the operating agreement, section 6.02(B)(5), and of the funding agreement, section 4.02(B), each provide that if phase II does not proceed through construction and commissioning, the department and the local government partners agree to meet and discuss the impacts and renegotiate both agreements. The county unfortunately finds the need to invoke these contract requirements. A separate letter of even date does so.

Florida Department of Transportation Awards \$44.4 Million for Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail Expansion in Florida

TALLAHASSEE – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) announced today the selection of the first year of projects to receive funding under the Shared Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail program. A total of \$44,434,543 million was awarded to 45 separate projects located across 21 counties throughout Florida. (See attached map and project list)

The projects include the construction of 11 separate trail segments, which will add or improve approximately 20 miles of trail to Florida's trail system. Another 34 projects will be in various preconstruction phases of work such as feasibility study, environmental review and design. The funds are for the current fiscal year (2016-17) and are immediately available to begin work.

Governor Scott said, "Florida is proud to be an outdoors state, and our many incredible bicycle, pedestrian and multi-use trails are great activities for Floridians and visitors to enjoy. I am proud to join FDOT in celebrating this investment today as we work to provide more safe recreational opportunities for families across our state."

All of the selected projects are in the identified SUN Trail network, which consists of the developing statewide system of paved multi-use trails for bicyclists and pedestrians, physically separated from vehicular traffic.

FDOT Secretary Jim Boxold said, "This initial SUN Trail funding will provide safer opportunities for bicyclists and pedestrians, advance the completion of the state trail system and enhance the state's partnership with local communities throughout Florida."

Twenty-two of the funded projects help to advance two major regional trails systems selected as priorities by the Florida Greenways and Trails Council. Five of these are part of the Coast to Coast Connector, a 250-mile trail system linking the Gulf and Atlantic coasts through Central Florida, and 17 are part of the St. Johns River Sea Loop, a 270-mile trail system that will link together several communities including St. Augustine, Daytona Beach, Titusville, DeLand and Palatka. 23 projects are for individual trail segments throughout the rest of the state.

U.S. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx Announces \$56.6 Million in Advanced Transportation Technology Grants

The Advanced Transportation and Congestion Management Technologies Deployment Program (ATCMTD) funds cutting-edge transportation technologies that help reduce congestion and improve the safety of our transportation system.

Under the leadership of Secretary Anthony Foxx, this first round of grants builds on the Department's ongoing initiatives to promote innovative transportation technologies, such as the <u>Smart City Challenge</u>, <u>Federal Automated Vehicles Policy</u>, and <u>Mobility on Demand Sandbox Program</u> grants.

At the White House Frontiers Conference in Pittsburgh, Secretary Foxx announced the award of \$56.6 million to 8 projects that will use innovative strategies to deploy, demonstrate, and evaluate advanced transportation technologies. These projects have leveraged closed to \$100 million in additional public and private funds to support these efforts.

USDOT intends for these model technology deployments to help demonstrate how emerging transportation technologies, data, and their applications, as addressed in <u>Beyond Traffic</u>, can be effectively deployed and integrated with existing systems to provide access to essential services and other destinations. This also includes efforts to increase connectivity to employment, education, services and other opportunities; support workforce development; and contribute to community revitalization, particularly for disadvantaged and underserved groups.

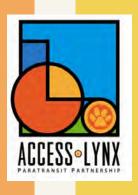
