

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Tom O'Hanlon called the Community Advisory Committee meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Atlee Mercer led the Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. CHAIRMAN'S COMMENTS

Chairman O'Hanlon told CAC members that there is ongoing discussion between Florida's Turnpike Enterprise and Central Florida Expressway Authority regarding swapping out sections of SR 417, SR 429 and SR 528. This discussion, he reported, was to help eliminate multiple agencies overseeing different sections of an arterial. He noted that a hold had been issued on a disputed widening of a section of SR 417, which would have resulted in a toll on toll in that section. Chairman O'Hanlon commented that Seminole County has conducted a safety study on a turn at SR 434 and SR 417 in Oviedo. He reported that 100 accidents have occurred at that turn and he felt the PD&E study for that project, which is scheduled for FY 2019/2020, needed to be prioritized more quickly. In an effort to go green, he told committee members that he had purchased a Tesla Model 3.

IV. AGENDA REVIEW

Ms. Cynthia Lambert introduced new MetroPlan Orlando staff member, Elizabeth Whitton. She told committee members that Ms. Whitton is a transportation planner who will focus on transit and health. Ms. Lambert noted that Mr. Alex Trauger, MetroPlan Orlando Manager of Long Range Planning, will be leaving to take a position at HDR and his last day is May 13th. She called attention to updates to the Unified Planning Work Program which were included under general information. In the supplemental folders, she added were the latest Air Quality report, information on an upcoming ITS Master Plan Workshop, and a flyer with information on Mayor Dyer's upcoming Bike to Work event. Additional information on the Wekiva Parkway project also was distributed. Chairman O'Hanlon commented on a good air quality report. Mr. Atlee Mercer added that in past years the air quality report had not been as positive, but it now was getting better.

V. CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Cathy Goldfarb confirmed that a quorum was present.

VI. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ACTION ITEMS

None.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of February 24, 2016 Meeting Minutes

Approval was requested of the February 24, 2016 meeting minutes, which were provided.

MOTION: Mr. Bill Carpenter moved for approval of the February 24, 2016 meeting minutes. Ms. Theresa Mott seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

B. FDOT Amendment to 2015/16-2019/20 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Jamil Gutierrez, FDOT, was requesting the CAC to recommend that the FY 2015/16-2019/20 TIP be amended to include funding for several intersection improvement projects. A letter explaining the amendments was provided. Mr. Gutierrez reviewed the projects listed in the request. Mr. Mercer commented that the Osceola County project, at West Oak Street and John Young Parkway, was the worst intersection in Osceola County.

MOTION: Mr. Bill Carpenter moved for approval of the FDOT Amendment to 2015/16-2019/20 Transportation Improvement Program. Mr. Tony Tizzio seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

C. Change Project Limits for Shingle Creek Trail Phase 4

Action was requested to recommend approval of changing the project limits for Shingle Creek Trail Phase 4 in Kissimmee. Mr. Randy Schrader, City of Kissimmee, gave a

presentation on the proposed changes to the project limits prior to action being taken. An attachment was provided. Mr. Schrader explained that the request to add this last phase to the Prioritized Project List was being made due to Orange County's realignment of its section of the trail at John Young Parkway. He provided an overview of the trail, trail segments including the MetroPlan Orlando grant application segment, and the jurisdictions responsible for each of the segments. Mr. Schrader told CAC members that by extending the limits, the trail would run from the Orange County line to Kissimmee Lakefront Park. He noted that the ecotourism benefits of the trail would help bring in revenue for the local jurisdictions. Mr. Mark Loeb asked about funding to maintain the trail after it has been completed. Mr. Schrader responded that the local cities and counties would be responsible for maintaining the trail.

VIII. PRESENTATIONS AND STATUS REPORTS

A. Orientation Presentation: I-4 Ultimate

Mr. David Parks, I-4 Ultimate public information officer, presented an update on the project's current construction progress and what's ahead. Mr. Parks gave an overview of the I-4 Ultimate project. He reviewed before and after photos of some of the intersections that are being redone and added that there will be 15 miles of bicycle and pedestrian paths built as part of the project. Mr. Parks provided information on the I-4 Ultimate website and an app that is available for project information. He noted that project alerts can be geared to a specific area that a commuter travels. Mr. Brindley Pieters asked if the project was on schedule and if there was sufficient hiring of construction staff. Mr. Parks responded that the project was on schedule. Ms. Loreen Bobo, I-4 Ultimate Project Manager, responded that craft laborers have been hired but that there will be a need for 1,000 additional workers at the peak of the project. She added that project staff are also training individuals with no experience, in order to have sufficient skilled labor for the project. Discussion ensued regarding where to find help wanted information, if ex-offenders were eligible for hiring, modeling of the project after others, providing sufficient toll information to locals and tourists, signage, and a tolling by plate option. Ms. Bobo responded that she will look into the policy on hiring of exoffenders. Mr. Atlee Mercer called attention to the SunRail Phase II south extension that just broke ground and the fact that Osceola County would have a shorter time frame in regards to funding operations and maintenance for the rail system. Ms. Bobo responded that she will take his concern back to FDOT staff. Mr. Parks told CAC members that best practices on other projects, both nationwide and statewide, were being used on the I-4 Ultimate project and there would be tolling signage at each entry point on the express lanes. He added that an interactive map with interchange information is available on the Ms. Bobo told committee members that Florida's Turnpike I-4 Ultimate website. Enterprise (FTE) was responsible for making the decision on tolling on I-4. Ms. Carol Scott, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise, reported that there would only be electronic tolling on the I-4 express lanes.

B. Orientation Presentation: Wekiva Parkway

Ms. Mary Brooks, Wekiva Parkway public information officer, presented an update on the project's current construction progress and what's ahead. Ms. Brooks told committee

members that the Wekiva Parkway would complete the beltway system around the Central Florida area. She provided a project description and noted that there would be all electronic tolling on the parkway. Ms. Brooks explained that the Wekiva Parkway ran through some environmentally sensitive areas and she detailed the steps that were being taken to mitigate issues in those areas. She reviewed a map showing the 14 project sections for the parkway, along with whether the sections were under the jurisdiction of FDOT/FTE or Central Florida Expressway Authority. Ms. Brooks gave an update on the status of each of the sections, along with some of the aesthetic treatments being used on the project. She provided a project schedule, information on what's upcoming for various FDOT and CFX segments, and her contact information. Discussion ensued regarding tolling, fencing being used, and wildlife jump outs.

Ms. Brooks provided a brief update on the Poinciana Parkway. She told CAC members that the first part of the parkway would be opening Saturday, April 30th and the second stage in September. Mr. Atlee Mercer noted that the project is ahead of schedule and on budget.

Mr. Tony Tizzio requested that the I-4 staff in attendance return to the podium to answer questions from a member of the public.

Ms. Cathy Matthews, 6000 Twin Lakes Drive, Oviedo, asked if information on alternate routes will be provided when there are lane closures due to I-4 Ultimate construction. Mr. Parks responded that information on specific detours will be made available. She noted that the Red Bug Lake Road overpass ramps go quickly down to a shopping center and she felt that was dangerous and that room should be left on I-4 exit ramps. She asked if there will be hard boundaries separating the express lanes on I-4. Mr. Parks responded that there will be a concrete wall installed separating the express lanes from the general use lanes. Ms. Matthews asked if there will be openings/options for entering/exiting the express lanes in case of emergencies. Mr. Parks responded that there will be access points every two miles, either through openings or gates, where emergency vehicles can access the express lanes. He added that I-4 Mobility Partners, the I-4 Ultimate Concessionaire, has performance goals and financial incentives tied into keeping the lanes open. Ms. Matthews suggested not pairing express lane exits with I-4 exits, such as she experienced in south Florida, due to express lane traffic having to cross multiple general use lanes to exit. Mr. Parks responded that there will be slip ramps and direct connect ramps at Kirkman Road, SR 408, Anderson Street, South Street, Ivanhoe Boulevard and Central Parkway by Cranes Roost Park.

Mr. Jeffrey Campbell asked how the Road Rangers were being funded. Mr. Parks responded that the Road Rangers are currently funded by the I-4 Ultimate project concessionaire.

C. <u>Orientation Presentation:</u> Orlando International Airport Expansion

Mr. Brad Friel, Greater Orlando Aviation Authority director of planning, presented on Orlando International Airport's Intermodal Terminal construction and south terminal complex plans. Mr. Friel informed committee members that the City of Orlando owns the Orlando International Airport property and the Authority's seven-member board is

comprised of five Governor's appointees, who serve for four-year terms, and one each selected from the Orange County Commission and the Orlando Čity Council, who serve for two-year terms, as long as they are in office. He provided an overview of passenger activity and airport statistics, including that Orlando International Airport (OIA) is the 4th largest airport in the United States, it has the largest rental car market, and OIA generates \$31 plus billion in economic impact for the area. Mr. Friel reviewed passenger traffic statistics, domestic and international destinations, budgeted revenues, capital plan projects, and future rail connectivity. In addition, he reported on the proposed south intermodal terminal expansion. Discussion ensued regarding the need for additional runways, accommodating A380 planes, economic impact of the south terminal, contact information for outreach programs, transition to ground transportation and the time frame for the proposed additional ground transportation, remote check-in, accommodations for the disabled, an airport app to help guide people, impact of expansion on roadways, cell phone lots, Uber and LYFT access, and plans for a future hotel. Mr. Friel told CAC members that no additional runways will be necessary with the expansion, the A380 planes need additional clearance room, he will check on the economic impact figures, and Carolyn Fennell is the contact for public speaking engagements. He added that the intermodal facility was projected to be open in 2017, with Brightline service to begin first and SunRail was projected for 2020, and a multiuse trail system was planned as well. Mr. Friel explained that remote check-in would allow travelers to drop off their luggage, take the tram to the gate, and their luggage would be sent along to their destination. He told committee members that there were defined areas for the disabled and an airport app was currently available. Ms. Lambert reported that the OIA app is "OrlandoMCO". Mr. Friel added that additional bus service through Universal is being considered and some cruise lines provide transportation. There are currently two cell phone lots with an additional one planned for the new terminal. Uber Black currently serves the airport, however, Uber and Lyft require permitting by the City of Orlando. He told CAC members that there will be space allotted for two hotels to be built in the south expansion project.

Date: April 1, 2015

Subject: FDOT Guidance on repurposing old federal earmarks

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2016 allows states to repurpose certain funds originally earmarked for specific projects more than 10 years ago. FHWA has issued guidance on implementing this provision in federal law, and the following state guidance complements and clarifies the FHWA guidance.

Existing earmarks do not have to be repurposed

Repurposing is <u>not</u> mandatory and is at the option of the state. If the unobligated funds are still needed on the original earmark at a later date, then the original purpose of the earmark and the period of availability of the earmarked funds will remain intact. No action required to keep the funds "as is".

Eligibility for repurposing

Individual projects specifically designated (earmarked) in prior federal law by Congress are eligible for this repurposing if they meet the following criteria:

- Must meet the definition of an earmark. An earmark is defined as funding in a provision of law
 or report language directing a specific amount of discretionary budget authority, contract
 authority, or other spending authority for a project, or other expenditure with or to an entity, or
 targeted to a specific State, locality or congressional district. This definition includes any
 discretionary program funding (e.g., Ferry Boat Discretionary, Interstate Maintenance
 Discretionary, Bridge Discretionary, etc.) that was congressionally designated to a specific
 project identified in a report accompanying legislation such as appropriations acts.
- Designated in law on or before September 30, 2005.
- Administered by FHWA.
- Less than 10% obligated <u>or</u> the project has been completed and closed with excess unobligated funds remaining.

Projects that meet the eligibility criteria described in the law

The project lists provided by FHWA with their guidance document do not include all projects eligible for repurposing. They only include projects with available balances to which FHWA had assigned Demo IDs. There are other projects earmarked within the various FHWA discretionary programs (most of which have now been discontinued) to which FHWA did not assign Demo IDs. FDOT has identified these other projects for consideration and they are included on the final list, as long as they (and all the FHWA identified projects) meet the additional criteria noted below.

Other criteria required by FDOT

After projects are identified which meet the legal criteria, they will be further limited by the following:

- Only projects having in excess of \$1,000 of funds (and obligating authority) remaining on the project will be considered for repurposing.
- Only projects having available obligation authority to go with the remaining funds will be
 considered for repurposing. Most of the eligible projects on FHWA's project lists have little, if
 any, OA available to use with the remaining funds. Although still shown on the list, those
 projects with no available OA will not be considered for repurposing.
 - Although permissible by federal law, projects with remaining funds but a shortage of OA will <u>not</u> be allowed to use our annual current year core program OA to make up the OA shortfall for these projects. To do otherwise would put federally funded projects already in the work program at risk of being defunded. All existing annual core program OA has planned uses on projects already programmed in the Five Year Work Program.
- The final list, filtered for this additional criteria, is attached with this guidance.

Timeframe for repurposing and obligation

The state may submit a request to FHWA to repurpose at any time prior to the submission deadlines. Repurposing requests must first be approved by FHWA and the funds moved in FHWA's FMIS system to a special federal appropriation category (program code) before the funds will be available for obligation.

Districts will notify the Federal Aid Management Office (FAMO) of requests to repurpose. FAMO will prepare the required transfer forms and submit the requests to the FHWA Florida Division Office.

- A request to repurpose an earmark may be made anytime, but must be submitted to FAMO no later than August 15th, 2016. Districts are encouraged to submit repurposing requests as soon as the repurposing decision is made, particularly if the district intends to obligate the repurposed funds before the end of the fiscal year.
 - o If the funds are not allocated in FMIS then a written request to allocate the funds must first be made to the Florida FHWA Division Office, who will then send the request to the appropriate FHWA program office to allocate the funds following the normal process. FAMO will determine if the funds have been allocated, and will make the request to allocate if needed.
 - The normal allocation process takes up to 30 days, so <u>districts are encouraged to make their repurposing determinations as soon as possible</u> to allow for this extra 30 days if needed.
- The law does <u>not</u> allow any repurposing of earmarks after September 30, 2016.
- After the repurposing request is approved, the funds must be obligated no later than September 30, 2019.

Requirements for obligating repurposed earmark funding

This "Repurposing Provision" allows <u>states</u> to repurpose these old earmarked funds. Therefore, project selection authority resides with the state DOT in determining which new or existing projects will receive the repurposed funds. However, districts should consult with their respective MPOs and local governments regarding repurposing funds for earmarks which were originally within the geographic area of a particular MPO or local government, before making the decision as to which project(s) will receive the repurposed funds.

The following criteria must be met to obligate funding that has been repurposed from an earmark to one or more new or existing projects:

- <u>Type of project</u> The repurposed funding must be obligated on a Surface Transportation Block Grant eligible project. In other words, virtually any Title 23 eligible activity, same as SA funded projects in the work program.
- <u>Location of project</u> The project receiving the repurposed funding must be within Florida and within 50 miles of the original earmark description
 - o If the earmark was for a geographic area (e.g. city, count, corridor) a project will be considered to meet this location requirement if it is within 50 miles of the area's boundary.
- <u>Federal share</u> The applicable maximum federal share is the same as originally provided for the earmarked funds. The use of toll credits to match the required federal share is allowed.
- <u>Specific projects</u> Must identify specific project(s) for the full unobligated balance of the earmark to be repurposed.
 - o May identify more than one project for the repurposed funds, but must identify the specific amount of each project when the request to repurpose is made.
 - Cost underruns released from one project may be obligated for increased costs only on another project previously identified at the time of repurposing for the same earmark.
- Only one shot at repurposing Once funds are repurposed under the Repurposing Provision, they may not be again repurposed because the funds will no longer meet the requirements for repurposing since they have been moved off of the original congressionally designated earmark.
- <u>Transfer of repurposed funds</u> Once repurposed funds have been approved and made available in FMIS to the state, they may be transferred to another agency for obligation, if that is desired. An example would be a transfer to FTA for a transit project.
 - If the funds are to be transferred, please allow <u>an additional 30 days</u> for the transfer to be processed and made available for obligation by the other agency.

Special Consideration for selected SAFETEA-LU Earmarks

Most of these old earmarks were originally provided with individual funding amounts and individual OA to go with them. However, certain SAFETEA-LU earmarks, FL291 through FL317, shared a single amount of OA that could be used for any of these particular earmarks. When Florida originally received these earmarks they were assigned an amount of OA proportional to the amount of funds received. If any of these earmarks are selected for repurposing, there exists the possible opportunity to shift OA from another of these earmarks not selected for repurposing, in order to provide OA equal to the amount of funds remaining on the earmark to be repurposed. If any of these are selected for repurposing, please contact FAMO staff to ascertain the maximum amount of OA that could be assigned to the repurposed earmark(s).

Required Congressional Quarterly Reports

FDOT must provide quarterly reports to FHWA on the identified projects. FHWA will provide FDOT with a compiled list of projects submitted during each quarter. FDOT will provide the Florida Division Office with a letter certifying that the list of projects is accurate and will be obligated in accordance with the Repurposing Provision.

FAMO will be responsible for ensuring the certification letter is timely filed with FHWA.

This is the list of highway, Transportation Systems Management & Operations (TSMO), bicycle and pedestrian and transit projects from the FY 2020/21-2039/40 Prioritized Project List (PPL) that was adopted in May 2015. These project lists have been updated based on the FY 2016/17-2020/21 Tentative Five Year Work Program. This updated list was developed for the purpose of providing a starting point for developing the list of projects to be included in the FY 2021/22-2039/40 Prioritized Project List. New phases funded for those projects since last year's TIP are shown in **bold italic**.

The figures shown in the Estimated Remaining Cost column for the highway projects are present-day cost estimates provided by FDOT.

The PPL is normally adopted by the MetroPlan Orlando Board each year in September and submitted to FDOT no later than October 1st. However, due to the early start for the 2016 Florida legislative session, the PPL was on an accelerated schedule in 2015 and was adopted by the board on May 13, 2015 and was submitted to FDOT.

Note: For funding equity purposes regarding TRIP funds, MetroPlan Orlando's policy is that, for any TRIP funding allocation for the MetroPlan Orlando area in FY 2015/16, each of the three counties will receive a percentage of the allocation based on population percentages, with Orange County receiving 64%, Seminole County receiving 21.3% and Osceola County receiving 14.7%. Each of the counties will then set aside 22% of their TRIP funding allocations for LYNX projects. If MetroPlan Orlando receives a TRIP funding allocation in FY 2015/16, Orange County's share of those funds will be used for the SR 528/Innovation Way interchange project (ranked #1 on the list) and the other projects on the TRIP list will remain in their current priorities as shown on the list. However, if MetroPlan Orlando does not receive any TRIP funds in FY 2015/16, and moves off the list, Orange Solventy interchange project is funded through construction with funding categories other than TRIP funds and moves off the list, Orange County's next priority, the 4-laning of Boggy Creek Road from Simmons Road to SR 417 (ranked #5 on the list), will move up to the #1 priority on the TRIP list, since Orange County has not had any projects funded with TRIP funds since FY 2008/09. For FY 2016/17 and beyond, MetroPlan Orlando's TRIP funding allocation will not be divided into percentages for the counties, and the projects on the TRIP list will be funded based on priority and the availability of TRIP funds and local matching funds.
