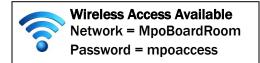

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of October 25, 2017 Meeting Minutes (Tab 1)

Approval is requested of the October 25, 2017 meeting minutes, provided at Tab 1.

B. FDOT Amendment to FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program: TSMO Projects, Railroad Crossing Projects, & Ronald Reagan Blvd. (Tab 2)

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, is requesting the CAC to recommend that the FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 TIP be amended to include new funding for three TSMO projects, five railroad crossing projects, and improvements to CR 427/Ronald Reagan Blvd. in Longwood. A letter from FDOT explaining the amendment request is provided in **Tab 2**, along with a fact sheet prepared by MetroPlan Orlando staff and the draft resolution to be presented at the December 13th Board meeting.

C. Revisions to CAC Bylaws on Policy for Alternates (Tab 3)

The current CAC bylaws allow for local government appointees to have alternates, but do not provide a process for MetroPlan Orlando appointees. The revisions in section 4-A add two non-voting alternate seats to the CAC. A new process is outlined on page three for how MetroPlan Orlando appointees can have alternates vote in their places.

D. CAC New Member Application Review Subcommittee

Action is requested to appoint a CAC New Member Application Review Subcommittee. The subcommittee will review applications for CAC vacancies and will make recommendations on new members at the January 2018 CAC meeting.

E. Election of CAC Officers for 2018

Action is requested to approve the Officer Selection Subcommittee's nominations for the CAC Chairman and Vice-Chairman for 2018. Nominations can also be taken from the floor.

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Tom O'Hanlon called the Community Advisory Committee meeting to order at 9:32 a.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman O'Hanlon led the Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. CHAIRMAN'S COMMENTS

Chairman O'Hanlon commented that the abundance of flashing lights on non-emergency vehicles is troubling and poses a potential public safety risk. Ms. Marissa Salas commented that there are no regulations in place for lights on vehicles. Committee members questioned whether FDOT has any regulations in place in regards to vehicle lights. Ms. Vickie Wyche, FDOT, responded that she will research FDOT light regulations and provide that information to CAC members.

IV. AGENDA REVIEW

Ms. Cynthia Lambert told CAC members that she appreciates CAC members attending the meeting at the FDOT Urban Office and a tour of the Traffic Management Center will be provided after the meeting. She introduced Ms. Vickie Wyche, representing FDOT District 5 and new MetroPlan Orlando staff member, Ms. Robin Cusimano. Ms. Lambert called attention to items in the supplemental folders which included a follow up memo regarding the suggestion of a MetroPlan Orlando grant program for bike share, SR 436 Study fact sheet, FDOT and Florida's Turnpike Enterprise Tentative Five-Year Work Program information and Long Range Transportation Plan information. She noted upcoming events which included the Osceola County launch for Best Foot Forward October 30th, 11:00 a.m. and the Commuter Rail Commission meeting November 1st, 3:00 p.m. at MetroPlan Orlando.

V. CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Cathy Goldfarb confirmed that a quorum was present.

VI. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ACTION ITEMS

None.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of August 23, 2017 Meeting Minutes

Approval was requested of the August 23, 2017 meeting minutes, which were provided.

MOTION: Mr. Atlee Mercer moved approval of the August 23, 2017 meeting minutes. Mr. Tony Tizzio seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

B. FDOT Amendment to FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested the CAC recommend that the FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 TIP be amended to include additional funding for an existing LYNX project, a new bike lane project, and various new TSMO projects throughout the MetroPlan Orlando region. A letter from FDOT explaining the amendment request was provided, along with a fact sheet prepared by MetroPlan Orlando staff and the draft resolution to be presented at the November 8th Board meeting. Mr. Caskey explained that twelve of the projects were being funded with MetroPaln Orlando SU funds.

MOTION: Mr. Dan Stephens moved approval of the amendments to the FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 TIP. Ms. Theresa Mott seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

C. Appointment of Officer Selection Subcommittee

Action was requested to approve the establishment of a subcommittee to select candidates to serve as the CAC Chairman and Vice-Chairman from January through December 2018. Ms. Cynthia Lambert requested volunteers to serve on the Officer Selection subcommittee which will meet November 29th immediately prior to the CAC meeting. She added that it would be preferable to have representation from each of the three counties on the subcommittee. Mr. Tony Tizzio, Mr. Dan Stephens, Mr. Scott Zubarik and Mr. Brindley Pieters volunteered to serve. Ms. Lambert noted that anyone interested in serving as an officer for 2018 please contact her.

MOTION: Mr. C. J. Maier moved approval of the Officer Selection Subcommittee. Mr. Tony Tizzio seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

D. Approval of the Proposed 2018 Board/Committee Meeting Schedule

Approval was requested of the 2018 MetroPlan Orlando Advisory Board/Committee Meeting Schedule, a copy of which was provided.

MOTION: Mr. R. J. Mueller moved approval of the 2018 MetroPlan Orlando Advisory Board/Committee Meeting Schedule. Mr. Atlee Mercer seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

VIII. PRESENTATIONS AND STATUS REPORTS

A. Presentation on FY 2018/19 - 2022/23 Tentative Five Year Work Program

Ms. Mary Schoelzel, FDOT, and Ms. Carol Scott, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise, presented an overview of the new FY 2018/19 - 2022/23 Tentative Five Year Work Program. Ms. Mary Schoelzel told committee members that the information being presented was for FY 2019-2023. She reported that general revenue funding was down and there had been a 10-20% increase in construction costs, both of which were having an impact on projects. Ms. Schoelzel added that the priority was to stabilize the existing project list before new projects could be added to the Work Program and any deferred projects would have first priority to be added back in. She reviewed project changes for Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties. Mr. Atlee Mercer and Mr. Dan Stephens inquired about a proposed flyover on SR 600 (US 17-92) and if it was still being considered. Ms. Schoelzel responded that the flyover was still being looked at but she was unsure of when a decision would be made. She added that she will look into the project and report back. Ms. Schoelzel told CAC members that the Work Program Public hearing was held October 10th and they were still welcome to provide comments. Discussion ensued regarding a bridge project over Simpson Road, a proposed expressway on east SR 50 at SR 408 and SR 520 and how project funding decisions are made. Ms. Carol Scott reported that a proposed widening project will address the Simpson Road bridge issue and Florida's Turnpike Enterprise just received a notice to proceed on the project development study for east SR 50. Ms. Schoelzel responded that funding decisions were based on the priority list and equity issues in the funding area.

Ms. Carol Scott told CAC members that additional information on Turnpike projects, including a map, was included in the supplemental folders. She reported that funding for FTE projects came from toll revenue and bonds and that \$700 million in funding was being allocated to MetroPlan Orlando area projects. Ms. Scott reviewed projects in Florida's Turnpike Enterprise Five Year Work Program, which included the relocation of the tandem truck lot and \$210 million in resurfacing projects. Discussion ensued regarding the Leesburg toll plaza, bottleneck areas in Osceola County, and lack of an on-ramp at a new mall site. Chairman O'Hanlon commented how input from the public can impact transportation. Additional discussion ensued in regards to sprawl and the inevitable need for roads to provide connections.

B. Demonstration of New, Real-Time LYNX Bus Tracker App

Mr. Doug Jamison, LYNX, gave a brief demonstration of the new LYNX app to track buses. Mr. Jamison told CAC members that the app uses GPS technology to transmit bus location information and there is a web app and mobile app. He noted that LYNX is looking to provide the same type of tracking system for ACCESS LYNX in the future and NeighborLink already has it in use. Mr. Jamison added that LYNX is also developing See Something, Say Something to report crimes or suspicious activity and a mobile fare payment system, which is currently in testing. Discussion ensued regarding the ability to forward crime reporting to other entities, driver alarm system availability, time frame for NeigborLink reservations, bus stop access for tracking, a wayfinding option and what happens with riders' financial information. Mr. Jamison reported that the See Something Say Something report can be forwarded to other entities and the drivers have silent alarms. He added that NeighborLink has two scheduling options either immediate or from

two hours to seven days in advance, wayfinding is not part of the system at this time and financial information is handled by another company, which is compliant with regulations concerning financial information. Mr. Jamison noted that 4,521 people have already downloaded the app so far prior to LYNX publicizing it. Additional discussion ensued in regards to working with municipalities and trip planning for ACCESS LYNX. Mr. Jamison told committee members that LYNX has an open dialogue with municipalities on a monthly basis and trip planning for ACCESS LYNX is not yet available.

C. Presentation on SR 436 Transit Corridor Study

Mr. Myles O'Keefe, LYNX, gave a presentation on LYNX's SR 436 Transit Corridor Study. Mr. O'Keefe reviewed the study area, project goals, study schedule, existing conditions, traffic patterns and infrastructure. In addition, he reviewed the corridor auto volume, average travel speeds, transit ridership, cost effectiveness of the ridership and existing and potential riders. Mr. O'Keefe noted that health aspects for the study area had been included from the beginning instead of being considered post study. He provided information on the tiered alternatives analysis and reviewed the types of alternatives that could be considered. Mr. O'Keefe called attention to the website for the study, lynxsr436.metroquest.com, which included a survey.

D. Presentation on 2040 LRTP Amendments - deferred

E. Presentation on Safety & Technology Grant

Mr. Jeremy Dilmore, FDOT, gave an overview of the \$11.9 million grant recently received by Central Florida to advance several intelligent transportation system technologies. A fact sheet was provided. Mr. Dilmore explained the difference between connected and autonomous vehicles. He told CAC members that the grant was a collaborative effort between FDOT, MetroPlan Orlando and the University of Central Florida. He reviewed the four main components of the grant which included SunStore, which exists currently, PedSafe, Green Way and Smart Community. Mr. Dilmore gave his presentation twice so that half the committee at a time could participate in a tour of the Traffic Management Center. Discussion ensued, when the CAC members all returned from the tour, regarding software updates and crash data, last mile connectivity including bikeshare, transit kiosk availability and the modes of communication that would be available. Mr. Dilmore told CAC members that they are using public sector, open source data, crash data is already integrated and Juice Bike and Zipcar are already included in last mile connectivity. He added that there is a large percentage of people who don't have a smartphone and would need to use the kiosk, but that they would be mindful in the future of changes that would impact kiosk use. All modes of communication, he reported, would be available through local fiber optic network sharing. Chairman O'Hanlon commented on the great cooperative effort on the part of local officials.

The MetroPlan Orlando Board approved an emergency amendment to the TIP at its October 11th meeting to add construction funding for the Wekiva Parkway project from Orange Boulevard to I-4. The letter, fact sheet and TIP amendment resolution signed by the Board Chairman were provided.

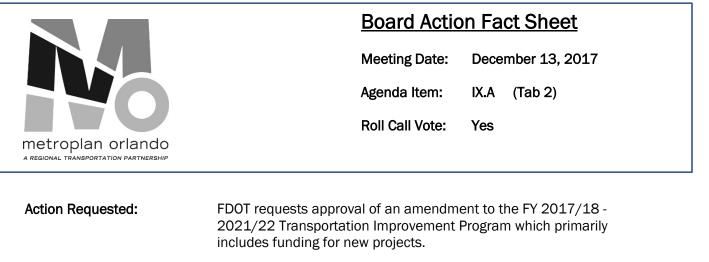

COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE BYLAWS

Section 1. Authority, Creation

In accordance with Federal and State law requiring that transportation planning must be comprehensive, cooperative and continuing in nature and provide for private citizen input, an advisory committee known as the "MetroPlan Orlando Community Advisory Committee (CAC)" is hereby created.

Section 2. Definition

For the purpose of these Bylaws, the term "the committee" shall mean the MetroPlan Orlando Community Advisory Committee.

For the purposes of these bylaws, the term "stakeholders" shall mean the residents, visitors, bicycle and pedestrian community, transportation system, transit users. This includes representation from user advocacy groups and those representing the underserved and disadvantaged (see section 4-A-2).

For the purposes of these bylaws, the term "multimodal" shall mean various transportation options such as bicycle, pedestrian, roadway, and transit (including buses and passenger rail).

Section 3. Purpose

The purpose of the committee shall be to involve the stakeholders of the Central Florida area in the transportation planning process by (1) assessing reaction to planning proposals (2) providing comment to MetroPlan Orlando with respect to the concerns of various segments of the population in regard to various transportation needs, as well as (3) recommend and advise on roadway, bicycle, pedestrian, freight, and transit issues.

It is the mission of the committee to:

- A. Advise MetroPlan Orlando on public opinion related to transportation issues from a diverse range of perspectives.
- B. Address stakeholder interests so that proper study and evaluation of transportation needs shall result in a safe, balanced and multimodal transportation system plan.
- C. Provide an effective, stakeholders' review of the preliminary findings and recommendations of MetroPlan Orlando's plans, studies and issues.
- D. Participate in the amendment process to the Long Range Transportation Plan by providing input.

- E. Assist in other missions/functions as deemed desirable by MetroPlan Orlando, including member appointments to ad hoc subcommittees that may be formed from time to time for the purpose of specifically addressing roadways, bicycle, pedestrian, and/or transit-related issues.
- F. Committee meetings shall be publicly noticed in accordance with guidelines in the organization's Public Involvement Plan. From time to time, committee meetings may be held at various locations throughout the region to encourage wider public involvement.

Section 4. Membership, Appointments, Terms of Office, Conflicts, Vacancies, Removal from Office

A. Membership

The <u>31 member</u> committee <u>of 31 voting members and 2 non-voting alternates</u> shall consist of <u>community</u> representatives from Orange, Seminole, and Osceola counties. <u>Members, whether voting or non-voting, shall not be elected officials.</u> Fifteen (15) shall be geographic seats appointed at-large from the jurisdictions as indicated below, and <u>sixteen</u> (<u>16)eighteen (18)</u> shall be appointed by the MetroPlan Orlando Board:

1. Geographic Appointees

Orange County	3 seats
Osceola County	3 seats
Seminole County	3 seats
Orange County municipalities	2 seats
Osceola County municipalities	2 seats
Seminole County municipalities	2 seats

Municipal appointments shall be from the two largest municipalities in each county as determined by the most recent University of Florida or U.S. Census population figures, whichever is most recent.

All geographic appointees shall reside in and be appointed by their respective county or municipality. In selecting new members for appointment, the appointing jurisdiction should consider the personal qualifications of the individuals as lay people in the community, outside the transportation industry, and should strive to include ethnic, social, and economic diversity. MetroPlan Orlando supports diversity and encourages jurisdictions to consider the makeup of their communities when appointing representatives.

2. MetroPlan Orlando Board Appointees

Multimodal Advocates	10 seats
Underserved	3 seats
Transportation Disadvantaged	2 seats (disabled or elderly)
Business Community	1 seat
Non-Voting Alternates	<u>2 seats</u>

MetroPlan Orlando Board appointees must apply for membership through a process

established by MetroPlan Orlando. The Community Advisory Committee shall review the applications and make recommendations to the MetroPlan Orlando Board for approval.

3. Alternates

MetroPlan Orlando expects members to remain actively engaged in the committee, participating as fully as possible. It's recognized that circumstances may occasionally arise that keep a member from attending a meeting. These guidelines on the role of alternates are meant to provide flexibility for members while ensuring committee participation. Members can request that an alternate represent them at a maximum of two meetings during the year.

Alternates for Geographic Appointees: Alternate members may be appointed by the appointing local governments as necessary. These alternates will serve in the absence of the primary member and have the same right to vote and comment on agenda items. Designated alternates shall not be elected officials and must also be lay persons outside of the transportation industry. Each alternate designated by a county or municipality shall also reside within the geographic boundaries of that city or county so as to be familiar with the general citizenry's needs and desires of that city or county.

Alternates for MetroPlan Orlando Appointees: The two Non-Voting Alternates appointed by MetroPlan Orlando are expected to attend all meetings, sit at the table with voting members, and participate in discussions. Voting appointees who are unable to attend a meeting should notify MetroPlan Orlando staff and request a Non-Voting alternate to represent them and vote in their place. Staff will then reach out to the alternates and ensure that they can attend and vote in place of the member. The first voting appointees to notify staff will receive priority. Once all alternates have been engaged, all other appointees not at the meeting will receive absences.

4. Non-Voting Advisors

<u>One representative from LYNX and one from the Florida Department of Transportation</u> <u>District Five shall serve as non-voting advisors.</u>

3. In addition, a representative from LYNX, and Florida Department of Transportation-District Five, shall serve as a non-voting advisors.

Alternate members may be appointed by the appointing authority as necessary. These alternates will serve in the absence of the primary member and have the same right to vote and comment on agenda items. Designated alternates shall not be elected officials and must also be lay persons outside of the transportation industry. Each alternate designated by a county or municipality shall also reside within the geographic boundaries of that city or county so as to be familiar with the general citizenry's needs and desires of that city or county.

Neither voting members of the committee nor their alternate members shall be elected officials.

All members (designated or alternate) shall avoid any professional conflict of interest. Any committee member who becomes aware of any type of conflict shall make it known to the staff liaison and either excuse himself/herself from the proceedings, or file a conflict of interest form into the record.

From time to time, committee meetings may be held at various locations throughout the region to encourage wider public involvement.

- B. Appointments, Terms of Office, Conflicts of Interest
 - 1. Representatives shall assume their responsibilities as of the next committee meeting after their appointment.
 - The term of office for a committee member in good standing will be for a period of four (4) years. At the discretion of the appointing authority, a member in good standing can be reappointed to a succeeding term(s).
 - 3. Should a member resign or cease to be a member for any reason before the expiration of his/her term, a successor will be appointed by the designating authority.
 - <u>4. All members (designated or alternate) shall avoid any professional conflict of interest.</u> <u>Any committee member who becomes aware of any type of conflict shall make it</u> <u>known to the staff liaison and either excuse himself/herself from the proceedings, or</u> <u>file a conflict of interest form into the record.</u>
- C. Membership Vacancies, Replacement Process
 - 1. The committee should maintain its continuity by reporting the vacancies on the membership roster to the appointing authority as soon as possible after the vacancy occurs. The supporting MetroPlan Orlando staff person will maintain a continuing oral and written dialog with the appointing authority until the vacancy is filled.
 - 2. Each nominee suggested for a vacant geographic position shall reside within the jurisdictional boundaries of that city or county so as to be familiar with the general citizenry's needs and desires of that city or county.
 - 3. Problems arising out of filling vacancies will be resolved between the appointing authority and MetroPlan Orlando.
 - 4. The Chairperson shall, in coordination with the supporting MetroPlan Orlando staff person, be responsible for the proper management of the committee.
 - D. Removal From Office
 - 1. Members serve in an advisory capacity, as volunteers, without compensation, and at the pleasure of the MetroPlan Orlando Board and the applicable appointing authority.
 - 2. Grounds for Removal
 - Removal for excessive absenteeism
 i. Each member is expected to demonstrate interest in the committee's

activities through the member's or a designated alternate's participation in the scheduled meetings.

- ii. If a member has two (2) consecutive absences from the meetings, MetroPlan Orlando staff shall notify the appointing authority and said member in writing in an effort to ensure full participation in the committee.
- iii. Members with three (3) consecutive absences will be recommended for removal to the MetroPlan Orlando Board and appointing authority.
- b. Removal for cause
 - i. A member may be removed for cause for:
 - a) Any conduct by a member, which in the opinion of MetroPlan Orlando, is inappropriate or unsuitable and which adversely affects, lowers, or destroys the respect or confidence of MetroPlan Orlando in the ability of the member to perform his or her duties as a member of the committee, or conduct which brings disrepute or discredit to the committee or to MetroPlan Orlando;
 - b) Violation of any provision of an applicable statute, county, or city code of ethics governing the conduct of officials;
 - c) Malfeasance, misfeasance, neglect of duty, or inability to perform his or her official duties; or
 - d) Conviction of a felony.
 - ii. Staff may recommend the removal of a member for cause to the MetroPlan Orlando Board and applicable appointing authority.
- 3. Procedure for Removal. Removal of a member may be effected by majority vote of the MetroPlan Orlando Board.

Section 5. Officers, Terms of Office

- A. The last regular monthly meeting of the year shall be known as the Annual Meeting of the committee, and shall be for the purpose of electing new officers and conducting such other business as may come before the members. The Community Advisory Committee shall elect from its membership the following officers, with the following responsibilities:
 - 1. Chairperson
 - a. Preside at all Committee meetings.
 - b. Sign any documents authorized by the Committee.
 - c. Serve as ex-officio member of all subcommittees that may be formed for specific purpose and/or appoint another committee member to do so.
 - d. Form and appoint subcommittees and subcommittee chairpersons according to the needs of the committee.
 - e. Represent the committee on the MetroPlan Orlando Board, Regional Leadership Council, and at community functions.
 - 2. Vice-Chairperson
 - a. Preside at all Committee meetings in the absence of the Chairperson.
 - b. Represent the committee on the Regional Leadership Council.

- c. Exercise all other duties and responsibilities of the Chairperson in his/her absence. These functions shall be performed not longer than the next annual election of the Chairperson.
- B. Each officer so elected shall serve for one (1) year or until said officer is re-elected or a successor is elected, except that the Chairperson's term of office shall be limited to two (2) consecutive one (1) year terms and said officer shall not be eligible again until two (2) additional years have elapsed, nor shall said officer be succeeded by an officer from the same county or jurisdiction within.
- C. Newly elected officers shall be declared installed following their election, and shall assume the duties of the office at the conclusion of the Annual Meeting.
- D. Should the Chairperson resign from committee service, the Vice-Chairperson will assume the position of Chairperson. A new Vice-Chairperson will be elected at the next regularly scheduled meeting.
- E. The successors will fill the unexpired terms and be eligible for reelection to full terms as stated in Section 5, Paragraph B above.

Section 6. Rules of Procedure

- A. The committee shall meet according to the approved annual schedule, and at such other times as the Chairperson or the Committee may determine necessary. A monthly meeting may be waived by the Chairperson but two consecutive meetings may not be waived. Business to have been conducted at the waived meeting shall be considered at the next successive monthly meeting. Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson as necessary to deal with immediate issues.
- B. Committee members or their designated alternates must be present to cast a vote. A quorum shall consist of the majority of those members entitled to vote. Any business transacted by the Committee must be approved by not less than a majority of votes cast. Business shall be transacted only at regular or called meetings and shall be duly recorded in the minutes thereof. The minutes of the Committee's proceedings and official actions shall be public record.
- C. Voting shall be by voice, but a member shall have an individual vote recorded in the minutes if said member so desires. A roll call vote shall be held upon request or as required. All questions or procedures shall be governed by the most current edition of "Robert's Rules of Order," unless superseded by law.
- D. Meeting agendas shall include two public comment periods, one at the beginning of the meeting for action items and again at the end of the meeting for general comments.

Section 7. General Policy

- A. MetroPlan Orlando consists of five (5) committees, including the Board;
 - 1. MetroPlan Orlando Board

- 2. Community Advisory Committee
- 3. Municipal Advisory Committee
- 4. Technical Advisory Committee
- 5. Transportation Systems Management & Operations Committee
- B. All Committees and studies shall follow the intent and further the Mission Statement adopted by the MetroPlan Orlando Board, which is as follows:

To provide leadership in transportation planning by engaging the public and fostering effective partnerships.

- C. All committees shall maintain a broad perspective covering the range of all modes of transportation and associated facilities (including, but not limited to, roadways, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, safety, and transit) in all recommended planning work programs so that proper study and evaluation of transportation needs shall result in a multimodal transportation system plan, balanced with respect to areawide needs and properly related to areawide comprehensive plans, goals and objectives.
- D. Reports, studies, plans, programs and databases shall be approved or endorsed by the MetroPlan Orlando Board after review and recommendation by the Community Advisory Committee and such other committees as may be interested or affected.
- E. A recommendation may be noted as officially adopted by the committee and placed into effect immediately.

Section 8. Procedures for Amending Adopted Studies, Plan, or Programs

- A. The procedures for amending the Orlando Urban Area Long Range Transportation Plan, the Transportation Improvement Program, and the Urban Boundary are established in the MetroPlan Orlando Board Rule 35I-1.009 which is incorporated by reference herein.
- B. The Community Advisory Committee shall review the proposed change and shall recommend approval or disapproval to the MetroPlan Orlando Board.
- C. The MetroPlan Orlando Board shall have final approval or disapproval disposition action of the requested change or changes.

Section 9. Ad hoc Subcommittees or Task Force

- A. Ad hoc subcommittees or task forces may be appointed by the Chairman to address specific issues or investigate and report on specific subject areas of interest to the Community Advisory Committee including, but not limited to the following:
 - 1. Nominating Subcommittee
 - 2. Bylaws Review Subcommittee
 - 3. Membership Application Review Subcommittee

- B. Each ad hoc subcommittee may appoint a chairman who will report the subcommittee's findings to the Community Advisory Committee. In the absence of a chairman, a temporary chairman shall be appointed by the subcommittee in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.
- C. Each meeting shall be recorded and if requested, minutes of a meeting shall be provided.

Section 10. Bylaws Review and Amendment

- A. A bylaws review subcommittee shall review these bylaws every five years or as may be deemed necessary. These bylaws can be amended at any regular meeting of the CAC by voting members or appointed alternates (provided there is a quorum) if the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to the members with proper notification of the meeting.
- B. These Bylaws may be altered, amended, or added to by vote of the committee provided that:
 - 1. Notice of the proposed changes shall contain a full statement of the proposed amendments.

 - 4. CAC members may propose relevant changes from the floor to any proposed amendment under consideration on the agenda.
 - 5. The CAC adopts the proposed amendment(s) by a majority vote of the members present at the CAC meeting.

Five Central Florida Cities Enhance Unique Uber Pilot Introducing Discounted Inter-City Travel

Starting today, Altamonte Springs, Lake Mary, Longwood, Maitland & Sanford launch an inter-city mobility pilot & will pay 20 percent of Uber fares for trips between any of the five cities.

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS, Fla. (August 21, 2017) – Today the cities of Altamonte Springs, Lake Mary, Longwood, Maitland and Sanford launched a first-of-its-kind inter-city pilot, offering discounted Uber trips to travel between the five cities. This innovative public private partnership (P3) between the cities and Uber changes the mobility conversation and provides a national model for P3 transportation programs.

The cities created an organization called the Municipal Mobility Working Group (MMWG) through an interlocal agreement to bring our regional residents convenient, door-to-door service, self-ordered and boundaryless transportation. The MMWG launched the first intracity mobility pilot with Uber in 2016. Demand grew progressively throughout Phase 1 of the pilot, which was launched to prove local governments could work effectively with global technology partners to deliver alternative transit solutions for residents. In turn, the cities provided discount fares for trips taken within their own respective cities to encourage use.

Throughout Phase 1, residents showed there was true value in ride sharing and a need for diverse transportation options throughout the region. Convenience appeared to be a key element of this pilot. Data showed a 74 percent increase in Uber trips during the first year of the program in Altamonte Springs, Longwood, Lake Mary, Maitland, and Sanford.

"By providing people with an attractive transportation option, Uber is helping to drive a fundamental shift in the way people get around," said Kasra Moshkani, General Manager for Uber in Florida. "We look forward to continuing to work with these Central Florida cities to complement transit options by extending the reach of transit systems and offering residents a reliable, affordable alternative to driving."

We learned:

- Residents travel across our cities to live, work and play without regard to jurisdictional lines.
- How to work with innovative private sector partners.
- There was a need for further pilot study for inter-city/boundaryless transit.

With today's launch of Phase 2 of the pilot, the cities will extend their innovative program to provide travel incentives that suit residents' lifestyles, while also studying the benefits of intercity movement.



- Each city will continue to pay 20 percent of Uber fares that end within their respective city limits.
- Cities will pay 25 percent of the cost of rides that begin or end at the SunRail station inside of their city.
- For the pilot extension, each city will also pay 20 percent of Uber fares of a trip that begins in another city and ends in their city.

The unique addition of this pilot allows Maitland residents to check out the nightlife in downtown Lake Mary; for an Altamonte Springs resident who wants to take an Uber to the Sanford International Airport; for a Longwood resident to shop at the Altamonte Mall.

"One of the key takeaways from the first year is that we recognized that people don't travel in a box" said Frank Martz, Altamonte Springs City Manager. "Residents travel regionally for work, shopping or dining and think of the five cities as one area rather than separate entities. For the MMWG cities, innovation has become the rule rather than the exception and we think taxpayers expect that from government."

The pilot project with Uber sparked national and international interest in how local governments can think outside the box to come up with creative solutions to meet the needs of residents. More than 50 North American cities and several international cities have shown interest in the project and want to discuss what aspects of the program they might mirror. The next phase of the Uber pilot will build upon the initial project's success and allow the MMWG to evaluate different alternatives as they work to meet the demands of residents and build thriving communities.

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Transportation Projects for which Federal Funds Were Obligated During FY 2016/17

This document contains a list of transportation projects in the MetroPlan Orlando region (Orange, Osceola and Seminole Counties) for which federal funds were obligated during FY 2016/17. This was prepared in order to meet a federal requirement for MPO's under Title 23, Chapter 1, Subchapter E, Part 450.334 of the Code of Federal Regulations, which states:

(a) In metropolitan planning areas, on an annual basis, no later than 90 calendar days following the end of the program year, the State, public transportation operator(s), and the MPO shall cooperatively develop a listing of projects (including investments in pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities) for which funds under 23 U.S.C. or 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 were obligated in the preceding program year.

(b) The listing shall be prepared in accordance with §450.314(a) and shall include all federally funded projects authorized or revised to increase obligations in the preceding program year, and shall at a minimum include the TIP information under §450.326(g)(1) and (4) and identify, for each project, the amount of Federal funds requested in the TIP, the Federal funding that was obligated during the preceding year, and the Federal funding remaining and available for subsequent years.

(c) The listing shall be published or otherwise made available in accordance with the MPO's public participation criteria for the TIP.

This pertains to the fact that the federal fiscal year runs from October through September while the fiscal year of most MPOs runs from July through June. As a result, those projects for which funds were obligated during July through September 2016 would be shown as programmed during FY 2016/17 according to the federal fiscal year, but would be shown as programmed during FY 2017/18 according to the MPO fiscal year. Therefore, this legislation ensures that the projects in each MPO's TIP for which federal funds were obligated during the preceding fiscal year are published in a list that matches the federal fiscal year time period.

The highway projects are shown on pages 4-6, Transportation Systems Management and Operations projects are shown on page 7, bicycle and pedestrian projects are shown on pages 8 and 9 and planning projects are shown on page 10. These categories of projects are all listed by county. In addition, the transit and aviation projects are shown on pages 11 and 12 respectively. The amounts of federal funding for these projects and the funding sources (codes) are shown in separate columns on the spreadsheets. (Many of these projects also utilized funds from state and local sources, which are not shown in this document.) The explanations for the funding codes and project phases contained in this document are shown on pages 2-3.

SUBJECT: 2017 Population Estimates

The official 2017 population estimates have been released by the University of Florida's Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR). The attached table compares 2016 and 2017 figures for our 3-county area, our neighboring counties and the State of Florida.

Highlights are as follows:

- From 2016 to 2017, there was a 2.63% increase in the population of our 3-county area which is up slightly from 2015-2016 (2.43%). This is a net increase of 54,000 new residents in the past year – or more than 1,000 new residents each week.
- Osceola County continues to have the highest rate of growth (+4.57%). This is extraordinary, although consistent with earlier forecasts and future projections. People arriving from Puerto Rico as a result of the hurricane are likely to result in an even higher rate of growth in the year ahead.
- The municipality with the largest increase (excluding Bay Lake) was the City of St. Cloud (+4.87%). A majority of Seminole County residents (52%) live in municipalities; a majority of Orange County residents (64%) and Osceola County residents (66%) live in unincorporated areas.
- When we look at our 10-county region that is covered by the Central Florida MPO Alliance:
 - The growth rate from 2016 to 2017 was 2.06% which held constant from 2015-2016. This
 reflects continuing improvement in the region's economy with all counties experiencing some
 growth.
 - This growth rate exceeded the rate for the entire State of Florida (1.67%) and nearly 30% of the state's population growth occurred in our 10-county region.

These population figures will be used to develop our Unified Planning Work Program for 2018/2019 and our budget for next year.

Board Meeting Highlights – November 8, 2017

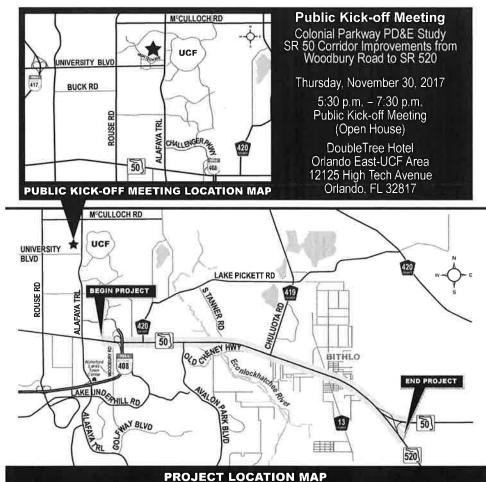
