

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Tom O'Hanlon called the Community Advisory Committee meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Bill Dehlinger led the Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. CHAIRMAN'S COMMENTS

Chairman O'Hanlon welcomed everyone and called attention to a group of University of Central Florida students who were attending the meeting.

IV. AGENDA REVIEW

Ms. Cynthia Lambert told CAC members that today's meeting was the final meeting for 2017. She called attention to the holiday drop-in reception December 14th from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. Ms. Lambert congratulated Mr. R.J. Mueller on UCF achieving Bronze status from the League of American Bicyclists. She thanked Chairman O'Hanlon for his service as Chairman for 2016 and 2017.

V. CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Cathy Goldfarb confirmed that a quorum was present.

VI. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ACTION ITEMS

None.

University of Central Florida students attending the CAC meeting as part of a class assignment introduced themselves.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of October 25, 2017 Meeting Minutes

Approval was requested of the October 25, 2017 meeting minutes, which were provided.

MOTION: Mr. Atlee Mercer moved approval of the October 25, 2017 meeting minutes. Mr. Tony Tizzio seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

B. FDOT Amendment to FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program: TSMO Projects, Railroad Crossing Projects, & Ronald Reagan Blvd.

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested the CAC to recommend that the FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 TIP be amended to include new funding for three TSMO projects, five railroad crossing projects, and improvements to CR 427/Ronald Reagan Blvd. in Longwood. A letter from FDOT explaining the amendment request was provided, along with a fact sheet prepared by MetroPlan Orlando staff and the draft resolution to be presented at the December 13th Board meeting.

MOTION: Fr. Jabriel Ballentine moved approval of the amendments to the FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 TIP. Mr. Dan Stephens seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

C. Revisions to CAC Bylaws on Policy for Alternates

The current CAC bylaws allow for local government appointees to have alternates, but do not provide a process for MetroPlan Orlando appointees. The revisions in section 4-A added two non-voting alternate seats to the CAC. A new process was outlined on page three for how MetroPlan Orlando appointees could have alternates vote in their places. Ms. Lambert reviewed the draft policy being presented. She told CAC members that the two alternates would attend meetings in a non-voting capacity, unless staff is notified that a member cannot attend. The first two members who indicate they are unable to attend, she added, would have the benefit of an alternate sitting in for them and voting. The member would then not receive an absence. Discussion ensued regarding an alternate voting as directed by the person they are representing, alternates only voting if there is a quorum, intent of the alternate policy to save the seat and who would select the alternates, Ms. Lambert told CAC members that the alternate would vote whether there is a quorum or not and selection of the alternates would go through the same appointment process as MPO appointees with the MetroPlan Orlando Board approving any recommended appointees. She added that the bylaws had some additional revisions that were clerical in nature.

MOTION: Mr. Atlee Mercer moved approval of the revisions to the CAC bylaws. Ms. Theresa Mott seconded the motion, which passed 18:4 (Hauck, Lessard and Legacy-Cole voted no, Ballentine abstained)

D. CAC New Member Application Review Subcommittee

Action was requested to appoint a CAC New Member Application Review Subcommittee. The subcommittee would review applications for CAC vacancies and make recommendations on new members at the January 2018 CAC meeting. Mr. Dan Stephens, Mr. T.J. Legacy-Cole, Mr. Tom

O'Hanlon, Mr. Tony Tizzio, Ms. Sarah Elbadri, Mr. R.J. Mueller and Mr. Hector Lizasuain volunteered to serve on the New Member Application Review Subcommittee.

MOTION: Fr. Jabriel Ballentine moved approval of the appointees to the New Member Application Review Subcommittee. Mr. T.J. Legacy-Cole seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

E. Election of CAC Officers for 2018

Action was requested to approve the Officer Selection Subcommittee's nominations for the CAC Chairman and Vice-Chairman for 2018. Nominations could also be taken from the floor. Mr. Brindley Pieters reported that the Officer Selection Subcommittee met just prior to the CAC meeting and recommended Mr. Rob McKey, current Vice-Chair, be nominated to serve as Chairman for 2018. Mr. McKey declined due to other commitments. The floor was opened for nominations for Chairman. Mr. Tony Tizzio requested to be considered for Chairman and Mr. Bill Dehlinger nominated Mr. Atlee Mercer. Ms. Sarah Elbadri had notified Ms. Lambert of her interest in serving as Chair or Vice-Chair for CAC. Mr. Dan Stephens expressed interest in serving as Vice-Chair. Ms. Lambert called attention to the rotation of counties that is followed for officers and since the outgoing Chairman was from Seminole County, another Seminole County representative could not serve as Chairman, thereby eliminating Mr. Tizzio from consideration. Ms. Elbadri and Mr. Mercer spoke briefly about their background and interest to serve as Chair. CAC members were polled by a show of hands and Mr. Mercer won the nomination 12:10. Ms. Lambert explained the responsibilities of the CAC Chairman and Vice-Chair.

MOTION: Mr. Atlee Mercer moved approval of nominating Ms. Sarah Elbadri as Vice-Chair. Ms. Theresa Mott seconded the motion. The motion was withdrawn.

The floor was opened for additional nominations for Vice-Chair. Ms. Theresa Mott nominated Mr. Tony Tizzio. Mr. Dan Stephens withdrew as a candidate for Vice-Chair. Mr. T. J. Legacy-Cole expressed concerns about the nomination process as it had been conducted. CAC members were polled by a show of hands on the two candidates nominated for Vice-Chair and Ms. Elbadri won 17:4.

MOTION: Fr. Jabriel Ballentine moved approval of Mr. Atlee Mercer serving as Chairman and Ms. Sarah Elbadri serving as Vice-Chair for 2018. Ms. Theresa Mott seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

VIII. PRESENTATIONS AND STATUS REPORTS

A. Presentation on 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan Amendments

Mr. Nick Lepp, MetroPlan Orlando staff, gave a presentation on a set of locally funded Orange County highway projects that have been added to the 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan through an administrative amendment. No action by the committees and board was needed to add these projects to the LRTP since the projects didn't involve any federal or state funds. Mr. Lepp also explained the implementation of performance measures in order to meet the new federal requirements in the FAST Act. He requested two volunteers from the CAC to serve on a subcommittee to provide citizen input on development of a set of interim Transportation Performance Measures for the 2040 LRTP. Mr. Dan Stephens and Mr. Adam Valencic volunteered to serve on the Performance Measures Subcommittee. Mr. Lepp told committee

members that four meetings had been scheduled for the Subcommittee to meet.

B. Presentation on Wekiva Parkway Project

Ms. Mary Brooks, Quest Corporation of America, Inc., gave a presentation on the current status of the Wekiva Parkway project Ms. Brooks provided background information on the 25-mile, \$1.6 billion project, which will complete the beltway around the Orlando area. She noted that the project included all electronic tolling and there will be non-tolled roads running parallel for local access. Ms. Brooks reviewed the sections of the Wekiva Parkway project, which agency was responsible and the status of the sections. She detailed efforts to protect wildlife in the area and aesthetics that would be included. Mr. Bill Dehlinger requested the map that provided information on the sections and their proposed opening dates. Ms. Brooks responded that she would provide the requested information. Discussion ensued regarding the construction crew's ability to deal with wildlife, the use of only electronic tolling, and securing adequate workers for the project. Ms. Brooks told CAC members that crews receive wildlife training and there is a wildlife expert on staff. She added that there is an option to toll by plate if someone does not have a tolling device and labor has been a challenge.

C. Presentation on Current LYNX Activities

Ms. Tiffany Homler Hawkins, CAO of LYNX, gave a presentation on the latest LYNX activities that are under way. She told CAC members that Mr. Edward Johnson took over as CEO of LYNX in May 2016 and he has worked on developing areas of major emphasis for 2017. Ms. Homler Hawkins covered the five areas of emphasis which included enhance communications, improve service efficiency, establish more partnerships, improve customer confidence in the system and increase brand recognition and community involvement. She noted that major corridors remained the same in LYNX's 2030 Vision Plan as they had since 1989. Ms. Homler Hawkins provided information on the LYNX Forward Transit Development Plan and Route Optimization Study, as well as the Mobility Management Plan for paratransit. She called attention to new technology that LYNX has developed including the bus tracker app and mobile payment option. Chairman O'Hanlon asked if ridership numbers had increased due to bus tracker app. Ms. Homler Hawkins responded that there was not enough data available at this time to determine if ridership had increased. She reported that LYNX's 2018 emphasis will be on how to advance projects. Vice-Chairman Rob McKey asked if there had been any improvement in connections to SunRail. Ms. Homler Hawkins responded that the connectivity to SunRail is improving. Mr. Tony Tizzio commented that in regard to paratransit service, the former head of the service was brought back and MV had once again been awarded the service contract, and asked what did LYNX plan to do differently in the future for that service? Committee members commented on the leap into the future that LYNX has taken with the new technology being offered. Discussion ensued regarding LYNX considering a buy in from external partner, electric and autonomous buses and current ridership numbers. Ms. Homler Hawkins told CAC members electric buses that had been tested in the past could only run for a few hours and now were improved, but had limited seat capacity. She added that LYMMO would be transitioning to electric buses. Ms. Homler Hawkins noted that autonomous buses still required an attendant to be on board and LYNX bus ridership was 90,000 per day, which was about a 7% decrease and followed the trend nationwide. The decline, she added, was mostly due to declining gas prices.

IX. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Press Release on Phase 2 of Uber Pilot Program with Five Seminole Cities

At the previous CAC meeting, Mr. Hauck, CAC representative from Altamonte Springs, shared with the committee that five cities in Seminole County were entering phase two of a pilot program with Uber, where ride discounts would be offered for travel within those cities. A press release with more information was provided.

B. FDOT Monthly Construction Status Report

The latest FDOT monthly construction status report for the Orlando area was provided.

C. Variance Report on Currently Adopted and New Tentative Five Year Work Programs

A report from FDOT showing projects included in both the FY 2017/18 – 2021/22 Adopted Five Year Work Program and the FY 2018/19 – 2022/23 Tentative Five Year Work Program that were either advanced, deferred, deleted, or moved out during the four common years (FY 2018/19 – 2021/22) of the two Work Programs was provided.

D. FY 2016/17 Federally Funded Projects

A list of the highway, transit and aviation projects in the Orlando Urban Area for which Federal funding was obligated during FY 2016/17 was prepared in order to meet the federal requirement for MPO's. A memo from Mr. Barley dated November 2017 along with a copy of MetroPlan Orlando's 2018 appreciation calendar were provided at the meeting.

Ms. Lambert called attention to the press release on phase 2 of the Uber program in Altamonte Springs. She told committee members that at the end of the pilot program, when more information is available, a presentation will be scheduled.

Mr. Dan Stephens questioned the funding amounts on some of the federally funded projects. In addition, he apologized if he appeared to make light of the officer nomination process and stated that he only withdrew to facilitate the process.

A. Next Community Advisory Committee meeting

The next CAC meeting was scheduled on January 24, 2018. There was no meeting scheduled in December.

B. Volunteer Appreciation Reception & Toy Drive

Florida's Turnpike Enterprise held a Colonial Parkway PD&E public kick-off meeting on Thursday, November 30, 2017 from 5:30-7:30 p.m. at the DoubleTree Hotel Orlando East-UCF Area (12125 High Tech Ave., Orlando, FL 32817). Additional information was provided.

XI. MEMBER COMMENTS

Vice-Chairman McKey thanked CAC members for their support during his term as Vice-Chair.

Chairman O'Hanlon commented on a recent grant Orlando Police Department received and asked if there was any more specific information on the grant.

Mr. Brindley Pieters thanked Chairmen O'Hanlon for his service as Chairman.

Ms. Sarah Elbadri asked about the request for proposals (RFP) that is currently active. Ms. Lambert responded the RFP is for a search firm for candidates to replace Mr. Harry Barley when he retires in August 2018. She added that the recruitment plan is available on the MetroPlan Orlando website.

Mr. Atlee Mercer thanked CAC members for their support in electing him Chairman for 2018 and wished everyone happy holidays.



RESOLUTION NO. 18-01

SUBJECT:

Amendment to the FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program

WHEREAS, the Orlando Urbanized Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), d.b.a. MetroPlan Orlando, is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the Orlando Urbanized Area, including the Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is requesting to amend the FY 2016/17-2020/21 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) in accordance with the MetroPlan Orlando Internal Operating Procedures; and

WHEREAS, the requested amendment is described as follows:

Orange County

- FM #4084292 SR 15 (US 600/17-92) Orlando Avenue in Winter Park Access Management Improvements and Widen Sidewalks – Change project limits

I took an interest in city planning and transportation after my first work trip to London. As someone who is easily stressed and depressed by the normal auto commute, I was blown away by how different the experience of navigating a city by walking and public transportation can be. I felt invigorated and encountered so many more people throughout my day instead of boxing myself inside my car to and from work. When I returned to Orlando, I wanted to implement the way of life that I experienced in cities like London and Amsterdam, but I quickly realized it was simply impossible. The joy I experienced in Europe was eclipsed by my reality of a lonely commute witnessing all the roadkill on either side of 417 each day.

Instead of complaining about the situation, I decided to become more educated on how and why things are this way. I wanted to understand what brought us to this point, as one of the most dangerous areas for pedestrians in the United States. I began reading books on city planning, the history of transportation, our addiction to the auto industry, and activist movements in other major cities geared toward pedestrian and cyclist safety. I attended several workshops, including the Citizen Planner Academy and the Sustainability Summits. I learned how something as inexpensive as painting bike lanes at conflict points could save so many lives, just by making drivers more aware. I know that simple solutions to our problems exist, and are not far from reach.

For me, traffic is inconvenient and lonely. However for some it is simply not an option. This became apparent to me when my sister, an epileptic, lost her license in 2015. After a string of seizures made her dangerous behind the wheel, I was opened to the world of the disabled and disadvantaged, and how difficult our current transportation system makes life for them. Getting to her doctor's appointments is a 30-minute drive, or a two-hour bus ride. Forget walking or riding her bike, it's simply not feasible due to high traffic volume roadways with little to no pedestrian/bicyclist facilities. She has completely lost her self-confidence now that she must rely on others for means of transportation. It's heartbreaking to see her quality of life reduced here, knowing that in a higher density area she might thrive.

When I learned Central Florida was considering road diets for areas near my home, I jumped on the opportunity to get involved. Orlando is my home, and I don't want to move to other cities that have their transportation figured out, I want to bring those tools and resources that have proven successful to our city to improve the lives of residents here. I started attending the MetroPlan meetings for Corrine Dr. and it has been rewarding to be a part of the process, even if it is just one voice. I think volunteering as a CAC member would be incredibly fulfilling and provide me with the opportunity to directly contribute to my community. I've already shared my passion with everyone around me, but having a platform such as this committee to stand on and bring valuable, useful, and relevant information to my peers would give me a great sense of purpose.
