

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Atlee Mercer called the Community Advisory Committee meeting to order at 9:35 a.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Tom O'Hanlon led the Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. CHAIRMAN'S COMMENTS

Chairman Mercer welcomed everyone and spoke briefly about the proposed tax referendum effort in Osceola County. He told CAC members that Mr. O'Hanlon had a short video on Autonomous Vehicles that committee members viewed. Mr. O'Hanlon spoke briefly about the cost savings of electric cars.

IV. AGENDA REVIEW

Ms. Cynthia Lambert reported that the Colonial Overpass has opened. She thanked retiring CAC member, Mr. Rob McKey, for his many years of service. Ms. Lambert told CAC members that Mr. Tony Tizzio was ill and unable to attend, so she would be providing the report on the New Member Subcommittee recommendations.

V. CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Cathy Goldfarb confirmed that a quorum was present.

VI. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ACTION ITEMS

None.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of February 27, 2019 Meeting Minutes

Approval was requested of the February 27, 2019 meeting minutes, which were provided.

MOTION: Ms. Theresa Mott moved for approval of the February 27, 2019 meeting minutes. Mr. Tom O'Hanlon seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

B. FDOT Amendment to FY 2018/2019-2022/23 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested the CAC to recommend that the FY 2018/19 - 2022/23 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) be amended to include two new railroad crossing safety projects in Orange County and the construction funding for a traffic operations project on SR 436 from Boston Avenue to east of Anchor Road in Altamonte Springs. A letter from FDOT and a fact sheet explaining the amendment request were provided. Mr. Jeff Piggrem asked whether the West Colonial crossing project was being coordinated with the City of Orlando's quiet zone project. Ms. Rakinya Hinson reported that the project included signal enhancements. A request was made for staff to research whether coordination is being done on this project.

MOTION:

Mr. Tom O'Hanlon moved for approval of the FDOT Amendment to FY 2018/2019-2022/23 Transportation Improvement Program with the request that information be provided on FDOT/City of Orlando coordination efforts on the West Colonial crossing project. Mr. Scott Zubarik seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

C. CAC New Member Recommendations

Action was requested to recommend four new members for vacant MetroPlan Orlando appointee seats on CAC: three voting multimodal advocates (Henri Hodge, Nilisa Council, Theo Webster) and one non-voting alternate (Douglas Henley). The CAC New Member Application Review Subcommittee met on April 10, 2019 to review applications and make recommendations to the CAC. Two items were provided: 1) Applications for the four recommended new members; and 2) A memo that was sent to the subcommittee on April 3, which included all new member applications that were received. Ms. Lambert reported that the Subcommittee met on April 10th and reviewed the application based on demographic needs for CAC. The recommended candidates, she added, fit the diversity needs that would help make CAC more inclusive. The new member recommendations would go to the MetroPlan Orlando Board for approval at the May 8th Board meeting.

MOTION:

Mr. Tom O'Hanlon moved for approval of the recommendations for new CAC multimodal advocates and one non-voting alternate. Ms. Theresa Mott seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

VIII. PRESENTATIONS AND STATUS REPORTS

A. Presentation on Voyage (Door-to-door Autonomous Taxi Service)

Dr. Dean Bushey, Voyage, gave a presentation on Voyage, which brings communities together with self-driving cars by enabling residents to summon an autonomous vehicle and move effortlessly from point A to point B. Prior to expanding to The Villages in Sumter County, Voyage operated a handful of self-driving cars in a San Jose, California-based retirement community. Dr. Bushey provided an overview of a current demonstration project in The Villages (Florida), home

to over 125,000 residents. Dr. Bushey reported that Voyage provides an alternative means of transportation for those who cannot or choose not to drive. He provided background information on the program including the staff team, benefits of the service, technology, safety measures and staff contact information. Discussion ensued regarding lack of diversity, rider assistance, ADA compliance, and cost for the service, liability issues, storage on board and availability of a bike rack.

B. Follow-Up: Information on Kirkman Road Extension

Mr. Alex Trauger, MetroPlan Orlando staff, presented information that was requested at the February 27th Community Advisory Committee on the 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan modification related to the Kirkman Road extension. Mr. Trauger provided information on the project limits, including the actual termini at Destination Parkway. He told CAC members that connection to Destination Parkway was included Orange County's LRTP for 2030 and that a study would kick off soon for the extension, which would connect to a proposed Intermodal Center.

C. Presentation on Silver Star Road Corridor Study in Ocoee

Mr. Nick Lepp, MetroPlan Orlando staff, gave a presentation on the Silver Star Road Corridor Study in Ocoee, which was recently completed. Mr. Lepp reviewed a map of the area and the purpose of the study. He provided information on the downtown Ocoee Master Plan and the proposed build alternatives. Mr. Lepp noted that the enhanced grid alternative was chosen, since it met all of the goals. He reviewed the schedule for the study and next steps, noting that design for the project was proposed in the next couple of years.

XI. MEMBER COMMENTS

Mr. R.J. Mueller commented that Lime Bikes will be leaving UCF at the end of the semester and they will be looking for a replacement bike share program on campus. He noted that bike litter was an issue with the dockless bikes and electric scooters were not a good option due to speed issues.

Mr. Nick Lepp addressed the railroad crossing question from the TIP amendment discussion. He told committee members that Quiet Zone funding focused on SunRail, whereas the TIP amendment funds were being used on other crossings outside the SunRail corridor.

Ms. Theresa Mott reported that the Apopka Art and Foliage Festival was scheduled for April 27th and 28th and she encouraged CAC members to attend.

Mr. Rob McKey asked about any plans to widen the section of the Turnpike from Oakland tp I-75. Staff will look into this question and respond.

Ms. Cynthia Lambert told CAC members that she recently met with a representative from JUMP, Uber's electric bike share division, and they may be entering the local market.

Mr. Tom O'Hanlon thanked Mr. McKey for his service.

Ms. Karolyn Campbell reported that the Bike Five Cities event was May 4th and participants could bike the entire route or start at any of the participating cities.

Mr. Jeff Piggrem commented that he appreciates Nick and Alex's efforts. He questioned whether work widening Sand Lake Road at Kirkman Road was going to be eliminated once the Kirkman Road extension was constructed resulting in funding being wasted. Mr. Piggrem wanted to know how this issue could be mitigated by FDOT in the future.

Ms. Venise White commented that Seminole Health Department recently held their 5th Annual 5K, Live, Work, Move, and she offered kudos to the City of Casselberry for their complete street efforts.

Ms. Sarah Elbadri called attention to MetroPlan Orlando's Corrine Drive public meeting being held May 1st.

XII. PUBLIC COMMENTS (GENERAL)

Mr. David Bottomley commented that the dockless bicycles are left scattered around and there needs to be a clear four foot path to meet ADA requirements. In addition, he commented that by his interpretation of section four of the CAC bylaws a quorum should be sixteen and that quorum has not always been met. Ms. Lambert reported that there is a phone number to call to have improperly placed dockless bicycles picked up.

XIII. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:09 a.m.

Subject: May 2019 Bicycle & Pedestrian Activity Update

Orange County

Progress has been made on the construction of Shingle Creek Trail Phase I, Segment I (Grand Opening held in January 2019), with Phase I, Segment 3 and Phase 2 both planned for construction in FY19/20 (4.7 mi of trails). There are an additional 4.4 miles of the Shingle Creek Trail currently being designed. Other trails that are in or have recently concluded the planning stage include Pine Hills Trail Phase II, Lake Apopka Connector Trail, West Orange Trail Phase IV and Little Econ Greenway Gap Trail.

Leading Pedestrian Intervals — Orange County is utilizing a consultant to provide the warrant analysis for 20 intersections and within a 2 mile radius of 5 schools that have high incidents of pedestrian and bicycle crashes. The County is also working on the development of a policy that allows for LPI's to be implemented in areas that fall under the certain context classifications without a warrant analysis and developing a policy to screen intersections for future LPI implementation.

Wheatley Road Safety Audit — Orange County is completing fieldwork for an area wide safety study near the South Apopka area.

Safety Outreach — Orange County is installing safety messages on traffic signal cabinets in high-crash areas, like John Young/Oak Ridge, and sidewalk pavement safety messages at UCF, Valencia College, and Full Sail University.

School Zones — Orange County is completing studies of all school zones for implementation of current FDOT standards and programming improvements.

Pedestrian Studies and Improvements — Orange County is completing a pedestrian study of the Wyndham Lakes area and improvements to the pedestrian features of the Wyndham Lakes roundabout are currently under construction.

Raised Pedestrian Crossings – Orange County has installed one raised crosswalk at a school crossing and is installing two more also at school crossings.

Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Action Plan — Orange County will be starting a second phase in this fiscal year to define low-stress networks for bicycling, develop implementation strategies and performance measures, and conduct public outreach.

Sand Lake Road and Pine Hills Road Safety Improvements — Orange County has received bids for engineering services for final design of improvements and will be awarding these contracts shortly.

ProjectTrak — Orange County has implemented an online mapping website at http://www.ocfl.net/projecttrak that provides updates on transportation, safety, and other projects.

Osceola County

The County is completing the final edits to the Trails Master Plan that will build upon the existing and planned trail assessment in order to develop a comprehensive list of all potential trail projects throughout the Osceola County Trail Network Focus Area. In addition to the Trails Master Plan, Osceola County Transportation & Transit is hard at work on a variety of pedestrian & bicycle safety projects including Safe Route to School sidewalks and a concept feasibility study that will inform the design of a multi-use path connecting NeoCity, Downtown Kissimmee, and the Neptune Road area. Lastly, Osceola County is working with the folks at Best Foot Forward again this year conducting pedestrian safety operations around the County to educate drivers and save lives.

Seminole County

Under Design:

Lake Monroe Trail Loop – 3.5 mile trail along the east side of Mellonville Avenue and the north side of Celery Avenue from Sanford's Riverwalk to SR 415 wide sidewalk trail connection.

Cross Seminole Trail Missing Link (Winter Springs) – 0.7 mile trail connecting two sections of the Cross Seminole Trail.

EE Williams Trail - 1.4 mile trail along EE Williams Road from SWT to Lake Emma Road.

Construction:

Seminole/Wekiva Trail – Longwood Markham Road – 1.5 mile Trail along Longwood Markham Road connecting the Seminole/Wekiva Trail to the future Wekiva Parkway Trail
