I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Jeffrey Campbell welcomed everyone and called the Community Advisory Committee meeting to order at 9:34 a.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Campbell led the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence for victims of hurricane Ian and a recent shooting.

III. CHAIRMAN'S COMMENTS

Chairman Campbell detailed the public comment procedures. He welcomed two new CAC members, Ms. Patricia Colloca Massot and Ms. TeNeika Neasman. Ms. Colloca Massot and Ms. Neasman spoke briefly about themselves. Chairman Campbell told CAC members that his cousin, Jessica Watkins, a NASA astronaut, recently returned from her stay on the space station. He recognized Ms. Venise White, who spoke briefly about her new role as President of the Florida Public Health Association. Chairman Campbell noted that he had been a CAC member for a number of years, and he thanked members old and new for their service. He called attention to CAC members being respectful of time during meetings. He noted that while passion regarding subjects is commendable, it is important to have a variety of views in the conversation. He added that presenters are partners and guests, and members should listen and ask questions but refrain from grilling them or making them feel unwelcome. Member comment time is always included on the agenda for members to make comments.

IV. AGENDA REVIEW

Ms. Mary Ann Horne reminded CAC members that meetings required an in-person quorum and emphasized the importance of RSVPs for the meetings. She noted the addition of the two new members, Ms. Patricia Colloca Massot and Ms. TeNeika Neasman, along with the resignation of Mr.

Brady Lessard. Ms. Horne told CAC members that an Active Transportation Workshop was scheduled immediately following adjournment of the CAC Meeting. She added that approval of an officer selection subcommittee was on the agenda and the subcommittee would meet virtually sometime in November. Ms. Horne called attention to two upcoming Mobility Week events sponsored by MetroPlan Orlando including “Air Time,” a webinar on Central Florida’s air quality, and the Blind Experience, which highlighted challenges of vision-impaired pedestrians. She reported that approval of the 2023 meeting schedule was the third action item on the agenda although some dates for the board and other committees may change, CAC would be approving the CAC meeting dates on the schedule. Ms. Horne told committee members there were no changes to the agenda.

A. Approval of CAC Meeting Minutes: August 24, 2022

MOTION: Dr. Casmore Shaw moved for approval of meeting minutes from August 24, 2022. Mr. R.J. Mueller seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

B. Appointment of Officer Selection Subcommittee

Action was requested to approve the establishment of a subcommittee to select candidates to serve as the CAC Chairman and Vice-Chairman from January through December 2023. The subcommittee will meet virtually during November to come up with a slate that will be voted on at the Dec. 7 CAC meeting. Chairman Campbell requested volunteers from each of the three counties to serve on the CAC Officer Selection Subcommittee. Dr. Casmore Shaw, Mr. R.J. Mueller and Mr. Jeffrey Boebinger volunteered to serve.

MOTION: Mr. Tom O’Hanlon moved for approval of the Officer Selection Subcommittee. Ms. Gigi Moorman seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Mr. Slade Downs, MetroPlan staff, introduced Ms. Kathrin Tellez, Fehr & Peers, who gave an overview of the Active Transportation Plan (ATP) currently under development and provided information on the ATP workshop. Ms. Tellez provided an introduction to the Active Transportation Plan along with its definition and the five key tasks. She reported on the prep work for the plan and the timeline. Ms. Tellez noted that public engagement will be conducted throughout the plan's development. She reviewed the data that they already had, what they needed from CAC and how CAC members could provide their feedback. Ms. Tellez told CAC Members that the information will be provided at the public meetings in both English and Spanish. She reviewed how they will use the data collected and where to find the data along with contact information. Discussion ensued regarding how new technology will affect work on the plan and how to assess walkability and different levels of traffic stress.

Mr. Tom O'Hanlon commented that he uses full self-driving when driving his Tesla and is confident enough to let others use it now. He said he has been training his car to function autonomously and predicted this technology will be released for general use in the near future. He added that economical mini electric buses could also be available in the near future.

Dr. Casmore Shaw asked jokingly if Mr. O'Hanlon was a registered agent for Tesla.

Mr. R.J. Mueller commented that autonomous vehicles are already in service at UCF and Lake Nona.

Ms. Judy Pizzo commented that she would like to see the cost of the Tesla convertible model reduced.

Ms. Marissa Salas commented that there are a lot of interesting things going on and there is a need to re-educate on restructuring highways. There are efforts in other cities to dismantle segregated areas and bring roads down to ground level. She added that there is a new transportation bill being introduced to secure funding to build less and be more equitable in level.

Action Requested: FDOT requests approval of an amendment to the FY 2022/23 - 2026/27 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Reason: Funding is being increased for one existing transit project and two new transit projects are being added to the TIP.

Summary/Key Information: Regarding Items of particular significance for our Committees and the Board, the amendment:

- Increases funding and rolls forward funds from the previous fiscal year for LYNX's upgrade to the LYMMO system.
- Adds a new LYNX Bus and Bus Facilities capital program project. This will include the purchase of 20 electric buses, 5 electric NeighborLink vehicles, and additional electric charging facilities.
- Adds a new LYNX Transit Oriented Development planning program grant for the SR 436 corridor. The grant will be used for LYNX, in partnership with the City of Orlando, to study nine proposed bus rapid transit stations along 6.25 miles of SR 436 terminating at the Orlando International Airport.

Dear Mr. Huttman:

Florida Department of Transportation requests MetroPlan Orlando amend the FY 2022/23-2026/27 TIP to reflect project changes as described below.

Project #424255-1 is funded by FTA for the Central Florida Regional Transit Authority (CFRTA/DBA LYNX) LYMMO upgrade. An increase in annual formula allocations have been added and funds from previous years need to be rolled forward for the project in FY 23, which creates an increase of more than \$2M and 20% of the total project cost.

Project #451939-1 is funded by FTA for LYNX through the Bus and Bus Facilities program. This is a new project recently added to the FDOT Five-Year Work Program therefore it must also be listed in the TIP.

Project #451947-1 is funded by FTA for LYNX through the Transit-oriented Development Planning program for SR 436. This is a new project recently added to the FDOT Five-Year Work Program therefore it must also be listed in the TIP.

**Amendment to the FY 2022/23 - 2026/27
Transportation Improvement Program**

WHEREAS, the Orlando Urbanized Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), d.b.a. MetroPlan Orlando, is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the Orlando Urbanized Area, including the Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is requesting to amend the FY 2022/23 - 2026/27 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) in accordance with the MetroPlan Orlando Internal Operating Procedures; and

WHEREAS, the requested amendments are described as follows:

Orange County

- FM #424255-1 – LYNX Section 5309 LYMMO Upgrade - Funding consists of \$12,000,000 in FTA funds and \$2,800,000 in LF funds for capital improvements in FY 2022/23;
- FM #451939-1 – LYNX Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities - Funding consists of \$16,132,025 in FTA funds and \$4,033,006 in LF funds for capital purchases in FY 2022/23;
- FM #451947-1 – LYNX FTA Transit Oriented Development Planning for SR 436 – Funding consists of \$300,000 in FTA funds and \$75,000 in LF funds for capital improvements in FY 2022/23; and

WHEREAS, the requested amendments described above are consistent with MetroPlan Orlando's project priorities and currently adopted Long Range Transportation Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the MetroPlan Orlando Board that the Florida Department of Transportation's amendment to the FY 2022/23 - 2026/27 TIP be approved as requested.

Reason: MetroPlan Orlando staff is proposing these Plan Revisions to include fully funded Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) projects in the Existing-plus-Committed network, incorporate new federal revenues and discretionary funding grants awarded within the region, and other miscellaneous changes based on local agency feedback.

Summary/Key Information: Requested amendments / modifications will be made to the *Cost Feasible Plan: Strategies, Programs* documentation of the adopted 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan. Items of particular significance for our Committees and the Board are as follows:

- Tables 6, 9, 11, 12, and 13, updated for consistency with the TIP.
- Tables 11, 12, and 13 revised to include new federal revenues (IJA TMA and Carbon Reduction funds).
- Table 13 and 15 updated to include new three new federal discretionary grants awarded to partners within the region.
- Table 7 and 8 revised to segment the Poinciana Parkway Connector project into multiple project segments per Florida's Turnpike Enterprise and Central Florida Expressway Authority requests.
- Table 7, 9, 13, and 16 revised for consistency with local plans per partner agency requests.

Subject: 2022 Population Estimates

The official 2022 population estimates have been released by the University of Florida's Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR).

The attached table compares the 2021 population estimates with the 2022 population estimates for our 3-county region, as well as for our neighboring counties and the State of Florida. The original BEBR statewide 2022 population estimates report is available at <https://www.bibr.ufl.edu/population/population-data-archive/>

Highlights are as follows:

- From 2021 to 2022, there was a 2.07% increase in the population of our 3-county area – slightly less than the percentage increase for the 2020-2021 report. This is an increase of more than 48,000 new residents – which is nearly the current population of Ocoee.
- In our 3-county region, Osceola County continued to have the highest rate of growth (4.55%).
- The Orange County municipality with the largest percentage increase was the Town of Oakland (38.54%).
- The Osceola County municipality with the largest percentage increase was the City of Kissimmee (1.44%).
- The Seminole County municipality with the largest percentage increase was the City of Lake Mary (2.76%).

These population figures will be used to develop our Unified Planning Work Program and our budget for this year.

City of Casselberry

The City is wrapping up the Winter Park Drive Complete Street and Concept Development Study. The Preferred Alternative for the project includes a shared use path along the east side of Winter Park Drive from the Red Bug Lake Rd intersection at SR 436 to SR 434, which will effectively extend the City's trail system nearly four miles. The project also features many other pedestrian improvements and traffic calming features such as raised crosswalks, roundabouts, and speed cushions. This project is scheduled to be presented to MetroPlan Orlando Advisory Committees and the Board in January/February 2023.

City of Kissimmee

The City has installed a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) at the intersections of Mill Slough Rd. & Mill-Run Blvd.

City of Longwood

The City is in the close-out phase of the Cross Seminole Trail Connector Project. The 2.1 mile project connects the Longwood SunRail station to the Cross Seminole Trail using shared use paths and shared lane markings.

2023 Legislative Priorities and Positions

Top priorities:

- Funding to implement programs and initiatives which seek to ensure the safety of the traveling public
- Increased funding for transportation that does not negatively impact the State Transportation Trust Fund
- Increased Transportation Disadvantaged funding for paratransit service (ACCESS LYNX)

We support legislation that:

- Increases transportation investment through dedicated and sustainable funding, including innovative financing options; encourages partnerships between public and private entities; and facilitates the expedited delivery of projects. This includes legislation which:
 - Establishes flexible and predictable funding for transit projects (capital and operating) identified through the metropolitan transportation planning process by removing various funding limitations for the State Transportation Trust Fund (STTF).
 - Provides flexibility in the use of local option discretionary taxes such as Charter County & Regional Transportation System Surtax, and the Local Government Infrastructure Surtax.
 - Funds the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) at a predictable level of \$250 Million per year.
 - Does not reduce local option transportation revenue sources.
- Supports the advancement of innovative transportation mobility solutions and policies that make Florida the national leader in creative approaches to addressing transportation needs, including Autonomous, Connected, Electric, and Shared vehicle technology.
- Adds provisions to Florida's Sunshine law that allows public meetings to be conducted virtually during a declared state of emergency.

Monitor legislation that:

- Regulates distracted driving by prohibiting the use of handheld two-way electronic wireless communications devices and other similar distracting handheld devices while operating a motor vehicle on any roadway. (Monitor and support, if needed)
- Seeks to alter, revise, or rescind Red Light Camera legislation (Monitor and oppose, if needed)

Tentative Five-Year Work Program

District Five: Brevard, Flagler, Lake, Marion, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Sumter, and Volusia Counties

Dear Government Official:

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) invites you to a virtual public hearing regarding the Tentative Five-Year Work Program for fiscal years 2023/2024 through 2027/2028, **beginning Monday, December 5, and ending Friday, December 9, for 24 hours each day.**

The purpose of the tentative work program is to provide direction on where and when to build transportation system improvements. The program is used to forecast funds needed for improvements across all modes of transportation such as roadway, bicycle, pedestrian, freight, trails, transit, aviation, seaports, and spaceports.
