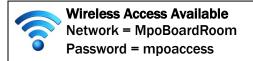

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John Dowless called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Nathan Blackwell led the committee in the invocation. Chairman Dowless led committee members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. CHAIR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

None.

IV. CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Goldfarb confirmed a quorum was present.

Mayor Gary Bruhn told MAC members about the recent passing of former Winter Garden Mayor, Jack Quisenberry. He noted that Mayor Quisenberry was a driving force for the development in the City of Winter Garden that has taken place.

V. AGENDA REVIEW/FOLLOW-UP

Ms. Virginia Whittington reported that there were no changes to the agenda.

VI. PARTNER REPORTS

LYNX

There was no LYNX representative in attendance.

FDOT

Mr. Brian Stanger, FDOT, told MAC members that I-4 Ultimate construction is three years in and expected to be completed in 2021. He reported that FDOT recently opened the first grade separation section in Maitland and in August the Grand National Overpass at Kirkman Road opened. He noted that there will be a number of traffic shifts on the project over the next six months and motorists should be vigilant for changes. Mr. Stanger told MAC members that Wekiva Parkway Sections 4A and 4B opened in January 2016, Section 5 was let in January 2017, and Sections 3A and 3B were let in June 2017. In addition, Section 6 was awarded a design/build contract in May 2017, Section 7A is scheduled to be let in December 2017, 7B has half design completed and Section 8 is scheduled for design/build procurement. He noted that landscaping has been programmed for the project and community outreach along with coordination with local partners continues. Mr. Stanger told committee members that Segment

I of I-4 Beyond the Ultimate, in Orange and Osceola Counties, is scheduled for initial plans in Spring 2018, Segment 2 has 45% plans and an RFP for design/build will be issued in Spring 2018. Segment 3, he added, is half way through the design phase and 45% plans and will be awarded as a design/build contract with construction funded in 2027. Segments 4 and 5 are scheduled for initial plans in Spring 2018. Community outreach as well as coordination with local partners continues on this project as well.

Florida's Turnpike Enterprise

Ms. Carol Scott, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE), reported that last month FTE sold their 15 millionth SunPass. She added that she will be providing an update on the Five Year Work Program later in the agenda.

A. Approval of September 7, 2017 Meeting Minutes

Approval was requested of the September 7, 2017 meeting minutes, which were provided.

minutes. Mayor Dale McDonald seconded the motion, which passed

unanimously.

B. FDOT Amendment to FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested the MAC recommend that the FY 2017/18 - 2021/22 TIP be amended to include additional funding for an existing LYNX project, a new bike lane project, and various new TSMO projects throughout the MetroPlan Orlando region. A letter from FDOT explaining the amendment request was provided, along with a fact sheet prepared by MetroPlan Orlando staff and the draft resolution to be presented at the November 8th Board meeting. Mr. Caskey told MAC members that there are 14 projects included in the TIP amendments and 12 of those projects are being funded by MetroPlan Orlando SU funds. Mayor Bruhn inquired about the source of the LYNX expansion funding increase. Mr. Caskey responded that the increase was a combination of federal and local funding.

MOTION: Mayor Gary Bruhn moved for approval of the amendments to the FY

2017/18 - 2021/22 TIP. Mayor Dale McDonald seconded the motion.

C. Approval of the Proposed 2018 Board/Committee Meeting Schedule

Approval was requested of the 2018 MetroPlan Orlando Advisory Board/Committee meeting schedule, a copy of which was provided.

MOTION: Council President John Dowless moved for approval of the 2018 MetroPlan

Orlando Advisory Board/Committee meeting schedule. Mayor Gary Bruhn

seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

IX. PRESENTATIONS AND STATUS REPORTS

A. Presentation on FY 2018/19 - 2022/23 Tentative Five Year Work Program

Mr. Brian Stanger, FDOT, and Ms. Carol Scott, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise, presented an overview of the new FY 2018/19 - 2022/23 Tentative Five Year Work Program. Mr. Stanger told committee members that the Five Year Work Program was a cyclical process. He reported that general revenue funding was down and there had been a 10-20% increase in construction costs, both of which were having an impact on new projects being added. Mr. Stanger added that the priority was to stabilize the existing project list before new projects could be added and any deferred projects would have first priority to be added back in. He reviewed project changes for Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties. Mr. Stanger told MAC members that the Work Program Public hearing had been held on October 10th and they were still welcome to provide comments.

Ms. Carol Scott told MAC members that additional information, including a map, was included in the supplemental folders. She reported that funding for FTE projects came from toll revenue and bonds and that \$700 million in funding was being allocated to MetroPlan Orlando area projects. Ms. Scott reviewed projects in Florida's Turnpike Enterprise Five Year Work Program, which included a number of interchange projects, the relocation of the tandem truck lot at I-4 and the Mainline to the Turkey Lake Service Plaza area and \$210 million in resurfacing projects. She added that the Colonial Parkway Study just kicked off and plans were in place to widen SR 417 from the Seminole County line to Aloma Avenue to match widening projects slated for north and south of that section. Ms. Scott noted that 91 miles of resurfacing projects were also planned. Mayor Bruhn asked about the tandem truck lot and its capacity. Ms. Scott explained that the tandem truck lot allowed truck drivers to park one of their tandem sections while they make local deliveries. She was unsure of the capacity, but thought the lot accommodated 10-15 trucks. Mayor McDonald asked about the Colonial Parkway project. Ms. Scott explained that the Colonial Parkway project was a planned extension of SR 408 east from Woodbury Road along the FDOT corridor. The project would be a limited access, four lane tolled corridor. Ms. Whittington commented that the fact that FDOT is unable to program any new projects indicated that it was not a good year for transportation and a possible raid on the Transportation Trust Fund was more likely to occur.

B. Presentation on SR 436 Transit Corridor Study

Mr. Myles O'Keefe, LYNX, gave a presentation on LYNX's SR 436 Transit Corridor Study. Mr. O'Keefe reviewed the study area, project goals, study schedule, existing conditions, traffic patterns and infrastructure. In addition, he reviewed the corridor auto volume, average travel speeds, transit ridership, cost effectiveness of the ridership and existing and potential riders. Mr. O'Keefe noted that health aspects for the study area had been included from the beginning instead of being considered post study. He provided information on the tiered alternatives analysis and reviewed the types of alternatives that could be considered. Mr. O'Keefe called attention to the website for the study, lynxsr436.metroquest.com, which included a survey. Mayor Charlene Glancy requested a copy of the presentation, which staff would provide.

C. Presentation on 2040 LRTP Amendments

Mr. Nick Lepp, MetroPlan Orlando staff, gave a presentation on a set of locally funded Orange County highway projects that have been added to the 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan through an administrative amendment. No action by the committees and board was needed to add these projects to the LRTP since the projects didn't involve any federal or state funds. Mr. Lepp reviewed the projects that had been added to the 2040 LRTP. He told MAC members that MAP 21 introduced performance measures and the FAST Act had requirements for both Federal and local performance measures showing progress towards goals, objectives, measures and targets. The Federal deadline to comply with the legislation, he added, was May 27, 2018.

X. GENERAL INFORMATION

Ms. Whittington called attention to the approved 2018 legislative priorities and the SunTrail process to submit projects (items D and E). In addition, she noted the holiday reception planned for December 14, 2 p.m. The reception was taking the place of the annual luncheon and would still include a toy drive to benefit a local children's agency.

Safety and Technology Grant Fact Sheet

How much is the grant and why is this good for Central Florida?

Our region received **\$11.9 million** from the Federal Highway Administration to advance several intelligent transportation system technologies aimed at improving safety and easing congestion. While most of the initial testing will be done near the UCF main campus, a goal is to make the projects "scaleable and portable," meaning they can adapt for other places. Another goal for the study team is to develop recommendations for implementing the technology, which could lead to state or even national models. This means the research done by the regional collaboration will eventually be available to support the entire region. This work will further position Central Florida as an innovative region with a deep understanding of the role technology can play in improving life for its residents and visitors.

What does the project involve?

The grant includes four major parts:

- PedSafe will digitally connect vehicles, people and traffic lights to develop a pedestrian and bicycle collision avoidance system. Drivers of vehicles will be alerted when there is a pedestrian or cyclist in the area. Traffic signals will be aware of pedestrians crossing the road and ensure they have enough time to cross.
- **GreenWay** will use sensors and new traffic signal technology to help the transportation system quickly adapt to real-time traffic conditions. This will make travel times more consistent and help reduce congestion. Projects in this program include: adaptive traffic signal control which adjusts the timing of red, yellow and green lights to respond to changing traffic patterns; activating advanced traffic light timing plans to clear intersections near railroad tracks before trains arrive; and providing parking availability to drivers in a garage to reduce the amount of time it takes to find a spot.
- **SmartCommunity** will combine information from many different transportation options into one place so people have a one-stop shop to plan their trips. This includes travel time information for driving, riding the bus, taking the train, using rideshare or car share.
- SunStore will be the Florida Department of Transportation's central data storage for all of
 the transportation system management and operations information. Having a wide range
 of technology out on the roads means that there will be an endless stream of data to
 manage. SunStore will connect and integrate many data sources, so FDOT can make the
 information available to universities, research institutions, and businesses to encourage
 innovation.









Where will these technologies be tested?

These technologies will be deployed in and around **the University of Central Florida's main campus**. The PedSafe program will also be deployed in **Pine Hills**, which has experienced significant pedestrian safety challenges. Ultimately, the goal is to take lessons learned and expand these technologies to the entire Central Florida region. One of the first

steps in this direction will be to take the initial research and apply it to the developing Creative Village area in Downtown Orlando. After that, it is expected the research can be deployed to other Central Florida locations.

Who is leading this project?

Partnership is the key to success. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is taking the lead on this project, with support from MetroPlan Orlando and the University of Central Florida (UCF). Each will lend different expertise:

- **FDOT** Will serve as project manager and coordinate between state and federal governments. FDOT will also ensure the project can be scaled appropriately for other locations and applications and will contribute software development, operations, and data management expertise.
- **MetroPlan Orlando** Will ensure projects meet their intended purposes and will facilitate collaboration among agencies and local governments.
- UCF Will use its research capabilities and existing Smart Cities initiative to advance the project, while leading data collection and analysis efforts

When will the project begin?

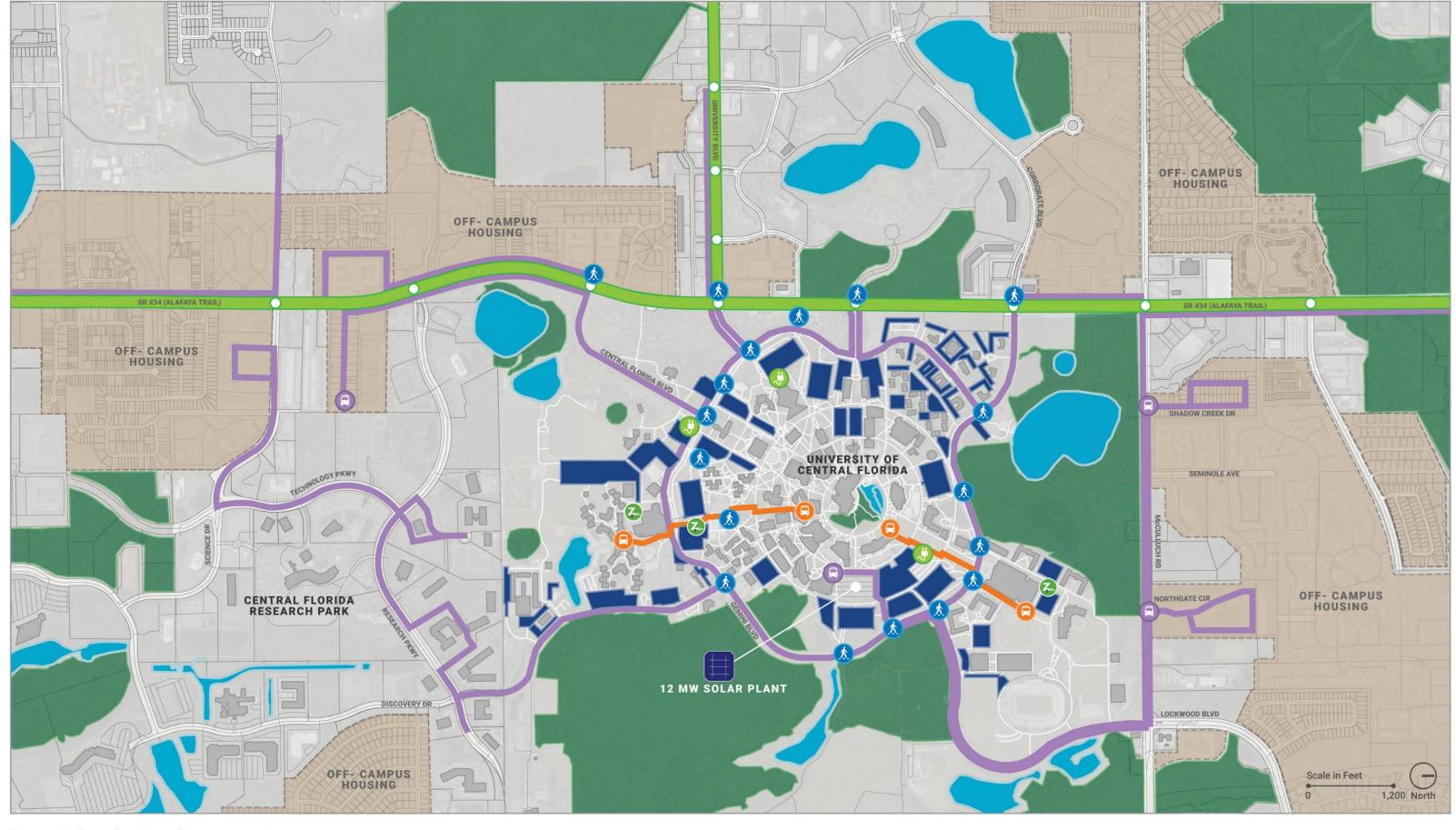
This project will last approximately five years. The planning and design of various parts is under way. Design will continue, with the programs being built and deployed throughout 2018 and 2019. Operations and maintenance of the project is expected to continue through 2021.

Where did the grant come from?

The grant came from the Federal Highway Administration's Advanced Transportation and Congestion Management Technologies Deployment (ATCMTD) grant program, which funds cutting-edge technologies that are ready to be deployed to enhance existing traffic capacity for commuters and businesses. Things to know about the grant program:

- This year, the program funded 10 projects valued at nearly \$54 million.
- The FHWA received 68 applications from 52 localities requesting more than \$362 million.
- Central Florida received the largest grant award from this very competitive program, and was the only recipient in Florida.
- The ATCMTD program was established under the federal Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. State departments of transportation, local governments, transit agencies, metropolitan planning organizations and other eligible entities were invited to apply.

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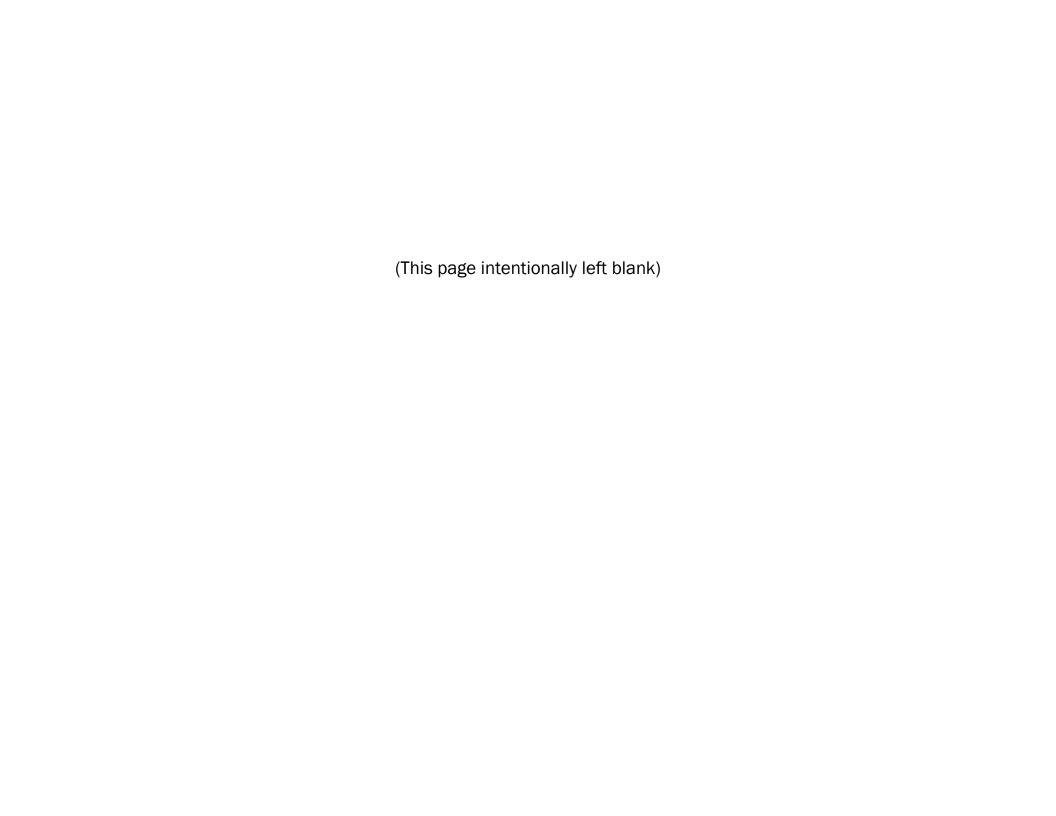

Transportation Projects for which Federal Funds Were Obligated During FY 2016/17

This document contains a list of transportation projects in the MetroPlan Orlando region (Orange, Osceola and Seminole Counties) for which federal funds were obligated during FY 2016/17. This was prepared in order to meet a federal requirement for MPO's under Title 23, Chapter 1, Subchapter E, Part 450.334 of the Code of Federal Regulations, which states:

- (a) In metropolitan planning areas, on an annual basis, no later than 90 calendar days following the end of the program year, the State, public transportation operator(s), and the MPO shall cooperatively develop a listing of projects (including investments in pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities) for which funds under 23 U.S.C. or 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 were obligated in the preceding program year.
- (b) The listing shall be prepared in accordance with §450.314(a) and shall include all federally funded projects authorized or revised to increase obligations in the preceding program year, and shall at a minimum include the TIP information under §450.326(g)(1) and (4) and identify, for each project, the amount of Federal funds requested in the TIP, the Federal funding that was obligated during the preceding year, and the Federal funding remaining and available for subsequent years.
 - (c) The listing shall be published or otherwise made available in accordance with the MPO's public participation criteria for the TIP.

This pertains to the fact that the federal fiscal year runs from October through September while the fiscal year of most MPOs runs from July through June. As a result, those projects for which funds were obligated during July through September 2016 would be shown as programmed during FY 2016/17 according to the federal fiscal year, but would be shown as programmed during FY 2017/18 according to the MPO fiscal year. Therefore, this legislation ensures that the projects in each MPO's TIP for which federal funds were obligated during the preceding fiscal year are published in a list that matches the federal fiscal year time period.

The highway projects are shown on pages 4-6, Transportation Systems Management and Operations projects are shown on page 7, bicycle and pedestrian projects are shown on pages 8 and 9 and planning projects are shown on page 10. These categories of projects are all listed by county. In addition, the transit and aviation projects are shown on pages 11 and 12 respectively. The amounts of federal funding for these projects and the funding sources (codes) are shown in separate columns on the spreadsheets. (Many of these projects also utilized funds from state and local sources, which are not shown in this document.) The explanations for the funding codes and project phases contained in this document are shown on pages 2-3.

2017 Population Estimates

The official 2017 population estimates have been released by the University of Florida's Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR). The attached table compares 2016 and 2017 figures for our 3-county area, our neighboring counties and the State of Florida.

Highlights are as follows:

- From 2016 to 2017, there was a 2.63% increase in the population of our 3-county area which is up slightly from 2015-2016 (2.43%). This is a net increase of 54,000 new residents in the past year or more than 1,000 new residents each week.
- Osceola County continues to have the highest rate of growth (+4.57%). This is extraordinary, although consistent with earlier forecasts and future projections. People arriving from Puerto Rico as a result of the hurricane are likely to result in an even higher rate of growth in the year ahead.
- The municipality with the largest increase (excluding Bay Lake) was the City of St. Cloud (+4.87%). A majority of Seminole County residents (52%) live in municipalities; a majority of Orange County residents (64%) and Osceola County residents (66%) live in unincorporated areas.
- When we look at our 10-county region that is covered by the Central Florida MPO Alliance:
 - The growth rate from 2016 to 2017 was 2.06% which held constant from 2015-2016. This
 reflects continuing improvement in the region's economy with all counties experiencing some
 growth.
 - This growth rate exceeded the rate for the entire State of Florida (1.67%) and nearly 30% of the state's population growth occurred in our 10-county region.

These population figures will be used to develop our Unified Planning Work Program for 2018/2019 and our budget for next year.

Board Meeting Highlights - November 8, 2017

• Chairman's Announcements: Commissioner Bob Dallari opened the meeting at 9:00 a.m. and welcomed everyone. Mayor Pat Bates led the Pledge of Allegiance. Commissioner Dallari congratulated Mayor Bates on her recent reelection. He provided an update on the Longwood flooding issue and thanked FDOT for stepping up to address the issue. Commissioner Dallari reported that the Regional Leadership Council met October 11th immediately following the Board meeting and discussed the INVEST Grant and the scheduling of an INVEST Summit February 7, 2018 at Ace Café. He called attention to a SunRail Orientation program held for several people from the Tampa Bay Partnership on October 19 that he participated in.
