

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman John Dowless called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Dowless led the committee in the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

III. CHAIR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chairman Dowless welcomed everyone. He recognized Mayor Gary Bruhn for his service on MAC. Mayor Bruhn spoke briefly.

IV. CONFIRMATION OF QUORUM

Ms. Goldfarb confirmed a quorum was present.

V. PARTNER REPORTS

LYNX

Mr. Myles O'Keefe, LYNX, reported that the LYNX CEO, Edward Johnson, had resigned and Mr. Jim Harrison, Orange County, had taken over as Interim CEO. He told MAC members that LYNX staff briefed Mr. Harrison on the annual submission of the National Transit Database information, which provides the formula for LYNX funding. Mr. O'Keefe noted that LYNX staff participated in MetroPlan Orlando's recent federal certification.

FDOT

Ms. Rakinya Hinson, FDOT, reported that FDOT staff participated in MetroPlan Orlando's recent federal certification and it was a very smooth process. MetroPlan Orlando staff, she added, did an excellent job presenting their accomplishments since the previous certification. Ms. Hinson told MAC members that FDOT staff held the first of two partnering meetings regarding LAP policy update language the day before and they are soliciting input on the language online until June 10^{th} .

Florida's Turnpike Enterprise

Mr. Jim Martin, Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE), reported that FTE recently held a public meeting regarding new ramps and configuration in the South Orlando Sand Lake Road area. Mr. Martin told committee members that FTE hosted engineering students from Milwee Middle School and visited Tildenville Elementary School to show how roads are built. He called attention to the FTE LRTP modification request later in the agenda.

VI. AGENDA REVIEW/FOLLOW-UP

Ms. Virginia Whittington thanked Mayor Bruhn for his service on MAC. She called attention to the recent state and federal certifications, noting that the comment period for the federal certification was open until April 5th. Ms. Whittington told MAC members that there were vacancies on CAC and applications were available online until March 22nd. She thanked FTE staff for hosting the Milwee Middle School students, which had been done in conjunction with Women's Transportation Seminar (WTS). Ms. Whittington noted that all presenters were in attendance and they were ready to move forward with the agenda.

VIII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of February 7, 2019 Meeting Minutes

Approval was requested of the February 7, 2019 meeting minutes, which were provided.

MOTION: Mayor Gary Bruhn moved for approval of the February 7, 2019 meeting minutes. Mayor Dale McDonald seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

B. 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Modification: Florida's Turnpike & Kirkman Road Extension

Mr. Alex Trauger, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested the MAC recommend that the 2040 LRTP be modified to include the widening and interchange modifications project on Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE) from SR 408 to SR 50, requested by FTE, as well as the Kirkman Road Extension project from Sand Lake Road to Destination Parkway, requested by Orange County. Attachments were provided. Mr. Trauger emphasized that the request was for a modification, not an amendment to the LRTP and there were two separate requests. An 11" x 17" copy of the Orange County Kirkman Road extension project map was included in the supplemental folders. He noted that the Kirkman Road project was previously in the cost feasible plan but due to an oversight was removed from MetroPlan Orlando's 2025 LRTP; and now with private developer funding and the prospect of discretionary grant funding the project needs to be included in the LRTP.

MOTION: Mayor Gary Bruhn moved for approval of the 2040 LRTP being modified to include the widening and interchange modifications project on Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE) from SR 408 to SR 50, requested by FTE, as well as the Kirkman Road Extension project from Sand Lake Road to Destination Parkway, requested by Orange County. Mayor Dale McDonald seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

IX. PRESENTATIONS AND STATUS REPORTS

A. 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP): Overview

Mr. Alex Trauger, MetroPlan Orlando staff, provided an overview introducing key elements and new emphasis areas for the 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP - formerly LRTP) development process. An attachment was provided. Mr. Trauger told MAC members that Metropolitan Transportation Plan was the commonly used term for MPOs and it is the core planning product. The MTP, he noted, identifies needs while projects are prioritized in the Prioritized Project List and funding is associated with projects in the Transportation Improvement Plan. Mr. Trauger reviewed the federal requirements, planning emphasis areas, tasks and activities, things to think about related to the 2045 MTP and next steps. He added that a systems performance report was a new requirement and a MTP Working Group was being formed, which included MetroPlan TAC, TSMO and CAC representation along with local agencies and stakeholders. Mr. Trauger reported that work on the 2045 MTP will go through the regular advisory board process. Mayor McDonald asked how MAC members could participate. Mr. Trauger responded that there will be local government coordination during the development process.

B. Presentation on Orange-Lake Connector

Mr. Will Sloup, Metric Engineering, gave a presentation on the proposed Orange-Lake Connector that will run from US 27 to SR 429. Mr. Sloup provided an overview of the project and a current status report. He reviewed the four project alternatives, typical section diagram, next steps, the project schedule, which was 11 months into a 16 month timeline, and stakeholder/public involvement efforts. Mr. Sloup noted that additional information was available on the project website https://bit.ly/2MdwCmH. He also provided CFX public involvement coordinator staff contact information. Mayor Bruhn asked about the public meeting scheduled that evening. Mr. Sloup responded that the public meeting was being held to solicit input on the four alternatives. Mayor Bruhn commented that a connection is needed from SR 535 to Apopka Vineland Road and he has lobbied for that connection for a number of years.

C. Presentation on Voyage (Door-to-door Autonomous Taxi Service)

Dr. Dean Bushey, Voyage, gave a presentation on Voyage, which brings communities together with self-driving cars by enabling residents to summon an autonomous vehicle and move effortlessly from point A to point B. Prior to expanding to The Villages in Sumter County, Voyage operated a handful of self-driving cars in a San Jose, California-based retirement community. Dr. Bushey provided an overview of a current demonstration project in The Villages (Florida), home to 125,000 residents. Dr. Bushey told MAC members that Voyage provides an alternative means of transportation for those who cannot or choose not to drive. He provided background information on the program including the team, benefits of the service, technology and safety measures. Discussion ensued regarding road maintenance issues, length of time safety drivers will be used, making a profit, regulation issues expanding to major roadways, analog vehicles and connecting to the internet. Dr. Bushey responded that the vehicles rely on mapping detail, there is no set time frame for using safety drivers, the company's philosophy is "until" it is deemed safe. The project is currently using venture capital and they are working on a cost for service. He added that the current focus is on public transportation, the vehicles use all electronic

components, not analog, and they use their own network because there is spotty service from other providers. Additional discussion ensued in regards to data storage, influence of Florida Polytechnic test track, insurance issues, the network in the Villages, recognition of traffic lights and car to car communication.

Council President Dowless acknowledged Mr. Steve Noto in attendance representing the City of Lake Mary.

Reason: FDOT is adding funding for the construction phase for a traffic

operations project on SR 436 in Seminole County.

Summary/Key Information: Items of particular significance for our Committees and the Board are

as follows:

 This amendment adds a total of \$545,111 in RHP funds in FY 2019/20 for the construction of two railroad crossing safety projects, one in Orlando and one in Ocoee.

 The amendment also adds a total of nearly \$5.5 million in federal, state and local funds in FY 2019/20 for the construction of traffic operations improvements on SR 436 from Boston Avenue to east of Anchor Road in Altamonte Springs.

• This project includes improvements at the intersections of SR 436 at Maitland Avenue and SR 436 at Ronald Reagan Boulevard and minor milling and resurfacing. Upgrades include the addition of a second eastbound left turn lane on SR 436 at Ronald Reagan Boulevard, a westbound right turn lane extension on SR 436 from the Florida Hospital entrance to Boston Avenue, widening the sidewalks from 5 feet to 6 and 8 feet throughout the project limits, mast arm upgrades, and drainage improvements.

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is requesting to amend the FY 2018/19 - 2022/23 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) in accordance with the MetroPlan Orlando Internal Operating Procedures; and

WHEREAS, the requested amendments are described as follows:

Subject: April 2019 Bicycle & Pedestrian Activity Update

City of Casselberry

The City of Casselberry partnered with UCF and the Orlando Metro Section of the American Planning Association (OMS-APA) to bring internationally recognized healthy design transportation consultant Mark Fenton to provide five healthy design workshops March 27-29, 2019. The workshops stressed the importance of creating a built environment that encourages walking and biking as the natural choice for routine daily activities. PDF's of materials can be found at www.casselberry.org/go

East Central Florida Regional Planning Council

The Route Condition Tool is a master GIS transportation database that compiles roadway attribute and proximity data to provide innovative bicycle and pedestrian safety solutions. One feature of the tool is the "Complete Street Retrofittability Application," which calculates potential reductions in roadway widths that can be accommodated without affecting traffic capacity. This database will be built out for the entire MetroPlan Orlando region in September 2019.

City of Maitland

The City of Maitland has completed their DRAFT Bike/Pedestrian Master Plan. It has been reviewed by the Parks and Recreation Board, is scheduled for Transportation Advisory Board on April 11, and will be forwarded to City Council in early May for adoption.

On the construction front, the costs are being finalized for the East/West Connector Trail along Sandspur along with numerous sidewalk segments in the Dommerich Subdivision that provide connectivity to schools.

City of Orlando

The bicycle beltway project has four trail projects under design this year and alignment study just started for the final segment of the beltway. The City recently purchased seven additional counters that will be installed permanently on the trail network this month. JUMP and HOPR dockless bike share bicycles should be operating in Orlando later this month.

The City held a ribbon-cutting for the Orlando Urban Trail Colonial Drive Overpass on April 16.

City of Sanford

At almost three and a half miles long, the construction of Sanford's \$14 million dollar RiverWalk seawall is underway. W. Seminole Blvd. (formerly known as 17-92) will be closed to thru traffic until approximately September 30, 2019.
