She introduced new MetroPlan Orlando staff member Senior Transportation Planner Adriana Rodriguez. She reminded that the July $12^{\text {th }}$ Board meeting will begin at 8 a.m. to accommodate local partner budget hearings.

Ms. Rachel Frederick conducted the roll call and confirmed a quorum was present.

## VI. AGENCY REPORTS / PARTNER UPDATES

## - Florida Department of Transportation

Mr. Jonathan Scarfe, FDOT District 5, called attention to the FDOT construction report included in the agenda packet. Mr. Scarfe encouraged members to utilize www.cflroads.com to obtain major project updates. He stated that the FDOT team has wrapped up their review of the MetroPlan Orlando TIP and found no issues.

- LYNX

Ms. Patricia Whitton, LYNX, reported that ridership remains at around 55,000/day which is lower than pre-pandemic levels but approximately $11 \%$ higher than this time one year ago. She reported on the service changes effective August 20th. Ms. Whitton announced a partnership with BEEP on the Orange Lymmo line that will operate during the off-peak time.

- $\quad$ Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE)

Mr. Siaosi Fine, FTE, reported the public hearing for PD\&E for the widening of the Turnpike Mainline from S.R. 408 to S.R. 50 is scheduled for August $7^{\text {th }}$. The virtual session is scheduled to begin at 12:00 noon and the in-person session at 5:30 p.m. at Turnpike Enterprise Headquarters at the Turkey Lake Service Plaza in Ocoee.

Mr. Jason Sartorio, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested that the MAC make a recommendation to the Board to adopt the TIP for FY 23/24-27/28. Mr. Sartorio gave an overview of the virtual public meeting held on June 21 ${ }^{\text {st }}$. MOTION: Mayor Blackwell recommended adoption of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) FY 2023/24-2027/28. Mayor Sladek seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

## C. Prioritized Project List (PPL) FY 2028-2038 Adoption

Mr. Slade Downs, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested that the MAC make a recommendation to the Board to adopt the Draft PPL for FY 2028-2038. Mr. Downs presented a preview of the PPL at the June $8^{\text {th }}$ MAC Meeting.

MOTION: Mayor Henson recommended adoption of the FY 2028-2038 Prioritized Project List (PPL). Mayor Sladek seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

## VIII. PRESENTATIONS \& STATUS REPORTS

## A. Safe Streets and Roads for All Grant Award Update

Mr. Alex Trauger, MetroPlan Orlando provided a status update on the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Award and confirmed that going forward it will be referred to as MetroPlan Orlando's Vision Zero Action Planning program. He stated at the most recent MetroPlan Orlando Board meeting, the budget amendment was approved that allows MetroPlan Orlando to provide the local funding match. Mr. Trauger also confirmed that the MetroPlan Orlando Board has accrued the local funds and been given a green light from USDOT for a fully executed grant agreement. He stated that a Vision Zero Task Force is in the development process and will have their inaugural meeting sometime in July 2023.

## B. FDOT Focus on Distracted Driving

Ms. Loreen Bobo, P.E., FDOT District 5, gave a presentation on the FDOT Distracted Driving program which further highlights FDOT and MetroPlan Orlando's focus on safety. Ms. Bobo reviewed why safety is a focus and provided some local tri-county statistics. She detailed the Safe Systems Approach developed by Federal Highway Administration including principles and elements and Safe Systems versus traditional approach. Ms. Bobo called attention to the FDOT Districted Driving Campaign conducted during the month of June. She explained that the aim of the campaign is to influence young male drivers in the age range of 22 to 27

[^1]including their families. She noted that District Five hosted various community outreach events and in coordination with local media, law enforcement, use of social media and targeted ads.

## D. MetroPlan Orlando TSM\&O Master Plan Status Update

Mr. Hill, MetroPlan Orlando gave an update on the MetroPlan Orlando TSMO Master Plan. Mr. Hill provided a review of the Needs Assessment Task of the Master Plan, including recommendations on TSMO Infrastructure and Systems; Strategies and Operations; and Agency and Organizational categories.

## C. Presentation on FDOT SR 426 (Aloma Ave) Coalition Process

Mr. Mark Trebitz, FDOT, gave a presentation on the coalition process and status of the SR426 (Aloma Ave) project. He explained that the targeted area runs from west of South Park Avenue to east of North Lakemont Avenue. Mr. Trebitz explained the make-up of the Coalition. He presented historic crash data, identified the corridor issues, and the goals for improvement. He presented two alternatives of proposed recommendations and some renderings of proposed improvements. He shared the next steps in the Project Schedule and proto contact Mr. Jesse Blouin, Project Manager, FDOT District Five, if there are any further questions.

The purpose of this letter is to request MetroPlan Orlando amend the FY 2023/24-2027/28 TIP with the Annual Roll-Forward Report. The Roll Forward report reconciles differences between the TIP and Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Adopted Five-Year Work Program. This is annual process is routine and assists the MPO with identifying projects using federal funds that were not committed during the previous state fiscal year (FY 2022/2023). These projects have automatically "rolled forward" in the FDOT Adopted Five-Year Work Program as of July 1, 2023. This amendment ensures that year one of the TIP matches year one of FDOT's Adopted Five-year Work Program.

The reason for this amendment is to ensure projects with federal funding can be authorized prior to the new Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) beginning on October 1 each year. Until then, Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) continue to recognize the FY 2022/23 - 2026/27 TIP as the effective document. Adopting the Roll Forward Report and amending it into the TIP ensure projects will continue to be authorized without interruption.

The affected projects are listed in the attached Roll-Forward Report dated July 5, 2023. The MPO is requested to add this report to the FY 2023/24-2027/28 TIP in its entirety.

## City of Winter Park

The City will be continuing the Denning Drive Trail from Webster Avenue to Solana Avenue. The project is anticipated to start sometime this summer.

## City of Casselberry

Construction of the Sunset Drive Livable Street Improvements project is advancing faster than expected, with substantial construction completion anticipated before the end of 2023. This project includes a shared use path that will help significantly extend Casselberry's trail network.

The City recently held a well-attended public meeting for the Central Casselberry Connectivity Improvements project in order to garner public feedback and help narrow down design concepts.

The City has also begun design of its next road rehabilitation project for various streets, which along with resurfacing will include several sidewalk, accessibility, and safety improvements.

The 2014 Supplement to AASHTO's Highway Safety Manual (HSM) introduced new material for the first time since the First Edition was published in 2010. Before 2014, it was impossible to analyze free-ways or interchanges using HSM methodologies. But no longer!

FHWA is offering a free workshop series exploring how geometric design, traffic control, and other factors affect roadway safety. Participants will learn crash prediction methodologies for freeway segments and interchanges that were published in the HSM, First Edition Supplement (Chapters 18 and 19).

Attendees will also gain experience using two free tools that automate the application of HSM methodologies:

- Enhanced Interchange Safety Analysis Tool (ISATe)
- Interactive Highway Safety Design Model (IHSDM)

These two tools help users predict the safety effects of varying freeway segment and interchange designs.

## Workshop Learning Outcomes

- Describe how freeway and interchange safety analysis can support decision-making for project design choices.
- Optimize investments by applying the most current analytical methods to quantify safety.
- List examples of how the HSM chapters on freeway segments and interchanges could be applied during project decision-making.
- Use ISATe and IHSDM to apply the HSM predictive methodology to assess safety on freeway segments and interchanges.


## Learn the ISATe and IHSDM Safety Analysis Tools

The ISATe is a free, macro-enabled Excel workbook primarily used for small freeway segments. Users manually enter data for each individual segment, interchange, and cross street. CMF values and intermediate calculations are visible within the Excel interface so users can follow the calculations.

The IHSDM (www.insdm.org) is a free, standalone software suite that implements all HSM Part C predictive methods. It can be applied to both freeway and non-freeway network components (e.g., cross-roads, connectors, local roads, and intersections) and is appropriate for both complex and simple analysis projects.

Additional features include:

- Two options for data input and analysis:
-Station-Based: automatically segments the highway into homogeneous segments as per HSM Part C. -Site-Based: functions similar to a spreadsheet tool and is especially useful for projects where detailed, station-based geometry is not available.
- The ability to import LandXML files (i.e., project alignment data) from highway design software.
- A Highway Viewer providing graphical representations (e.g., plan view) of the design.
- A Calibration Utility to help agencies implement HSM calibration procedures.
- Extensive documentation, including a tutorial with step-by-step exercises.

Workshop participants will apply each tool to a real-world alternatives analysis case study. The exercise will compare analysis results for two alternative designs.
