• January 2021

MPO received feedback from planning partners relating to Local Agency Program (LAP) projects and funding eligibility

February 2021

FHWA provided clarity to MPOs and FDOT pertaining to *"consistency between planning documents"* at the annual Florida Metropolitan Planning Partnership Meeting

Plan Revision Terminology

Modification -

A revision to the MTP/LRTP that includes <u>minor</u> changes to project / project phase costs, minor changes to funding sources of previously included projects, and minor changes to project / project phase initiation dates.

Amendment -

A revision to a MTP/LRTP that involves a <u>major</u> change to a project included in a Cost Feasible Plan, including the addition or deletion of a project or a major change in project cost, project / project phase initiation dates, or a major change in design concept or design.

Reference: FDOT's MPO Program Management Handbook, April 2021

Proposed Revisions

- 1. Modification: Federal and state funded projects within the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) were added to the Cost Feasible Plan's budget allocation tables for the years 2020-2025. No impacts to existing cost feasibility.
- 2. Amendment: Off-System Construction Assistance Program was broadened to include other multimodal project types, in addition to capacity, for facilities located off the State Highway System.
- **3.** Amendment: Projects to be funded using local or alternative funds were removed from federally-funded Complete Streets and Bicycle/Pedestrian Infrastructure project lists.
- 4. Modification: Congestion Management Process documentation was revised to include updated data from FDOT pertaining to Emergency Response and Roadway Clearance times.



New Program:

Off-State Highway System Construction Assistance

- 10% from "Other Arterials Funds" (SA funds) allocated to the Construction and CEI costs for Off-State System projects.
- Consistent with FDOT's Revenue Forecasting Guidebook.
- LAP-certified agencies must locally fund PD&E, Design, ROW, and Environmental Mitigation phases.
