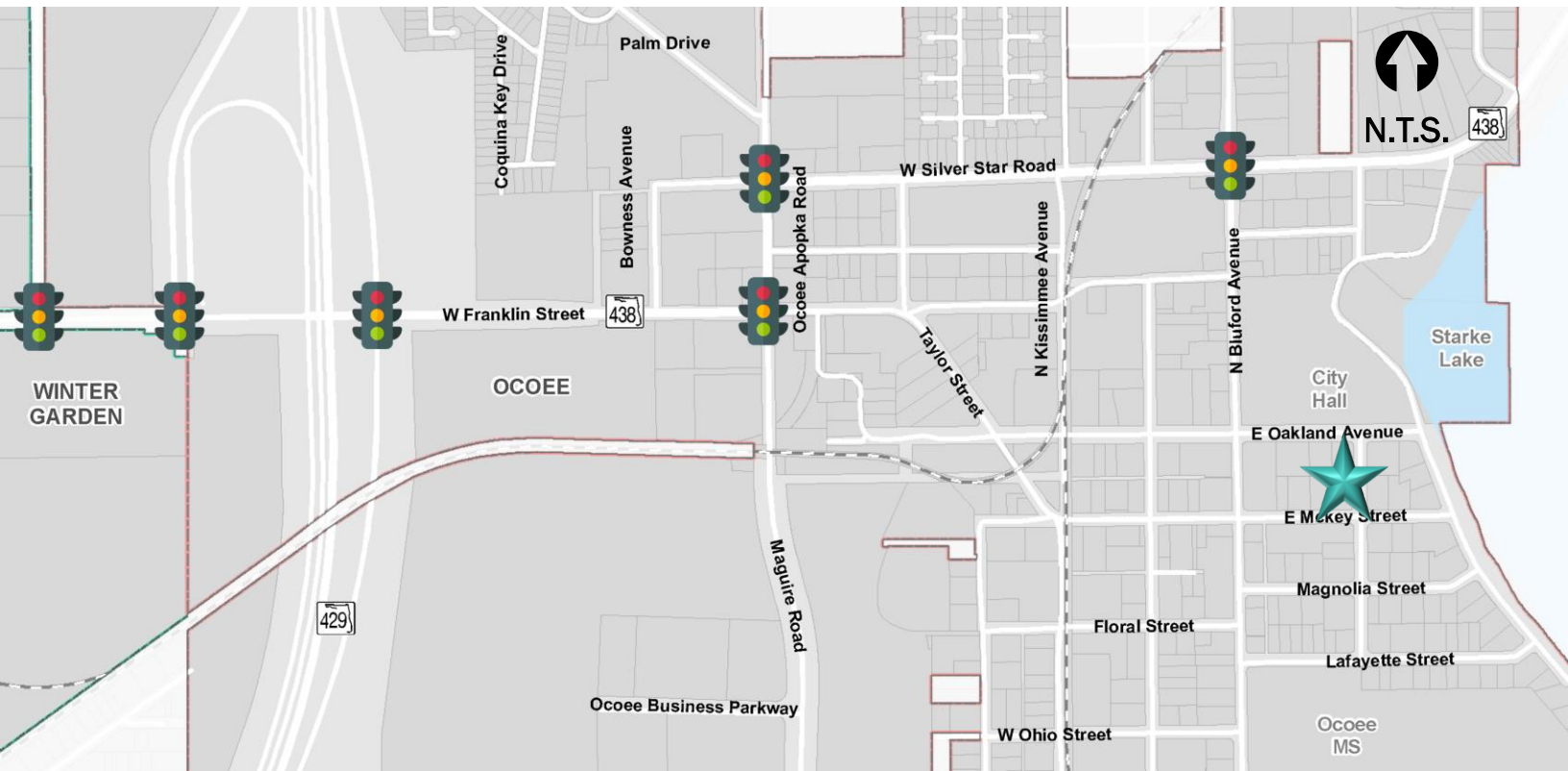

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Project Overview

The Silver Star Road Complete Streets Study evaluated options to provide a lower cost alternative to roadway widening with improved safety while including an extension of the West Orange Trail to Downtown Ocoee. MetroPlan Orlando is leading the study, working directly with City of Ocoee, to develop recommendations that support the overall Downtown Vision while maintaining a safe and reliable connection to SR 429 and destinations to the east.

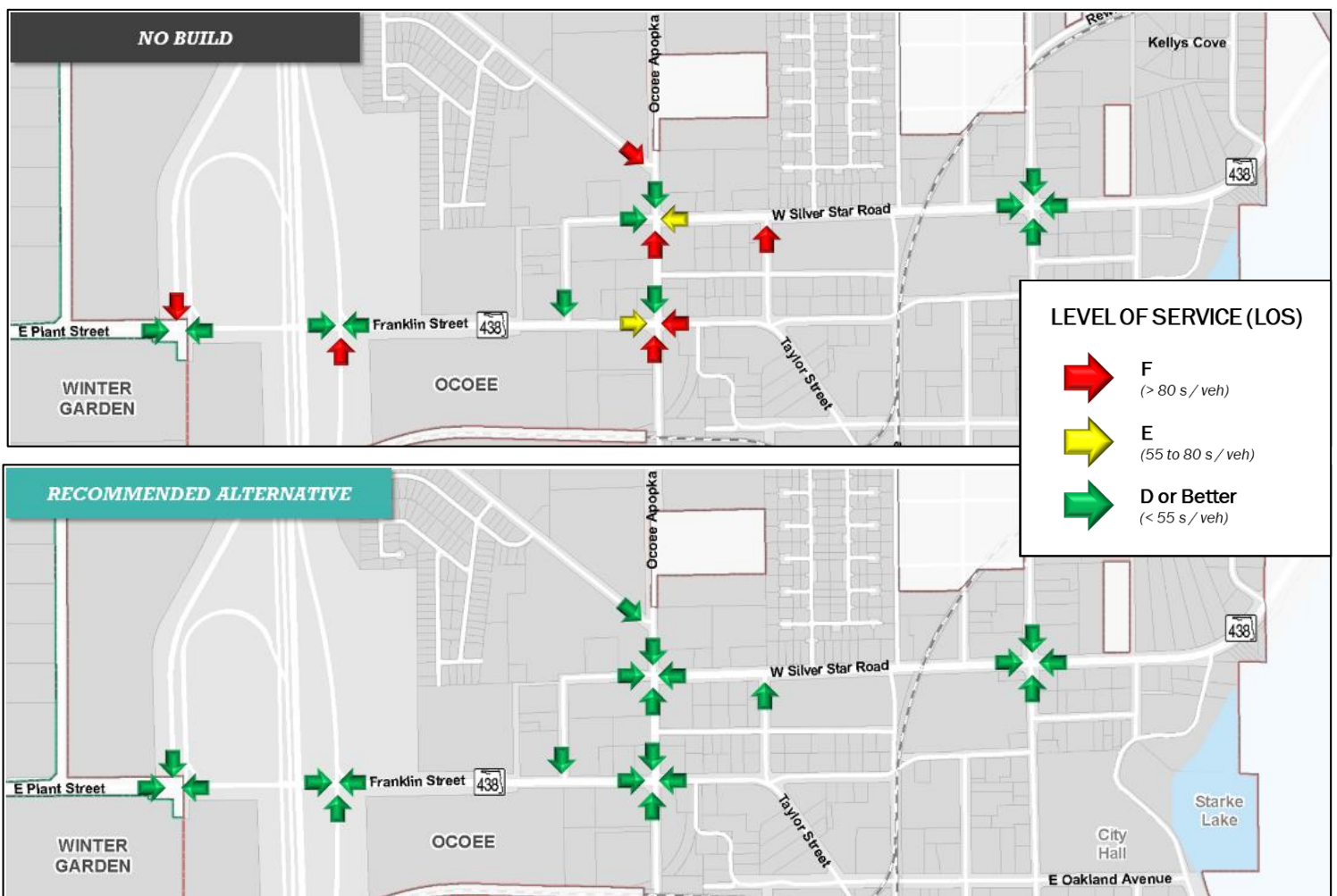

The Enhanced Grid Alternative best meets the vision of Ocoee's Downtown Master Plan and the purpose, need, and guiding principles established for this study. By making existing corridors more pedestrian, bike, and transit friendly and accommodating freight away from the core of downtown Ocoee, the Enhanced Grid Alternative should encourage residents and visitors to choose active transportation alternatives over driving. The Enhance Grid Alternative succeeds in 1) Increasing network connectivity and improving traffic operations (**Level of Service / vehicle delay exhibit below**) ; 2) Enhancing the community and promoting economic development; and 3) Minimizing impacts to residential and commercial properties when compared to other Build Alternatives. The key improvements proposed by the conceptual plan include:

- Utilizing Bowness Avenue as the primary route connecting Franklin Street and Silver Star Road
- Adding capacity to northbound Ocoee Apopka Road
- Providing left turn lanes and median island opportunities on Silver Star Road east of Ocoee Apopka Road
