#### I. Call to Order

Chairman Mary Moskowitz called the Technical Advisory Committee to order at 10:00 a.m.

#### *II.* Confirmation of Quorum

Ms. Cathy Goldfarb confirmed the presence of a quorum.

#### III. Agenda Review/Staff Follow-Up

Mr. Keith Caskey called attention to a change in format for action items which now included an action fact sheet which highlighted the important points for the action item. He told TAC members that the Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon was being held Thursday, December 15, at 11:30 a.m. Mr. Caskey reported that the next TAC meeting was scheduled for Friday, January 27, 2017.

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#### *IV.* Public Comments on Action Items

None

#### V. Common Presentations/Status Reports

#### A. Update on reThink Program

Mr. Steve Alianiello, reThink, gave an update on reThink's latest activities. Mr. Alianiello reviewed statistics on commuting in the area based on research done by the Center for Urban Transportation (CUTR). He provided information on the impact rethink has had on local commuting and ways employers can assist with commuting alternatives. Mr. Alianiello called attention to the list of current area Best Workplaces for Commuters, which has dramatically increased since the implementation of the rethink program. In addition, he provided an example of a local employer and the commuter-friendly programs they have implemented for their staff. He also detailed partnerships that have been established by reThink in FDOT District 5 and the marketing and outreach strategies that rethink has used. Discussion ensued in regards to outreach outside of the FDOT District 5 area and revisiting businesses/employers previously reached out to. Mr. Alianiello responded that other areas outside of District 5 have their own programs and reThink continuously reaches out to businesses/employers, both new and those they already have a relationship with.

#### B. Presentation on Promoting Health through Policy, Process & Projects

Ms. Elizabeth Whitton, MetroPlan Orlando staff, provided an update on MetroPlan Orlando's health initiatives and the results of a health-focused audit of the agency's planning documents. Ms. Whitton gave an overview of the connection between transportation and health and the World Health Organization definition of health. She noted that the public health sector approached the transportation sector with incentives after research showed a person's environment significantly affects their health. Ms. Whitton detailed some of the incentives that have been provided by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. She shared the breakdown of health factors 80% of which are outside of clinical care, and the themes that affect quality of life. Ms. Whitton told committee members that an audit of MetroPlan Orlando's five major documents was conducted which found that approximately \$600 million was invested in health-related projects. She also provided information on short and long term strategies for increasing cross-sector collaboration between transportation and public health and provided examples of cross sector collaborations locally. Discussion ensued in regards to MetroPlan Orlando's adoption of a Complete Streets Policy, Sanford's Goldsboro healthy community project that just got underway, and possible assistance with applying for public health sector grants. Ms. Whitton told committee members that two of the three CDC grants were ending in 2017 and the third was part of the federal stimulus program. She added CDC is undergoing a strategic reorganization and MetroPlan Orlando is on the list to receive notification of future grant opportunities and can assist with notifying local municipalities and with the application process.

#### A. Approval of the October 28, 2016 TAC Meeting Minutes

Approval was requested of the October 28, 2016 meeting minutes which were provided.

**MOTION:** Mr. Nabil Muhaisen moved approval of the October 28, 2016 meeting minutes. Mr. Tim Wilson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously

#### B. FDOT Amendment to FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP

Mr. Keith Caskey, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested the TAC to recommend that the FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP be amended to include three railroad crossing improvements in Orange County and a sidewalk project in Osceola County. A letter explaining the amendments was provided. A fact sheet prepared by MetroPlan Orlando staff that provided more information on the projects was also provided. Vice-Chairman Moskowitz asked if the projects were funded by a new funding source and if notification was sent form FDOT when new funding programs became available. Mr. Jamil Gutierrez responded that the procedure for allocating state funding had been previously provided and as state funds become available FDOT looks to the Prioritized Project List to allocate those funds as needed. A request was made to have the rail crossing procedure sent out to TAC members.

**MOTION:** Mr. Shad Smith moved approval of the FDOT Amendment to FY 2016/17-2020/21 TIP. Mr. Renzo Nastasi seconded the motion, which passed unanimously

#### C. 2017 Legislative Priorities

Ms. Virginia Whittington, MetroPlan Orlando staff, requested the TAC to recommend approval of MetroPlan Orlando's priorities for the Florida Legislature's 2017 session. The draft list of priorities was provided, along with a fact sheet that provided further information. Ms. Whittington told TAC members that at the October meeting input was sought from TAC members on the proposed 2017 legislative priorities and that input was taken to the MetroPan Orlando Executive Committee. She reviewed the top four priorities and noted that there was an additional top priority that was open for discussion at the December 14<sup>th</sup> board meeting. The additional priority entailed expanding the Charter County and Regional Transportation System Surtax to allow municipalities over 150,000 in population (or the largest municipality in a county) and all counties located in MPO areas to enact up to a one-cent local option surtax by referendum. Mr. Renzo Nastasi asked who would be taking the lead on language for the Charter County Surtax. Ms. Whittington responded that MetroPlan Orlando lobbyists Mr. Bill Peebles and Mr. John Wayne Smith would be drafting the language. Mr. Nastasi asked if the language going to the Board would have a clear process detailing what the effects would be on the host county. Ms. Whittington responded that that issue was raised by the Executive Committee and would be discussed and addressed if the priority moves forward. Mr. Butch Margraf suggested adding the Charter County Surtax to the list of items to monitor as opposed to a top priority. Mr. Nastasi added that it was not common practice for TAC members to recommend policy. Mr. Ian Sikonia asked how the other committees voted on the legislative priorities. Ms. Whittington responded that CAC approved and included the Charter County Surtax as a top priority and TSMO approved the priorities. Mr. Butch Margraf requested more information on the legislative priorities.

**MOTION:** Mr. Renzo Nastasi moved approval that TAC members reviewed and acknowledged the proposed 2017 legislative priorities. Mr. Doug Robinson seconded the motion, which passed 24:5 (Muhaisen, Devries, Felblinger, Moskowitz, Zaballero opposed)



# SUBJECT:

## Amendment to the FY 2016/17-2020/21 Transportation Improvement Program

WHEREAS, the Orlando Urbanized Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), d.b.a. MetroPlan Orlando, is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the Orlando Urbanized Area, including the Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is requesting to amend the FY 2016/17-2020/21 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) in accordance with the MetroPlan Orlando Internal Operating Procedures; and

WHEREAS, the requested amendment is described as follows:

#### Orange County

- FM #2465561 Expansion of LYNX Operating Center Funding consists of \$2,500,000 in FTA (Federal Transit Administration) funds and \$625,000 in LF (Local Funds) for a capital grant in FY 2016/17, and \$800,000 in FTA (Federal Transit Administration) funds and \$200,000 in LF (Local Funds) for a capital grant in FY 2017/18;
- FM#4242171 State Road 414 (Maitland Boulevard) from I-4 to Maitland Avenue Add Lanes and Rehabilitate Project Funding adjustments, all for the right-of-way phase, are as follows:

<u>Reductions in FY 2016/17:</u> -\$1,614,540 in SU (Urban Attributable) funds -\$150,000 in ACSU (Advance Construction Urban Attributable) funds

<u>Reductions in FY 2017/18:</u> -\$15,000 in DIH (District In-House) funds

Additions in FY 2017/18: +\$1,469,665 in SU (Urban Attributable) funds +\$487,560 in LF (Local Funding)

#### **Explanation:**

SUBJECT: Recommended Changes to Bicycle and Pedestrian Project Prioritization Process

The Bicycle & Pedestrian Task Force is comprised of the following members:

- Randy Schrader (Chair) (City of Kissimmee)
- Joshua DeVries (Osceola County)
- Chris Kintner (City of Longwood)

- Ian Sikonia (City of Orlando)
- Shad Smith (City of Longwood, formerly Seminole County)
- Bill Thomas (Orange County)

The Task Force met over a number of months and has compiled the following recommendations for bicycle and pedestrian project prioritization:

### **Project Types**

There are three general types of projects with their own prioritization criteria: Regionally Significant Trails, Pedestrian and Bicyclist Mobility, and School Mobility (formerly known as Safe Routes to School)

#### **Regionally Significant Trails**

These projects are shared use paths that cover longer distances, connect to other trails, and often bridge municipal, county, or MPO boundaries. Criteria for these projects are:

- Regional Importance
- Economic Development Potential
- Intermodal

- Local Match
- Trail Surface
- Project Readiness

The Regional Importance criteria includes a number of sub-criteria:

- Length
- Connection to other regionally significant trails
- Connection across city, county or MPO limits
- Connection to statewide trails

- Serving regionally significant destinations
- Desirable setting
- High use opportunity
- Serving a currently underserved area
- Filling a critical gap

Weighting of criteria has been eliminated as it is of minimal impact and this will simplify application of criteria across modes.

The Task Force updated the Regionally Significant Trails map, which is attached.

#### Pedestrian and Bicyclist Mobility

These projects serve primarily local trips by pedestrians and/or bicyclists and can include shared use paths, sidewalks, bike lanes, short connector paths, wayfinding, bicycle parking, or a combination of these. Criteria for these projects are:

- Non-Motorized Trip Demand
- Type of Accommodation
- Connectivity
- Intermodal

- Local Match
- Local Plans
- Project Readiness

For Mobility projects serving both pedestrians and bicyclists, criteria are applied independently to the two different modes and averaged together. Weighting of criteria has been eliminated as it is of minimal impact and this will simplify application of criteria across modes.

#### School Mobility

Previously named "Safe Routes to School," the project type was renamed to avoid confusion with FDOT Safe Routes to School projects and funding. Projects may be eligible for either funding source, provided they meet the criteria. MetroPlan's School Mobility criteria are:

- Public School Trip Demand
- Type of Accommodation
- Connectivity

- Local Match
- Local Plans
- Project Readiness

Safety

Weighting of criteria has been eliminated as it is of minimal impact and this will simplify application of criteria across modes.

### Funding Types

Projects are divided into two funding types:

<u>Type A</u>

- Projects requesting more than \$400,000 in federal funds
- Applicants may only submit one Type A project per year
- Projects requesting more than \$4 million must provide detailed justification including a phasing plan in order to minimize adverse impact on the overall prioritized project list, and to allow preparatory phases such as design or right-of-way to proceed earlier
- Presentations shall be made to the appropriate committees
- Projects must be consistent with the MetroPlan Orlando Long Range Transportation Plan

#### <u>Type B</u>

- Projects requesting \$400,000 or less in federal funds
- Each jurisdiction is limited to two Type B projects per year

### **Funding Breakdown**

While MetroPlan Orlando encourages FDOT to be flexible in its application of federal and state sources in order to maximize funding of pedestrian and bicycle projects, we recommend the following source priorities for the three project types:

Regionally Significant Trails: districtwide or statewide trail funding sources, or districtwide or statewide Transportation Alternatives

Pedestrian and Bicyclist Mobility: MetroPlan Orlando Transportation Alternatives or Surface Transportation Program set-aside funds

School Mobility: up to 20% per year of MetroPlan Orlando Transportation Alternatives or Surface Transportation Program set-aside funds

#### Adding New Projects to the Prioritized Project List

- School Mobility projects will receive top prioritization
- All new projects (other than School Mobility) will be added to the bottom of the Prioritized Project List behind existing projects
- Type B Projects will added ahead of Type A Projects, and ranked based on their criteria score
- Project applicants may swap project priorities of comparable costs within their own jurisdiction with the approval of the committees and board


#### Accepting New Project Applications

The Technical Advisory Committee will determine each year whether or not to accept new project applications.

#### Bicycle and Pedestrian Joint Subcommittee

<u>The Task Force requests consideration to re-activate</u> a Bicycle & Pedestrian Committee <u>in order to</u> <u>appropriately address the regions bicycle and pedestrian needs</u>. Membership of this subcommittee would jointly be from the Technical Advisory Committee, Community Advisory Committee, Transportation Systems Management and Operations Committee, and the Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board. This subcommittee could generate and explore topics for which the full advisory committees do not have adequate time. <u>Factors included in this request are</u> <u>as follows:</u>

- Dangerous by Design 2016 report ranks the Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford metro area #3 in the nation for risk to pedestrians
- A <u>BPJS can dedicate more time and resources associated with the regions bicycle and pedestrian requirements</u>
- A <u>BPJS</u> would be <u>comprise</u>d of <u>local government and citizen representatives with</u> diverse <u>backgrounds</u>, <u>skills</u>, and <u>resources</u>
- A BPJS would guide, educate and promote the development of bicycle and pedestrian friendly transportation systems while encouraging increased use of all forms of nonmotorized transportation

#### TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE BYLAWS

#### Section 1. Authority, Creation

In accordance with the 1962 Federal Aid Highway Act requiring that transportation planning be comprehensive, cooperative, and continuing in nature, a transportation technical committee known as the "MetroPlan Orlando Technical Advisory Committee" is hereby created.

#### Section 2. Definitions

For the purpose of these Bylaws, the term "Technical Committee" or use of the acronym "TAC" shall mean the MetroPlan Orlando Technical Advisory Committee.

#### Section 3. Purpose

The purpose shall be to develop, coordinate and/or review transportation studies, plans, and programs to provide a balanced, multimodal transportation system. The committee shall also provide comments and recommendations based on the technical sufficiency, accuracy, and completeness of said studies, plans, and programs. It shall be the function of the Technical Committee to:

- A. Be responsible for the development and review of all transportation studies, reports, plans and/or programs and recommending action pertinent to the subject documents to MetroPlan Orlando.
- B. Develop priority recommendations to the MetroPlan Orlando Board and/or other agencies responsible for plan and program implementation based upon the needs as determined by technical studies.
- C. Be responsible for assisting MetroPlan Orlando with coordinating public information concerning the studies.
- D. Serve as an advisory committee for the completion of all required transportation studies, plans development, and programming recommendations required under the public laws pertaining to all modes of transportation and transportation support facilities.
- E. Serve as an advisory committee to any and all duly constituted area-wide transportation authorities and/or boards, as well as area-wide planning boards or

councils for physical development, health, social or comprehensive planning upon direct request of such authorities, boards or councils.

- F. Annually review and revise the MetroPlan Orlando Prioritized Project List. This list will be the source of candidate highway and transit projects to be implemented for the region and each county; for projects meeting state and federal eligibility, and any new funds identified at the local, state or federal level.
- G. Assist in other functions as deemed desirable by the MetroPlan Orlando Board.

#### Section 4. Membership, Appointments, Term of Office, Vacancies, Removal from Office

#### A. Membership

Planning, engineering, and/or management specialists shall represent the various public governmental bodies, authorities, and agencies of Central Florida and shall be involved in the transportation planning process by the establishment of a technical advisory committee.

- 1. The intent of the membership composition of the Technical Committee is to represent planning and engineering expertise from federal, state, regional or local agencies. Municipalities within Orange, Seminole and Osceola Counties are eligible for representation. Voting representation for each jurisdiction will be determined by population, according to the latest census and/or the University of Florida population estimates. The MetroPlan Orlando Board may authorize additional voting representatives to the Technical Committee, upon written petition through the Technical Committee.
- 2. The allocation of voting representation of the Technical Committee shall be based on the following criteria:
  - (a) Local jurisdictions with a population of 100,000 or more shall be allocated three (3) votes each.
  - (b) Local jurisdictions with a population between 50,000 and 99,999 shall be allocated two (2) votes each.
  - (c) Local jurisdictions with a population between 5,000 and 49,999 shall be allocated one (1) vote each.
  - (d) Local jurisdictions with population less than 5,000 shall be allocated one (1) non-voting seat each.
  - (e) Local transportation agencies/authorities and school districts shall be allocated one (1) vote each.
- 3. The voting representation is three (3) voting representatives from each of the following:

- (a) Orange County
- (b) Osceola County
- (c) Seminole County
- (d) City of Orlando
- 4. The voting representation is two (2) voting representatives from each of the following:
  - (a) City of Kissimmee
  - (b) City of Sanford
- 5. The voting representation is one (1) voting representative from each of the following:
  - (a) City of Altamonte Springs
  - (b) City of Apopka
  - (c) City of Belle Isle
  - (d) City of Casselberry
  - (e) City of Lake Mary
  - (f) City of Longwood
  - (g) City of Maitland
  - (h) City of Ocoee
  - (i) City of Oviedo
  - (j) City of St. Cloud
  - (k) City of Winter Garden
  - (l) City of Winter Park
  - (m) City of Winter Springs
- 6. The non-voting representation is one (1) from each of the following:
  - (a) Town of Eatonville
  - (b) City of Edgewood
  - (c) Town of Oakland
  - (d) Town of Windermere
- 7. The voting representation is one (1) voting representative from each of the following transportation agencies/authorities and school districts:
  - (a) Central Florida Regional Transportation Authority/LYNX
  - (b) East Central Florida Regional Planning Council
  - (c) Greater Orlando Aviation Authority
  - (d) Kissimmee Gateway Airport
  - (e) Central Florida Expressway Authority
  - (f) Reedy Creek Improvement District
  - (g) Sanford Airport Authority
  - (h) Seminole County Public School District
  - (i) Orange County Public School District
  - (j) Osceola County Public School District

- (k) Osceola County Expressway Authority
- 8. Upon written petition to the Technical Advisory Committee, additional advisory, non-voting members may be appointed to the Technical Committee with the recommendation of the Technical Committee and the concurrence of the MetroPlan Orlando Board.
- 9. In addition, there shall be non-voting advisors from each of the following agencies: the Florida Department of Transportation District V and the Florida's Turnpike Enterprise.
- B. Appointments
  - 1. Each represented agency shall appoint one primary and one designated alternate voting member from each of the membership agencies listed in Section 4 A for which it is eligible. These appointments shall be made in writing by the County Commission Chair/Mayor, City Mayor, County Administrator, City Administrator, City Manager, School Superintendent and the Executive Director of other members' agencies. The failure of an agency to appoint a primary representative will result in that agency losing its voting authority on the Technical Committee.
  - 2. The appointed representatives, both primary and alternates, shall be selected from the agency membership listing under Section 4 A.
  - 3. In the absence of the primary member, the alternate member shall have the same privileges as the primary member and may serve on a subcommittee.
- C. Term of Office

The term of office for a Technical Committee member shall be for an indefinite period, or until reappointment, or until the appointment of a successor. Separation from employment of the jurisdiction or agency represented constitutes the end of an appointment.

D. Vacancies and Membership Revisions

Any vacancies in membership shall be filled in the same manner as the initial appointment. The Technical Committee membership may be revised if justified by the most recent University of Florida or U.S. Census population figures.

#### E. Removal from Office

Each representative is expected to demonstrate his or her interest in the Technical Committee's activities through attendance of the regularly scheduled meetings except for reasons of an unavoidable nature. In said case of unavoidable nature, each representative should ensure that his or her alternate attends. If a representative and/or designated alternate have three (3) consecutive absences from the meetings or have missed a majority of meetings during the year, the agency or government will be notified.

#### Section 5. Officers, Term of Office

- A. The November/December meeting shall be known as the Annual Meeting of the Technical Committee and shall be for the purpose of electing new officers and conducting such other business as may come before the members. The Technical Committee shall elect from its membership the following officers:
  - 1. Chairman
  - 2. Vice-Chairman
- B. Each officer shall be from a different jurisdiction/agency.
- C. Each elected officer shall serve for one (1) year or until that officer is re-elected or until that officer's successor is elected. The newly elected officers shall be declared installed following their election and shall assume the duties of office upon adjournment of the Annual Meeting.
- D. Neither the position of chairman or vice-chairman shall be given individual votes. In order for either the chairman or vice-chairman to cast a vote, they must do so as a representative of an agency listed in Section 4 A.
- E. In the absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman shall assume the duties and responsibilities of the Chairman. Should both Chairman and Vice-Chairman be absent, the Technical Committee shall elect a temporary chairman to chair the meeting.
- F. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall represent the TAC on the Regional Leadership Council (RLC).
- G. The Chairman shall represent the Technical Committee as a non-voting advisor on the MëtroPlan Orlando Board. In the absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman is the designated alternate.

#### Section 6. Rules of Procedure

- A. An annual meeting schedule will be adopted in November/December for the following year. The Chairman of the Committee may waive a monthly meeting, however two consecutive meetings may not be waived. Business to have been conducted at the waived meeting shall be considered at the next successive monthly meeting. When necessary, the Chairperson may call special meetings to deal with immediate issues.
- B. Technical Committee members or their designated alternates must be present to cast a vote. A quorum shall consist of the majority of those appointed members entitled to vote, and any business transacted by the Technical Committee must be approved by not less than a majority of the votes cast. Business shall be transacted only at regular or called meetings and shall be duly recorded in the minutes thereof.
- C. Minutes shall be kept of the Technical Committee's proceedings and official actions, which shall be of public record.
- D. Voting shall be by voice, but a member shall have his or her vote recorded in the minutes if he or she so desires. A roll call vote shall be held upon request. All other questions or procedures shall be guided by Robert's Rules of Order, Revised.
- E. Meeting agendas shall include two Public Comment periods, one at the beginning of the meeting for action items and again at the end of the meeting for general comments. Public requests for Technical Committee action or recommendation shall be placed on the agenda as a scheduled business item.

#### Section 7. General Policies

- A. MetroPlan Orlando consists of six (6) committees, including the Board;
  - 1. MetroPlan Orlando Board
  - 2. Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Committee
  - 3. Citizens' Advisory Committee
  - 4. Municipal Advisory Committee
  - 5. Technical Advisory Committee
  - 6. Transportation Systems Management & Operations Committee

B. All Committees and studies shall follow the intent and further the Mission Statement adopted by the MetroPlan Orlando Board, which is as follows:

To provide leadership in transportation planning by engaging the public and fostering effective partnerships.

- C. All Committees shall maintain a broad perspective covering the range of all modes of transportation and associated facilities (including, but not limited to, roadways, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, safety, and transit) in all recommended planning work programs so that proper study and evaluation of transportation needs shall result in a multi-modal transportation system plan, balanced with respect to areawide needs and properly related to areawide comprehensive plans, goals and objectives.
- D. Reports, studies, plans, programs and databases shall be approved or endorsed by the MetroPlan Orlando Board after review and recommendation by the Technical Committee and such other committees as may be interested or affected. A recommendation may be noted as officially adopted by the Technical Committee and placed into effect upon signature by the Technical Committee Chairman without waiting for the minutes of the previous meeting to be officially approved at the next Technical Committee meeting.
- E. Reports, studies, plans, programs or databases that have been approved or endorsed by the MPO are, by definition, public records and shall be available to the public for inspection and copying upon request. This may be limited however by the custodian of the records, to that time necessary to review the records and excise the information which is deemed to be exempt from the Public Records Act, as stipulated by Florida Law. A reasonable fee may be charged for copying costs.
- F. Reports, studies, plans, programs or databases that are working papers or draft documents and have therefore not been approved by the MetroPlan Orlando Board shall also be releasable upon request as public records. The receiver of the information however shall be cautioned that it has not been formally approved and is therefore subject to change and may only be used at their own risk.
- G. The release of databases shall be reported to the Technical Committee at their next scheduled meeting.
- H. Databases, computer software or other information that has been access-limited through contractual agreement shall be protected from disclosure, as authorized by Florida Statutes.

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#### Section 8. Procedures for Amending Adopted Studies, Plans, or Programs

- A. The procedures for amending the Orlando Urban Area Long Range Transportation Plan, the Transportation Improvement Program, and the Urban Boundary are established in the MetroPlan Orlando Board Rule 35I-1.009 which is incorporated by reference herein.
- B. The Technical Committee shall review the proposed change based on a technical evaluation of its merit and shall recommend approval or disapproval to the MetroPlan Orlando Board.
- C. The MetroPlan Orlando Board shall have final approval or disapproval disposition action of the requested change or changes.

#### Section 9. Ad hoc Subcommittees or Task Force

- A. Ad hoc subcommittees or task forces may be appointed by the Chairman to address specific issues or investigate and report on specific subject areas of interest to the Technical Committee.
- B. Designation of representatives to each of the subcommittees shall be made by Technical Committee members representing that jurisdiction or agency. In the case of multiple Technical Committee members, the designation of subcommittee representatives shall be made by caucus of the members. To be a designated subcommittee representative, it is not necessary to be a Technical Committee member.
- C. Each ad hoc subcommittee may appoint a chairman who will report the subcommittee's findings to the Technical Committee. In the absence of a chairman, a temporary chairman shall be appointed by the subcommittee in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.
- D. Subcommittees or Task Forces may include, but not be limited to:
  - 1. Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Subcommittee
  - 2. Project Prioritization Subcommittee
  - 3. Nominating and Bylaws Review Subcommittee
  - 4. Air Quality
  - 5. Freight and Goods Movement
- E. Each meeting shall be recorded and if requested, minutes of a meeting shall be provided.

#### Section 10. Bylaws Review and Amendment

- A. A bylaws review subcommittee shall review these bylaws at least every other year on odd numbered years or as may be deemed necessary. These bylaws can be amended at any regular meeting of the Technical Committee by voting members or appointed alternates (provided there is a quorum) if the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to the Technical Committee members with the proper notification of the meeting.
- B. These Bylaws may be altered, amended, or added to by vote of the Technical Committee provided that:
  - 1. Notice of the proposed changes shall normally contain a full statement of the proposed amendments.
  - 2. The proposed amendment(s) is/are placed on the agenda for the next scheduled meeting following such presentation.
  - 3. The proposed written changes shall be forwarded to all Technical Committee members at least five (5) business days prior to the meeting at which a vote will be held.
  - 4. Technical Committee members may propose relevant changes from the floor to any proposed amendment under consideration on the agenda.
  - 5. The Technical Committee adopts the proposed amendment(s) by a majority vote of the members present at the Technical Committee meeting.

This letter is to provide MetroPlan Orlando with a variance report that compares the July 1, 2016 adopted work program with changes made to the adopted work program in the <u>second quarter</u> of Fiscal Year 2016/17. This listing includes projects with cost increases that are equal to or greater than the minimum parameters set by MetroPlan Orlando.

#### **ORANGE COUNTY**

1) Project: FM# 430225-6 – Shingle Creek Trail, Destination Parkway to Sand Lake Road. Bike Path/Trail Project.

<u>7/1/16 Adopted Phase Cost</u>: Construction Phase = \$1,000,000 (FY 2016/17) <u>Revised Phase Cost</u>: Construction Phase = \$1,575,000 (FY 2016/17) <u>Phase Cost Increase</u>: Construction Phase = (57.5%)

Reason for Cost Increase

The increase is due to material unit prices going up and also to add the Construction Engineering Inspection Phase that was not originally programmed.

Impact of phase cost increase

## 2017 Legislative Priorities and Positions

#### Top priorities:

- Increased funding to improve bicycle and pedestrian safety awareness programs and bicycle and pedestrian facility improvements.
- Funding for implementation of quiet zones along the SunRail corridor.
- Funding for SunRail Phase II North to DeLand and Phase III to the Orlando International Airport.
- Funding for expansion of wrong-way driving detection equipment on limited access facilities that are currently not monitored.

#### We support legislation that:

- Preserves the State Transportation Trust Fund and funding for paratransit (ACCESS LYNX) service.
- Authorizes a local option rental car surcharge (up to \$3.00; implemented through a public referendum) with proceeds committed to regional transportation projects.
- Increases funding for the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) in order to promote regional planning and project development.
- Strengthens legislation to make distracted driving a primary offense.

#### Monitor legislation that:

- Involves moving Florida towards a Mileage Based User Fee in lieu of the traditional fuel tax.
- Moves to rescind the legislation that authorized the use red light cameras.
- Impacts funding for regional Shared Use Non-motorized (SUN) Trail projects.
- Revises language in statutes in order to better define crosswalks and addresses pedestrian safety.
- Authorizes an exception to F.S. 934.50 to allow for the use of Drone technology for traffic incident management and/or emergency response.
- Expands the Charter County and Regional Transportation System Surtax to allow municipalities over 150,000 in population (or the largest municipality in a county) and all counties located in MPO areas to enact up to a one-cent local option surtax by referendum.
