Medicaid Transportation Changes





TD Coordinated System

Through ACCESS LYNX, the Central FL transportation disadvantaged transportation system operated on a "one call" system:



Under AHCA's new Managed Medical Assistance Program (MMA), Medicaid users will receive medical transportation service through their new MMA plan providers.

MMA Overview

 The FL Medicaid program is implementing a new medical care system

 Most Medicaid clients must enroll in the Managed Medical Assistance (MMA) program

MMA begins on August 1st, 2014 for Orange,
 Osceola, and Seminole counties

Which Medicaid groups are EXCLUDED

- Individuals eligible for emergency services only due to immigration status;
- Women eligible for family planning waivers;
- Women eligible due to having breast or cervical cancer; and
- Children receiving services in a prescribed pediatric extended care facility (PPEC)

MMA Overview

- Medicaid clients in our area can select from <u>six</u> MMA standard plans and <u>seven</u> specialty plans
- All plans have a transportation component.
 Your new MMA plan will provide transportation to the your medically covered services
- ACCESS LYNX will still provide transportation for individuals who qualify under ADA and transportation disadvantage funds

How will this transportation change impact you?



- MMA recipients will no longer be part of the coordinated transportation system
- MMA recipients will have to call one number for their Medicaid transportation services and another for their personal transportation services

TD User
Calls ACCESS LYNX to
schedule a trip



LYNX

Finds identifies kind of trip the user is requesting and bills the appropriate funding partner



LYNX

Provides transportation services to the user

AFTER:

Is service medical covered

Call their chosen MMA provider to schedule transportation

MMA provider schedules the trip through their broker

Medicaid Users

Decide what kind of trip they wish to take

Is service **nonmedical covered**

Call ACCESS LYNX

ACCESS LYNX provides transportation

Process for enrolling in MMA

 Recipients must enroll in a plan by July 17, or a plan will be selected for them by ACHA

AHCA is strongly encouraging recipients to talk with a Choice Counselor before selecting a plan

- Recipients have 90 days after enrollment to change plans
 - To change plans contact AHCA at (877) 254-1055
- After 90 days, enrollees must stay in their plan for the remainder of the 12 month period before changing plans
- Enrollees can change providers within their plan any time
